A Message from the Principal of Our Lady Queen of Apostles, Dawn Waller...



Dear SJE Parish Family:

My name is Dawn Waller (I'm in the picture above with Fr. Patrick, Msgr. Walden, and the Class of 2025!) I hope you know how honored I am, as a fellow parishioner, to be the principal of the Catholic School in Center Moriches, right here on our campus. I have been part of the OLQA and SJE communities over 20 years. What a gift! How blessed is our school from the support of this great parish. I hope we are a blessing for the parish too!

This week begins Catholic Schools Week at Our Lady Queen of Apostles Regional Catholic School. While we try to keep you up to date each week about what is happening here, Catholic Schools Week is a great time to let you know about our school community to ask you to spread the good news! So here goes! This might be a little lengthy but it's only because I want you to know about the many wonderful things

happening here.



Prayer. Everything we do at OLQA is based in and surrounded by prayer. Every morning the school community meets in the auditorium and we begin our day with prayers. Each

day one of our 8th graders leads us in praying the Angelus before lunch and we end our day praying a Hail Mary together. We attend Mass every month as a school community, and classes attend weekly Mass; maybe you have seen us there. Many of our students have been reading and altar serving at the daily Mass they participate in with their class. Students in our Mission - the middle school academy at OLQA - attend religious retreats and will be going back out more into the community to do some Mission work now that we can.

Academics. God gave one of many gifts and talents and it is our job to help our young people know these gifts in their lives. Students are helped to a high standard academically while, at the same time, meeting the needs of various learners. All of our teachers follow and exceed New York State standards in the core academic subjects. In this area, too, our faith grounds what we do in the classroom. Our second graders are prepared for their First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion here in school. We have a full-time Campus Minister who is the primary theology teacher for students in grades 4-8 and guides our school community in all Masses, prayer services, and Mission retreats and projects. Students in the Mission take Spanish daily and complete two high schools Regents level courses (Algebra 1 and Living Environment) during their 8th grade year. In many cases, students graduate from OLQA with three high school course already completed, providing them with an opportunity to advance further in high school. opportunity. Our 7th and 8th graders participate in project REACH, an intensive research program that integrates student desire, research methods - both action and resource, Catholic identity, and the opportunity to present their findings in written, verbal, and visual form. You can learn more about our superior academic standards as well as the significant academic support offered by visiting our Open House on Sunday, January 26th and talking with our

It's more than class! A Catholic community is formed not only by our prayer and academic rigor, but also by the many opportunities to come together outside of the classroom. We are part of the Catholic Middle School Sports Association and students in The Mission participate in basketball and volleyball. Students can compete with other Catholic Schools from the diocese in these sports. Our younger students participate in intramurals throughout the year. We have a chess club, core team, and drama club (stay tuned for Finding Nemo Jr. tickets on sale soon!) and much, much, more. All of our students in grades 4-8 participate in band (led by Jimmy Osborne music), chorus, or both.

The Family of Families. We call ourselves the "Family of Families", for good reason. Without the support and engagement of parents and families, we fail in our mission as a Catholic School. That is because we know how vital is to build a connection between home and school. We have the "FUN" Group (Family Unity Network) here at OLQA that consists of parents who help in needed areas like the Father/Daughter Dance, Mother/Son Social, Open Houses, etc. We invite parents into the building to help with our Santa and Bunny breakfast and our Thanksgiving Feast. It is our hope that when you walk into the building you as parents feel part of the family.

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

While all we have is the present moment, we do look to the future and look back at the Hopefully as individuals, and as a past. human family, we learn from the past so we can avoid the same mistakes in the future build on what worked and in the past. Everyday we have the opportunity to truly embrace the present moment in our routines which include our meals together, people we live and work with, and the contacts we have with others in public. One of the most important routines is to spend time in prayer every day. That means so much more than just acknowledging God exists. As with any relationship we have that is truly life-giving, it means looking forward to our time with Him and turning all our gadgets off and doing the best we can with our words to Him and our attention to Him. Any relationship that is truly lifegiving picks us up and fills us with joy, hope, gratitude, and security.

We learned at an early age to "say our prayers". What does that mean? As with any relationship that nourishes us, we need to look forward to our time with God and do the best we can to be aware of His presence to us as well as our presence to Him. We carry the people we love in our hearts. They are always there - sometimes right in front of us, at other times just part of who we are. How can we come to trust God that God always there? Like any life-giving is relationship, with the passage of time His presence becomes a hopeful, inspiring, encouraging source of life and strength. We need those truly joyful moments to guide and sustain us. Is that not why God created us? It is His joy to welcome us into His presence and to fill us with His life-giving Spirit as His children. In the Gospel for today's Mass (Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21), we hear these powerful words which are actually a quote from the prophet Isaiah: "The Spirit of

me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

How great it is to feel the Spirit of the Lord within us. In the routines and busyness of everyday, it is all too easy to put off time to pray for later. It does not have to be in the morning or night time. The best time to pray, and spend quality time with God, is when we are truly awake and able to focus. It is all too easy to put time with Him off but so rewarding when we find and give him our time with open hearts and minds.

I conclude with a prayer I pray everyday from evening prayer in the breviary, the beautiful prayer of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Magnificat.

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name.

He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his

arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty.

He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy,

the promise he made to our fathers,

to Abraham and his children for ever. Glory to the Father, and to the Son,


and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

Anthony was a 13year old boy from the Shirley, NY community who succumbed to his injuries on September 11, 2023, after a tragic car accident while riding his bicycle. In an effort to continue Anthony's legacy and memory, the "Anthony Stinson Memorial Scholarship" will be awarded yearly to a graduating 8th grader from Our Lady Queen of Apostles in Center Moriches, NY who will be pursuing his/her education at a Catholic High School and a graduating senior from the William Floyd School District who will be attending college. Thanks to our fundraising events and to our generous donators, The Dr. Calabro Lodge was able to award the "Anthony Stinson Memorial Scholarship" to six students. Our goal is to surpass that amount in 2025 and to create more scholarships that could encompass a variety of student interests, skills, and be made available to communities across our Long Island region.







Diocese of Rockville Centre Eucharistic Pilgrimage
