# A Message from Grand Knight James O'Connor...



The first line of today's Gospel is intriguing, "There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited." St. John the Evangelist, differentiating Mary's invite from that of Jesus infers that Mary was invited on her own accord and not merely her son's 'plus one'. Perhaps it is to suggest Mary maintained a close relationship

with the betrothed. Mary was important to the couple yet they interestingly remain nameless. Could this couple represent us? Mary is so mindful to those she loves that she notices the wedding banquet is nearly out of wine, a major problem for the new couple, especially the bridegroom, whose responsibility it was to ensure the banquet was adequately stocked. This mistake, once revealed would bring shame to the family of the bridegroom and a rocky start this marriage. Mary's compassion and love for those who are close to her compel her to turn to Jesus. Is it a stretch to believe Mary will do this for whoever invites her into their lives.

"They are out of wine." Mary knew what her friends needed. Mary also knows what we need, we can easily rewrite the statement speak for many of us:

"They are out of hope", "They are out of faith", "They are in need of Grace".

**Mother Mary,** when we invite her, becomes acutely aware of our specific needs and will readily intercede on our behalf.

This gospel passage is known as the "first sign" or public miracle of Jesus, it is also the first public intercession of Mary. John shows us that when we invite the Blessed Mother into our lives and develop a familial relationship with her, she will turn to Jesus, who by his love and commitment to her, will act without hesitation for us. We (the body of the Church) also represent the servants who must trust in Jesus and hear Mary instruct us to "Do whatever he

tells you". The important caveat is we have to do something. In today's

gospel, the servants fetch water and fill the jugs. In the feeding of the five thousand, five loaves and two fish are collected by the disciples. Jesus doesn't snap his fingers and miraculously provide. He starts with our offering and greatly enhances, improves and multiplies it. When we offer ourselves, our time, our love, our commitment to God, the bounty that our Lord ultimately provides for us is always of superb quality and always more than we need. "Do whatever he tells you." It sounds so simple. Mary showed us her unfaltering faith by saying yes to God. When visited by the angel Gabriel at the Annunciation Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid (servant) of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." (Lk 1:38) So when Mary says to us, "Do whatever he tells you". She speaks from experience having seen the Glory of God in her son. Mary's example of unfailing obedience to God's will is her way of inviting us to experience his glory as well by "Doing whatever he tells you."

The Center Moriches Knights of Columbus is known as the Queen of All Hearts Council. We are named after the Blessed Mother and pray for her intercession often. We have hosted many rosaries at the Parish, recently the monthly Patriotic Rosary held in Seton Chapel leading up to the 2024 election. Many Knights plan on attending this Monday nights Patriotic rosary (1/20) at 7pm and although we are not hosting, we will be praying fervently. The Knights will be hosting the Silver Rose, a Rosary and prayer service dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe on Saturday February 1st at 4pm in the church. We would love to pray and celebrate Our Lady with you at these events.

The Queen of All Hearts Council works to inspire Catholic gentlemen of the Parish to join our mission of Charity, Unity and Fraternity. 

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"Do whatever he tells you!" Whose words do we really take to heart and why? That statement is in today's Gospel ((John 2:1-11) where, after listening to His mother Mary asking for help for the couple at the Wedding in Cana with the shortage of wine, He performed the first miracle recounted in the Gospel of St. John. As children we quickly learn to do whatever our parents tell us because in our youthful years, we innately trust them because of their love for us. As we mature we get to the point beyond blind trust to deep gratitude for all their sacrifices and ever growing, unwavering love and concern for us.

How do we respond to these five simple words of the Blessed Virgin Mary ("Do whatever he tells you!") about how are to trust her Son who is our Brother, Savior, and God? If our relationship with him is to give us hope, life, and joy, we must open our minds and hearts to Him. That means taking the time everyday of speak to Him in prayer and to cherish the insights and thoughts that are life giving from that experience. Prayer is far more than speaking with God, it is sincerely opening our minds and hearts to Him. As much as prayer is seeking God's help and guidance, it is also thanking Him for the blessings we have and becoming a blessing to Him and one another. All the hopes and blessings we receive from our prayer time open us to grow in love for God and one another. "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." That statement is from reading two at Mass today (1 Corinthians 12:4-11). As much as we focus on God in prayer, in the end it leads us out of ourselves and affects the way we see, speak, and listen to one another.

The first reading at Mass today (Isaiah 6:1-5) ends with this exclamation of joy: "So shall your God rejoice in you." Why would God rejoice in me? Because I say good things and am generous with my time, talent, and resources? It is much more simple and easy to grasp when we slow down and see it clearly: because I am His son or daughter. No matter how old we are, or

how much we have "accomplished" or "not accomplished", He loves us. Why would we not want to spend time in



prayer everyday to be uplifted, encouraged, inspired, and grateful? The same is true of Sunday Mass. Mass is far more than following the third commandment to keep holy the Sabbath. It is giving our presence, time and attention to the source of all that is purely good and loving. There was an article in the paper the other day about "gym rats" bemoaning all the new year's resolution people who want to get back in shape but will go back to old habits soon enough. Would that we would know how grateful God is and everyone else would be if we would all be faithful to Sunday Mass and daily prayer with open minds, hearts, and gratitude.

I offer this quote from "Benedictus, Day by Day Prayer with Pope Benedict XVI" for January 12:

"Belief is never simply there, in a way that would enable me to say at a certain point in time: I have it, and others do not have it. It is something living, which is inclusive of the whole person in all his or her dimensions - understanding, will, and feelings. It can then fasten its roots ever deeper into my life, so that my life becomes more and more nearly identical with my faith; but for all that it is never just a possession. A person can always still give way to this other tendency within himself or herself and thus fall away. Faith is always a path. As long as we live we are on the way, and on that account faith is always under pressure and under threat. And it is healthy that it can never turn into a convenient ideology. That it does not make me hardened and unable to follow the thoughts of my doubting brother or sister and to sympathize with him or her. Faith can only mature by suffering anew, at every stage in life, the oppression and the power of unbelief, by admitting its reality and then finally going right through it, so that it again finds the path opening ahead for a while."






