A Message from Msgr. Walden...

What brightens our days and outlook on life is the joy, peace, hope, and love, and new experiences we are nourished by everyday from the people who are part of us and from God Himself. In the Gospel for today's Mass (Mark 1:14-20), we have these powerful words: "After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in



the gospel." What is being fulfilled? God's promise to open our minds and hearts to His very presence among us. That, of course, is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. He is available and open to us any time we turn to Him in prayer, think about Him, and receive Him in the Sacraments. How good it is to say, "Amen", and then take the Body of Christ in the consecrated host into our very bodies! How healing and comforting it is to hear the words of absolution in Confession: "I absolve you from your sins."

The kingdom of God is at hand! What a wonderful thought! But where exactly is it. The kingdom of God is not a particular place, but an awareness and embrace of God's Way, Truth, and Life in Jesus Christ in our minds and hearts. Those we joyfully embrace and commit to love are an intimate part of what we say, do, think, and pray about everyday. It is not always easy to be so uplifted and hopeful. Jesus is very aware of that, as we see in the above proclamation as He continues saying, "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Yes, we repent for our sins and do that not only by going to Confession and saying an act of Contrition, but also by wholeheartedly living our lives everyday with the conviction that Jesus is with us. This point came to me clearly in this thought from Brennan Manning in his book "The Rabbi's Heartbeat": How I treat my brother and sisters from day to day, whether they be Caucasian, African, Asian, or Hispanic; how I react to the sin-scarred wino on the street; how I respond to interruptions from people I dislike; how I deal with ordinary people in their ordinary unbelief on an ordinary day will speak the truth of who I am more poignantly than the pro-life bumper sticker on my car." In other words, in the midst of all we say and do, the hope for ourselves, those we love, and the world we live in is seen in our thoughts, words, and actions.

The Gospel we are invited to embrace and be guided by is the True and Ultimate Good News seen in the Way Jesus lived His life everyday as He walked the face of the earth. As we know, that was not a cakewalk! He faced rejection, opposition, and disbelief but continued to be the Good News we all need to hear, see, and live to find who we truly are, what goodness we are capable of everyday, and how we are ever firmly embedded in His heart.

There are so many things that occupy our minds and hearts everyday. We are bombarded with news that is heartbreaking and very challenging at times. Jesus lived in turbulent times as we do. Heartfelt commitment to Him in prayer and the Sacraments opens our minds and hearts to the good we are, the good that our world so sorely needs, and the joy our faith brings us. I close with these challenging words from Pope St. Paul VI that I frequently read in my prayer time, not to condemn or be depressed, but to see the gift our faith is and what hope it brings to us and to the world we live in:

"The Church itself is being engulfed and shaken by the tidal wave of change, for however much men and women may be committed to the Church, they are deeply affected by the climate of the world. They run the risk of becoming confused, bewildered, and charmed, and this is a state of affairs that strikes at the very roots of the Church. It drives many people to adopt the most outlandish views. They imagine that the Church should abdicate its proper role and adopt an entirely new and unprecedented mode of existence."

In a world that has much darkness how blessed we are to live in the light of faith, hope, and love in Jesus Christ in the Catholic Church. It is not what we cannot or should not do but who we truly are and all we are destined to be as we are created in the very image and likeness of God. (Genesis 1:27)






Who is Fr. Michael McGivney?

Michael Joseph McGivney (August 12, 1852 – August 14, 1890) was an Irish-American Catholic priest based in New Haven, Connecticut. He founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882 at a local parish to serve as a mutual aid and insurance organization, particularly for immigrants and their families. It developed throughout the 20th century into the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization. The cause for his canonization started in the Archdiocese of Hartford in 1996. In March 2008, Pope Benedict



XVI declared McGivney "Venerable" in recognition of his "heroic virtue." On May 27, 2020, Pope Francis announced that McGivney had been approved for beatification, which officially occurred on October 31, 2020.



Throughout 2024, our local Knights of Columbus Council #4126 Queen of All Hearts will be sponsoring one Sunday Mass a month with the intention of the canonization of Fr. Michael McGivney.

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jon 3:1-5, 10 | 1 Cor 7:29-31 | Mk 1:14-20



Sometimes I feel like I need a Jonah in my life: someone who will come along and shake things up; someone who will nudge me and say, hey, you're doing it wrong! No one wants to be criticized, but I know I need loving guidance to help me when I am not at my best. It's easy to get caught up in the swirl of life and neglect (even if unintentionally) what's important. Jonah was given the unpleasant task of pointing out to the people of Nineveh their failings. Unlike many communities who resisted God's words, by the end of the first day of Jonah's anticipated three-day trek across the city, "the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth." For all the evil they had done, and the rebellion they had demonstrated, the people there weren't irredeemable. They simply needed Jonah to point out how they had gone astray, and the grace of open ears and hearts to receive the message. Who has the Lord placed in our lives in the role of Jonah? How has he blessed us with the ability to receive, and repent where necessary?

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We don't seem to have obvious prophets like Jonah nowadays, but that doesn't mean God has left us without guides. We have the Church, Christ's body on earth, and the ever-present help of the Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel, we hear how Jesus selected his first followers: men who would become the Twelve Apostles, anointed to spread his word and speak in his stead even after Jesus left the earth. We know that there were other followers: men, women and children who became his disciples; Jews and Gentiles who were baptized. We are part of that apostolic tradition, each one of us baptized into the common priesthood "exercised by the unfolding of baptismal grace - a life of faith, hope, and charity, a life according to the Spirit." (CCC 1547) The call to holiness can be hard to hear in the din of today's busy and secular world, but it is not impossible. We can pray for the grace to hear how God is asking each of us to live out his commands and proclaim the Good News to the world.

PRAY Today's psalm (Ps 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9) is a wonderful way to ask God for this favor. Make it part of your morning or evening prayer for the next week. "Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me your paths."



Women's Group...

Fr. Timothy Gallagher's book on The Discernment of Spirits, lists St. Ignatius' 14 rules for discernment, then goes through each rule a chapter at a time, describing how to apply it in our lives. In the ups & downs, consolations and desolations of our spiritual life, we go through



times of pure joy to "Where are You Jesus?"

St. Ignatius (1491-1556), recuperating from war wounds was given reading material on the life of Christ & the saints. As he thought about what he read, he became aware of his thought patterns, how the thoughts affected his feelings, and how the good feelings remained with him. When he had worldly thoughts, although he felt good while thinking them, he noticed that afterward the feelings left him empty. He continued reading spiritual books, growing in wisdom. God was leading him, fulfilling His Plan for him to be a great saint & to teach us. God's plan for us is the same, the process is slow.






