A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick ...

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (John 1:29-34) "Recognizing the Lord in our Midst"

As we enter a New Year together and a new Ordinary Time, John the Baptist draws our attention once again, as he did during this past Advent, directly to Jesus! Right from the beginning of his public ministry, he invites people to recognize the Lord among us as he did...to recognize His saving love behind the sacrifices He will make. He quickly identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God who will save us from our sins and bring us the fullness of salvation, life everlasting!

St. John the Baptist reminds the world at this time in all of Israel how Jesus will be the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings! He is making known to all of Israel that Jesus is our hope and eternal joy. He wants to reassure us again, as he did back in Israel, that Jesus is one with God...God made flesh. Even though John the Baptist did not fully know Jesus, he knew enough to awaken the hearts of many. He knew his sole purpose and mission was to introduce Jesus to the world so that the world may know Him and come to recognize that He is God and Redeemer of the World. John knew enough that He was the Lord of Israel and the Lord of all ages. He wanted everyone to know that someone mightier than he was coming to save us and restore us to new life.

What a wonderful opportunity for all of us during this New Year to draw our attention back to Jesus! It is a wonderful time after a busy Christmas season to settle down a bit before a new Lent arrives. It is a wonderful time for us to grow in our awareness and appreciation of who Jesus is and to recognize His presence among us. This New Year invites us to turn our lives around and to journey with the Lord again. We are invited to behold the One who brings us true freedom and peace. This is a perfect opportunity to renew our personal relationship with the Lord and to encounter Him more regularly in our daily lives. We are reminded of how important it is to grow in God's grace as we begin this New Year together and to rely more on the goodness of the Lord who is truly among us.

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist gives us the blueprint we need to live our lives centered around the Lord. All he wants to do is to make Jesus known to all of Israel. He just wants to be faithful to God's calling and help others to do the same. His hope is that we might recognize the saving power and divine presence of the Lord in our lives as he did during his own life. He wants us to be aware that God is real and alive in Jesus.

With so much going on in our daily lives, it is not easy for us to stay focused on the Lord as John did. There is so much distracting us from staying close and connected to the Lord. There are so many expectations and demands placed upon us. But in the end, what matters is closer to Jesus and living

in a full relationship with Him. Freedom lies in knowing that He alone refreshes our souls and renews us in His Spirit. What matters in the end is recognizing His Lordship overall. And the more we live simplified lives fully dedicated to God, as John the Baptist did, the more we will see and experience the Lord in our lives. The more we seek the Lord with open hearts, the more we will experience the peace and the joy that comes from Him! For Christians, this is what makes our faith complete — encountering the Lord more fully in our lives and growing in our relationship with Him. To say we know the Lord alone is not enough. It is not enough just to say our prayers and fulfill our religious obligations, as important as these are. One must also encounter the glory and the wonder of the Lord in order to fully experience God's grace and life within us.

Next weekend at the 10 AM Mass, we will kick off another Catholic Schools Week with the families and faculty who attend our Regional School, Our Lady Queen of Apostles. We are so blessed to have a Catholic school on our parish campus. In the 3 1/2 years I have served here as pastor, I find it a joy working closely with our principal, Mrs. Dawn Waller, along with her staff and faculty. The children and their families help make OLQA a faith-filled experience.

The children have an opportunity to learn their academics in a safe faith-filled environment. It is a very welcoming environment where the children learn a lot about their faith while tending to their schoolwork and assignments. 



On **the weekend of January 24 & 25**, once again St. John the Evangelist Parish will be hosting a **Baby Bottle Fundraiser** to benefit the **Life Center of Long Island**. Last year, our parish raised almost \$13,000 for The Life Center.

The Life Center is a pregnancy care center that consults with women and men who are experiencing an unplanned pregnancy. Do you know that they provide:

- ⇒ Free pregnancy test kits
- ⇒ Free Sonogram
- ⇒ Maternity housing with eligibility requirements referrals
- ⇒ Medical care referrals
- ⇒ Male advocates available to speak with fathers
- ⇒ Material aid including car seats, cribs, clothing, diapers, and many other baby needs

We are asking that you pick up a baby bottle next week, fill it with your donations, and **return it the weekend of February 7 & 8**. Please make checks payable to the **Life Center of Long Island**.

More importantly, we are asking you to recite the prayer attached to the baby bottle. Prayer brings about something very powerful at the Life Center... a change of a mother's heart! We believe these prayers lead abortion-minded women to reach out to the Life Center in the beginning of their pregnancy.

Prayers also spiritually equip the consultants at the Life Center to say the right words a mother or a father may need to hear with hope of choosing the gift of life for their baby.

A Message from Monsignor Walden...

Now that Advent and Christmas are over, we Liturgically enter into what we left when we began to prepare for Christmas with the four Sundays of Advent - Ordinary Time. Once Christmas came, we focused on the birth of Jesus, the Motherhood of Mary, the Virgin mother of God, the Visit of the Magi, and concluded with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. All of these are very important events for all people. But just because we call this current time until Lent Ordinary Time, it is really far from ordinary. We have key moments in our lives to celebrate milestones such as birthdays, anniversaries, and graduations. But what Ordinary Time is meant to do for us is to recognize that the things we do as men, women, husbands, wives, fathers, mothers, friends, employees, and citizens of our nation are gifts we have to enrich, inspire, nourish, and rejoice in the gift we are to one another. Our homes are places of security, joy, and love as we feed and nourish one another by just being the good, loving person we are. There are days that are delightful, days that are challenging, and days where we are disappointed. But in reality everyday is an extraordinary gift.

In Jesus, God humbly came to give us Himself and to enrich us with His loving presence. Would that we are as consciously present to Jesus as we seek to be consciously present to one another. Distractions abound at times. One of the biggest devices we have become focused on and attentive to is our cell phones. What happens when we miss a phone call or message? The key of course is to respond appropriately and sincerely. Now take that a step further and apply it to how we pray, when we pray, and how focused and sincere we are. It is all too easy at times to be distracted when we pray or at Mass. But the question is not to ponder what happens if I get distracted when I pray or when I am at Mass. The question to ponder is what happens

when I do focus on praying and participating at Mass. We are truly enriched by those we love and who love us when we give each other our time and undivided attention. As much as prayer and Mass are rituals, even more they are opportunities to be in God's presence and to be enriched just by that very thought. When we make Mass a priority and look forward to it, when we make prayer time a priority and look forward to it we are uplifted, inspired, enriched, joyful, and grateful. All of those wonderful realities then overflow into our thoughts, words, and actions with one another. Ordinary time is not a let down, but from a faith-filled life an opportunity to be fully alive and enriched by our faith and, in that process, to enrich and enliven one another.

I conclude with the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:13-12):

*"Blessed are the poor in spirit,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.*

*Blessed are they who mourn,
for they will be comforted.*

*Blessed are the meek,
for they will inherit the land.*

*Blessed are they who hunger and
thirst for righteousness,
for they will be satisfied.*

*Blessed are the merciful,
for they will be shown mercy.*

*Blessed are the clean of heart,
for they will see God.*

*Blessed are the peacemakers,
for they will be called children of God.*

*Blessed are they who are persecuted for
the sake of righteousness,*

for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

*Blessed are you when they insult you and
persecute you and utter every kind of evil
against you [falsely] because of me.*

*Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will
be great in heaven. Thus they persecuted
the prophets who were before you.*
