

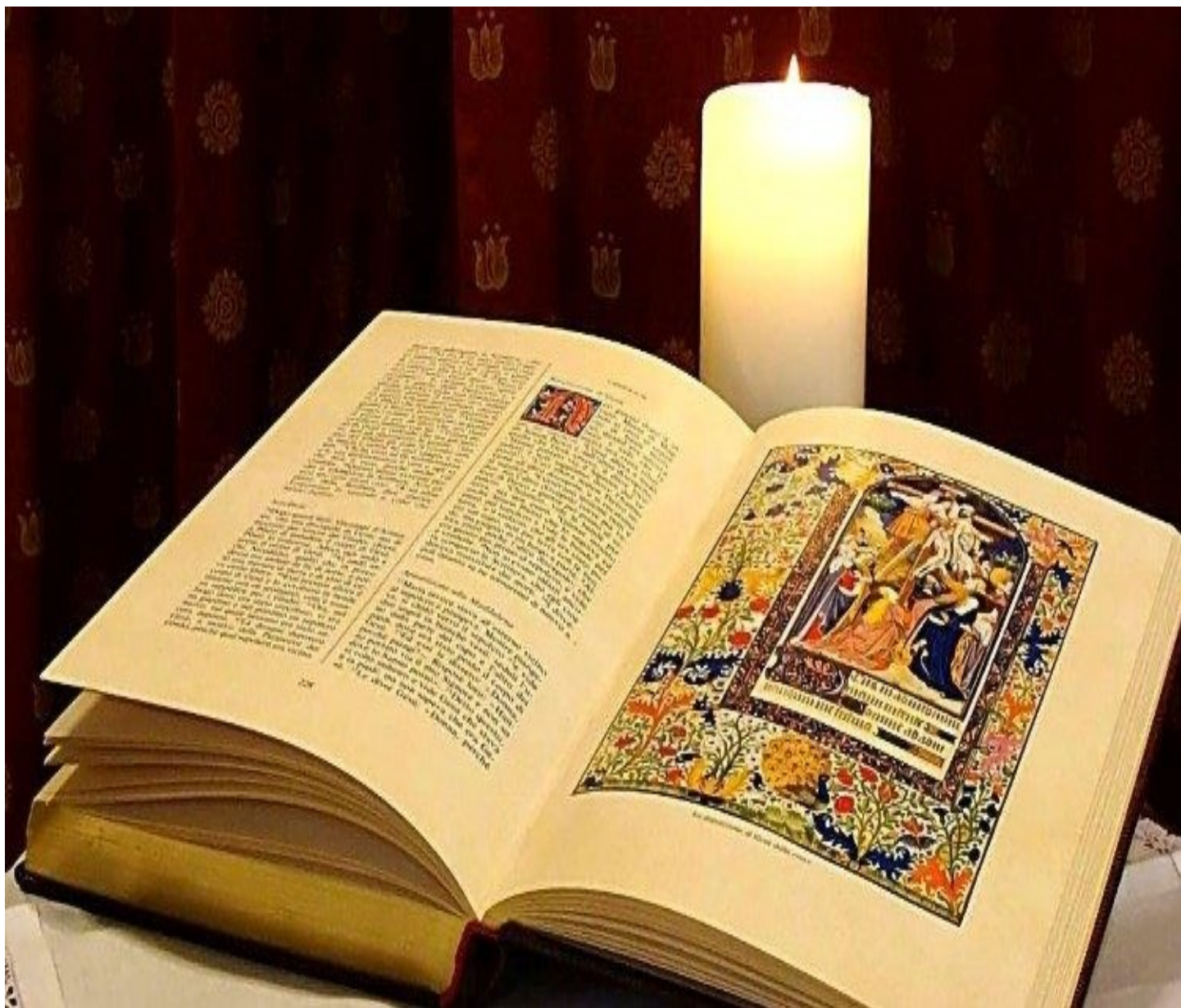

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Get set to listen and then go!

ON YOUR MARK

Dear Parish Family:

On this Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, we celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God—it's a call for each of us to break out our Bibles and use this time to come to know God's love through the Scriptures. Yes, God speaks!

Recently, Fr. Bill Barry, SJ, a spiritual writer and director, passed away. Fr. Barry's books have certainly helped me in my own spiritual life – in both good times and bad. In one of his last books, Fr. Barry writes (90), "Sometimes on retreats, I suggest to people who want to know Jesus more intimately that they spend between forty-five minutes and an hour on the first ten chapters of Mark's Gospel. These ten chapters cover the public life of Jesus up to the last week of his life. The ten chapters can be read without interruption in less than an hour. If you've never done such a thing, you might try it."

Can I gently suggest that we might try it too?

You see many people have told me that I should preach more about the political issues in the country. Others have told me I am too political. Some have told me I should be careful about our pandemic precautions. Others of you have told me you feel SJE is too strict and should look the other way some more. Some of you have shared your concerns about our need to address racism while others have told me how offended they were when I have written or preached about it. Who knows? Maybe all of these things are right. Lord knows I have a lot to learn and a lot to grow in. If that's what you're thinking, you're right about that.

I have found myself praying—and even preaching—and praying (yes, I wrote that word twice) less about certain issues or items or ideas or even hopes and dreams. I find myself meditating and contemplating more on the writings of the saints and yes, the Scriptures. Let me be up front. It is still not enough time or prayer. I am finding it to be challenging. Working to be even more silent and less distracted, deeper parts of me are revealed. Most of those revelations are in need of so much work and healing. I need to let Jesus touch those areas with his love and mercy. Then, and only then, I am in any remote position of looking outside of me.

This "invitation to love" is one that is made by the Scriptures, particularly by the Gospels. Here we see this incredible compassion, mercy, passion, pain, empathy, justice, and healing of Jesus. This is what his love offers us. I am not creating enough space for this to happen. Maybe something for you to consider too?

This Third Sunday in Ordinary Time—the Sunday of the Word of God—might be a good time for you and me to come and to know this Jesus. The weeks of Ordinary Time might give you and me some time to come to know Him a lot better. We are in Cycle B of the liturgical cycle of readings where we focus on the Gospel of Mark. Why not use this book which we are using at Daily Mass and in the next few Sundays to receive more deeply this invitation to love from God? It's only ten chapters; only 12 pages in my bible.

I think we make better use of our time getting off the phones, the so called news channels, the social media sites, the Catholic websites and the non-Catholic ones and so on. Some of us feel the need to share many things and even to post and comment and shame and judge.

As Christians, wouldn't we be better disciples if we shut all of this down and opened up our bibles on this Sunday of the Word of God? Work with the first ten chapters of Mark. What if you just read and prayed with a chapter or two each week until Lent? Take some notes. Talk to Jesus about what you read. Imagine the scenes. Focus on a word or two. Hear what Jesus might have to say to you today. Maybe live out the line from last week, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening" (1 Samuel 3:9).

Let's speak less and pray (and read our bibles) more.

On your mark, get set, go!



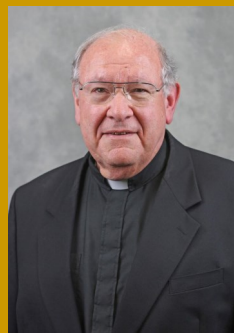
WHAT'S HAPPENING @ SJE

Preparing for Ash Wednesday



Lent is less than a month away! As has been our tradition at SJE, we will collect palm from previous years to burn for ashes to be distributed on Ash Wednesday. More to come on this in the

weeks ahead. Baskets will be placed at the Fellowship Area doors and in lobby of Seton Chapel for you to place your palm. (If you do not have palm from last year, don't be alarmed! Remember, we did not celebrate Palm Sunday services last year because of health and safety precautions related to COVID-19.) Palms from previous years can also be dropped off in these weeks. Palms will be burned before Ash Wednesday and used at this year's services.

Shrine of St. Joseph

Pope Francis has declared this year the Year of St. Joseph as we recall the 150th Anniversary of his declaration of Patron of Universal Church. Our incredible Art and Environment Ministry has enhanced the shrine area of St. Joseph. When visiting, please consider:

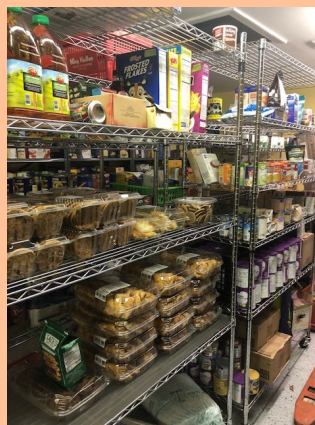
ciples, we are called to continue God's work on earth. Taking care of God's poor is indeed living gospel values.

Background Screening Update

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People:

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

Attend **Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)**

Sign the Codes of Conduct;

Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5 yr. intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org

Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct- provided during the Virtus registration process.

Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application background offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened you may be at – or beyond- the **5yr. rescreening requirement**. If this is the case, you will receive an email from **Sterling Volunteers** asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. ***Please be aware-this is not a scam nor has your e-mail been hacked.*** The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically resign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:

To access your Virtus account: www.Virtus.org You will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or helpdesk@virtus.org. Once in your account, review your account information-particularly your e-mail address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen in the green column click "Update My Account" You will be able to make the necessary changes-please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.

**Actualización de La Verificación de Antecedentes
Oficina Para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes:**

La Carta para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes (The Charter) promulgada por los obispos de los Estados Unidos en 2002 describe prácticas y pautas específicas que brindan estándares de seguridad en parroquias y diócesis en todo Estados Unidos. Como se indica en La Carta, la Diócesis de Rockville Center requiere que todos los empleados, clérigos y voluntarios completen tres requisitos dentro de los treinta días posteriores al empleo o al voluntariado:

1. Asistir al **Programa de Protegiendo a los Niños de Dios (Virtus)**
2. Firmar los Códigos de Conducta;
3. Completar una aplicación de verificación de antecedentes. La Diócesis requiere que todos aquellos que permanecen activos en ministerio sean re-evaluados nuevamente en un intervalo de 5 años. Voluntarios / empleados.

Unas Palabras sobre la Investigación de Antecedentes de los Voluntarios:

La Oficina para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes (OPPNJ) ha simplificado el proceso de solicitud de voluntariado que permite a los voluntarios completar los tres requisitos de Ambientes Seguros en un solo paso. Personas que deseen ser voluntarias en una parroquia o escuela deben:

1. Regístrese para asistir a un taller de Protegiendo los Niños de Dios y crear una cuenta Virtus en el sitio web de Virtus: www.Virtus.org
2. Aceptar electrónicamente el Código de Conducta Diocesano- proporcionado durante el proceso de registro de Virtus.
3. Seguir las instrucciones para completar la solicitud de Investigación de Antecedentes de Sterling Volunteers que se ofrece durante el proceso de registro de Virtus.

Voluntarios activos:

Si usted está activo en un ministerio parroquial, ya ha asistido a un taller de Virtus y sus antecedentes han sido evaluados, es posible que usted ya se haya pasado o está a punto del **requisito de reevaluación de cada 5 años**. Si este es el caso, usted recibirá un correo electrónico de **Sterling Volunteers** pidiéndole que complete la solicitud de investigación de antecedentes en línea. Usted puede acceder a la aplicación de investigación de antecedentes siguiendo las indicaciones del correo electrónico o entrando en su cuenta Virtus. **Tenga en cuenta que esto no es una estafa ni que su correo electrónico ha sido pirateado (hacked)**. La OPPNJ ha estado trabajando con su parroquia para actualizar los registros de Ambiente Seguro y señaló que es hora de que usted sea re-evaluado. También se le puede pedir que nuevamente firme electrónicamente el Código de Conducta cuando entre a su cuenta de Virtus.

Actualize su cuenta Virtus:

Para acceder a su cuenta Virtus: www.Virtus.org Usted necesitará su nombre de usuario y contraseña. Si necesita ayuda, comuníquese con Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 o helpdesk@virtus.org. Una vez entre a su cuenta, revise la información de su cuenta, particularmente su dirección de correo electrónico. Si su cuenta requiere una actualización, presione la pestaña TOOLBOX en la parte superior de la pantalla. En el lado izquierdo de la pantalla, en la columna verde, haga clic en "Actualizar mi cuenta". Podrá realizar los cambios necesarios; recuerde presionar el botón SAVE en la parte inferior de la pantalla.
