LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

• MASKS ARE NOW REQUIRED IN ALL BUILDINGS, INCLUDING THE

<u>CHURCH.</u> I have requested this over the past few weeks and it now mandatory. This week, we were advised by the Diocese of Rockville Centre that as we do not check for vaccination status, all who enter the church building and other buildings must wear a mask.

As I wrote last week, I respect and honor that there are many opinions about this. I do not wish to get into any debates or stoke anyone's ire. For me, particularly, I hear more of our parishioners becoming more anxious about the risk of sickness to themselves and others, I believe it offers another layer of protection and another layer of care and concern for the other. If it is going to even offer the tiniest amount of protection or comfort for another, is there a reason I would not do it? (I do understand there are medical reasons that some cannot wear a mask. If this is the case, please do your best to keep a safe social distance from others.)

Thank you for wearing a mask at Sunday Mass and at other parish liturgies and events.

• <u>Not feeling great, STAY HOME!</u> Please do not take any chances for your sake or anyone else's! Join us via social media or watch Mass on the Catholic Faith Network. The risks are too great for you and for others in these days. There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are not well; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.)

- <u>Entering the Church:</u> You must enter through the main fellowship doors with your mask on. Please sanitize your hands, take a worship aid and enter the church. Remember, you may leave your gifts for the offertory as you enter and as you leave.
- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins and immediately before distribution of Holy Communion. When Extraordinary Ministers go to their station, they place the vessel on the small table near that station and sanitize their hands before distributing Holy Communion.
- <u>Communion from the Chalice</u>: The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.
- <u>Greeting of Peace</u>: The greeting of peace has been reinstituted. You do NOT need to shake hands to exchange the sign of peace if you are not comfortable.





The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord — Wednesday, February 2

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." - Luke 2:29-32

The Presentation of the Lord pulls many favorite mementos from the Catholic cupboard: candles, blessings, Christmas, and church. The Mass of February 2 begins with a blessing of lighted candles held by the faithful, who glow with the memory of the birth of Jesus. The origins of the feast lie in ancient Jewish custom. On the 40th day after childbirth, parents brought the infant to the Temple to present it to the Lord and to purify the mother. St. Luke tells us that Joseph and Mary sacrificed two birds for the occasion after the birth of Jesus. Count up 40 days after Christmas and you'll come to February 2.

Until the 1960s, we used to call this day "The Purification of Mary." The title changed for several reasons. We no longer believe that women who give birth need purification, and the true significance of the feast concerns Jesus coming to the Temple. He is the Promised One, whose light will shine, beaming rays of hope to all the world. Also on the old calendar, this feast closed the Christmas season. Now we end the Christmas season with the Baptism of the Lord. So, even though the date for the Presentation still depends on Christmas, it has become a feast of Ordinary Time. Since it is a feast of the Lord, it takes precedence even when it falls on Sunday. © 1997, Resource Publications, Inc.

The candles remind us of the words that the prophet Simeon used when he said that Jesus was a light for the nations. You may bring candles from your home. We invite you to take a set of Candlemas candles home and use them for special occasions. They will be available after all the Masses and after that in the rectory. We ask for a \$5 offering to cover the cost of the candles.

NEXT WEEK'S READINGS – Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19

1. Obstinate people present themselves to Jeremiah and Jesus this Sunday. Why do people resist a prophet's profound call to peace and justice? Do you always accept "radical messages" right away? Prophets incite people to action. Is there some injustice about which you can no longer remain silent? What would you like to rouse people to do?

2. "For it is I this day who have made you a fortified city, ... against Judah's kings and princes, against its priests and people." Do disagreements within your Church or within your parish sometimes take place? Is this a bad thing? Discuss the idea that growth involves some tension.

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 12:31-13:13 or 13:4-13

1. "Love ... hopes all things." Faced with the evils of climate change and racism, what does Pope Francis say will keep us hopeful and creative about finding new ways to solve problems and change things for the better?

Love is our strength, the source of strength for those of our brothers and sisters who here too have suffered prejudice and indignities, mistreatment and persecutions for the name of Jesus. Yet while the power, the glory and the vanity of the world pass away, love remains. As the Apostle Paul told us:"Love never fails." (<u>1 Cor 13:8</u>). ...

Luke 4:21-30

1. Both Jeremiah and Jesus provoked people in God's name. Who are some of the prophets in your lifetime? Did they accomplish their missions? Can you be a "lesser prophet" and get small things changed in your world (e.g. start a recycling program, address discrimination in your city, suggest a plan to help the homeless, etc.)?
