

A Message from the Principal of OLQA ...

Dear SJE Parish Family:



My name is Dawn Waller (I'm in the picture to the left with Father Patrick and the Class of 2026!) I hope you know how honored I am, as a fellow parishioner, to be the principal of the Catholic School in Center Moriches, right here on our campus. I have been part of the OLQA and SJE communities for over 20 years. What a gift. How blessed is our school for the support of this great parish. I hope we are a blessing for the parish too!

This week begins Catholic Schools Week at Our Lady Queen of Apostles Regional Catholic School. While we try to keep you up to date each week about what is happening here, Catholic Schools Week is a great time to let you know about our school community to ask you to spread the good news! So here goes! This might be a little lengthy but it's only because I want you to know about the many wonderful things happening here.

Prayer. Everything we do at OLQA is based in and surrounded by prayer. Every morning the school community meets in the auditorium, and we begin our day with prayers. Each day one of our 8th graders leads us in praying the Angelus before lunch and we end our day praying a Hail Mary together. We attend Mass every month as a school community, and classes attend weekly Mass; maybe you have seen us there. Many of our students have been reading and altar serving at the daily Mass they participate in with their class. Students in our Mission - the middle school academy at OLQA - attend religious retreats and will be going back out more into the community to do some Mission work.

Academics. God gave one of many gifts and talents and it is our job to help our young people know these gifts in their lives. Students are helped to a high standard academically while, at the same time, meeting the needs of various learners. All of our teachers follow and exceed New York State standards in the core academic subjects. In this area, too, our faith grounds what we do in the classroom. Our second graders are prepared for their First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion here in school. We have a full-time Campus Minister who is the primary theology teacher for students in grades 4-8 and guides our school community in all Masses, prayer services, and Mission retreats and projects. Students in the Mission take Spanish daily and complete two high schools Regents level courses (Algebra 1 and Living Environment) during their 8th-grade year. In many cases, students graduate from OLQA with three high school course already completed, providing them with an opportunity to advance further in high school. opportunity. Our 7th and 8th graders participate in project REACH, an intensive research program that integrates student desire, research methods - both action and resource, Catholic identity, and the opportunity to present their findings in written, verbal, and visual form. It's more than class! A Catholic community is formed not only by our prayer and academic rigor, but also by the many opportunities to come together outside of the classroom. We are part of the Catholic Middle School Sports Association and students in The Mission participate in basketball and volleyball. Students can compete with other Catholic Schools from the diocese in these sports. Our younger students participate in intramurals throughout the year. We have a chess club, core team, and drama club (stay tuned for The Little Mermaid Jr.. tickets on sale soon!) and much, much, more. All of our students in grades 4-8 participate in band (led by Jimmy Osborne music), chorus, or both.

The Family of Families. We call ourselves the "Family of Families", for good reason. Without the support and engagement of parents and families, we fail in our mission as a Catholic School. That is because we know how vital is to build a connection between home and school. We have the "FUN" Group (Family Unity Network) here at OLQA that consists of parents who help in needed areas like the Father/Daughter Dance, Mother/Son Social, Open Houses, etc. We invite parents into the building to help with our Santa and Bunny breakfast and our Thanksgiving Feast. It is our hope that when you walk into the building you as parents feel part of the family.

Whether you have a school aged child or grandchild or not, come and see the difference a Catholic school can and does make and how you can become an even greater part of the Catholic School in Center Moriches.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we celebrate Catholic Schools Week, I give thanks for the extraordinary gift of Catholic education and for the students, families, educators, clergy, and benefactors who make our schools thrive across Long Island.

This year's observance begins on *Word of God Sunday*, reminding us that Sacred Scripture is not merely studied, but proclaimed, prayed, and lived. 





A Message from Monsignor Walden...

"The people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen." These words from today's Gospel (Matthew 4:12-23) are a quote from the prophet Isaias in the first reading at Mass today. The symbol of light is meant to bring hope into darkness. Darkness is caused by the absence of physical light, but that darkness has been remedied in our time by the abundance and creativity of electric light. True darkness is the evil that causes unrest. The darkness of evil is present wherever there is injustice that separates us from one another, and in reality, whatever separates us from God. As we have just finished focusing on the wonder and miracle of God coming into world in the person of Jesus Christ on that first Christmas, we need to continue to look for the light of goodness, love, truth, and mercy that is the very essence of who Jesus is and who we are invited to share through, with, and in Him.

This past Friday once again thousands of people gathered in Washington D.C. for the annual March for Life. Even though Roe vs. Wade that legalized abortion in 1973 was overturned four years ago, the right to an abortion is still present and taking the lives of approximately 900,000 children a year. Even here we see division as all states can make their own laws to make abortion legal or illegal. Evil will never stop seeking to divide us. "You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." These are the words of Jesus Himself from John 8:32. The last five words in that verse (the truth will set you free) are crucial to our personal, familial, neighborly, local, national, and international relationships and dealings with one another. To know the truth is to know Jesus Himself: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me". (John 14:6)

Ironically and historically documented, the presence of truth has been denied and attacked over and over again, dividing and separating us from one another, our very selves, and God. Abortion is not going to go away any time

soon. The key for us is to continue to support all women carrying children in their wombs and to pray as we do at every Sunday Mass for an end to abortion. The most powerful weapon we have to deal with this national issue is who we vote for. There are no perfect candidates and we tend to justify our vote by who we think will practically do the best for our nation, state and local communities. There is a simple saying that sums up our quest: For God and Country. When we leave out God, we open our national character and unity to comfort, pragmatism, and letting the status quo stand. When goodness and truth are part of the status quo, wonders happen. When evil gets its foot in the door, we experience the unrest, anger, distrust that make the news everyday.

I offer Psalm 63 for your reflection.

O God, you are my God, for you I long;

for you my soul is thirsting.

My body pines for you
like a dry, weary land without water.

So I gaze on you in the sanctuary
to see your strength and your glory.

For your love is better than life,
my lips will speak your praise.

So I will bless you all my life,
in your name I will lift up my hands.
My soul shall be filled as with a banquet,
my mouth shall praise you with joy.

On my bed I remember you.
On you I muse through the night
for you have been my help;
in the shadow of your wings I rejoice.
My soul clings to you;
your right hand holds me fast. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Father, creator of unfailing light, give that same light to those who call to you. May our lips praise you; our lives proclaim your goodness; our work give you honor, and our voices celebrate you for ever.

CRECER COMO DISCÍPULO | ORA, ESTUDIA, COMPROMÉTETE, SIRVE


“Conviértanse, porque el Reino de los Cielos está cerca”. Durante la mayor parte de mi vida, cada vez que he oído estas palabras de Jesús, el énfasis siempre ha recaído en “Conviértanse”. Recientemente, he comenzado a prestar más atención a la segunda parte de su proclamación: “El Reino de los Cielos está cerca”. Con su llegada a nuestro mundo y el comienzo de su ministerio público, ha comenzado el reinado de Jesús. Las señales de la llegada de su reino son sorprendentes e inmediatas; vemos a él “curando todas las enfermedades y dolencias de la gente”. Esto es motivo de gran alegría, como la que hablamos en la lectura de hoy de Isaías: “El pueblo que caminaba en las tinieblas ha visto una gran luz: sobre los que habitaban en el país de la oscuridad ha brillado una luz”. Los milagros de Jesús revelan que el reinado de las tinieblas, el pecado y la muerte está llegando a su fin; ¡esta es una buena noticia, sin duda! También es una parte importante de nuestra vocación como discípulos. Estamos llamados a orar (“venga tu reino”) y a trabajar para promover el reino de Jesús en la tierra.

IR Y EVANGELIZAR | ORACIÓN, INVITACIÓN, TESTIMONIO, ACOMPAÑAMIENTO

Al igual que los apóstoles Pedro, Andrés, Santiago y Juan en el Evangelio de hoy, nosotros también hemos sido llamados a ayudar a construir el Reino de Dios en la tierra. Lo hacemos de manera particular, continuando la obra de Jesús aquí en la tierra. Como nos recuerda el papa León XIV en *Dilexi Te*: “Los signos que acompañan la predicación de Jesús son manifestación del amor y de la compasión con la que Dios mira a los enfermos, a los pobres y a los pecadores... Y la Iglesia, si quiere ser de Cristo, debe ser [...] un lugar en el que los pobres tienen un sitio privilegiado” (21). Parte de la forma en que damos testimonio de la irrupción del Reino de Dios en la tierra es poner a los enfermos y marginados en el centro de nuestra preocupación. Entonces, el Reino de Dios se manifestará y será visible en el mundo, atrayendo a otros a Cristo.

SERVIR: Esta semana, dedica algo de tiempo a investigar formas en que puedes colaborar con otros cristianos para servir a los enfermos y a los pobres de nuestro mundo. Al concluir esta Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos (que termina el 25 de enero de 2026), no hay mejor testimonio que podamos ofrecer al amanecer del Reino de Dios que estar unidos en “la misma manera de pensar y de sentir” (como nos exhorta Pablo hoy) para servir a los necesitados.


