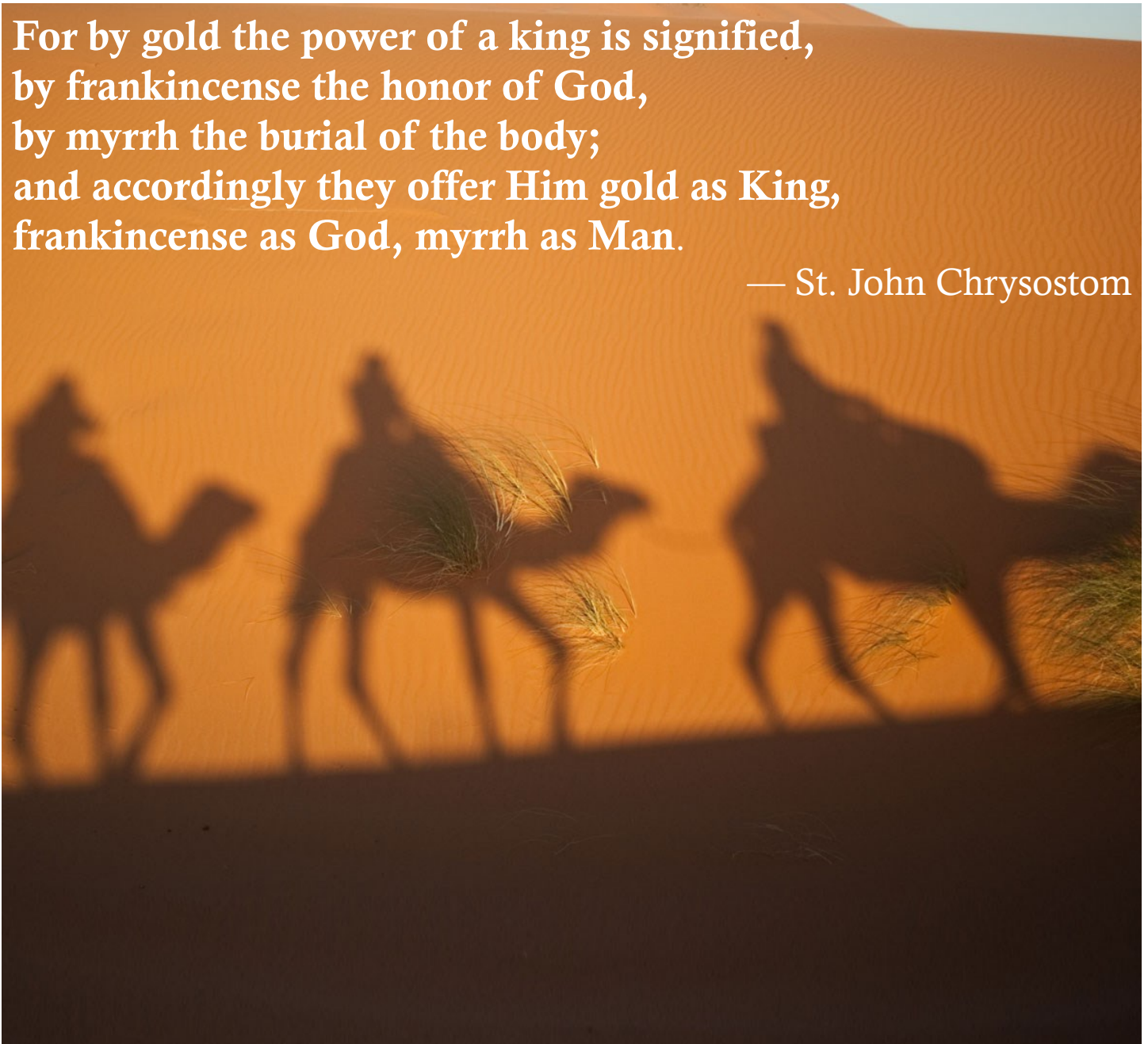

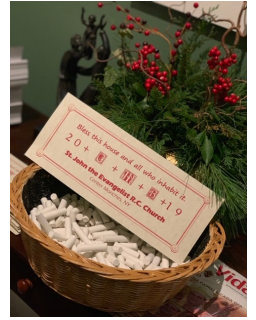
## EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING

*When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung. The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply, "Amen." The leader greets those present in the following words:*

Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever.  
R/. Blessed be God forever.

*In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:*

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.



*One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Luke 19:1-9:*

Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham."

*The intercessions are then said:*

**Leader:** The Son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him.

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader:** Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our Head. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader:** Lord Jesus Christ, you had no place to lay your head, but in the spirit of poverty accepted the hospitality of your friends: grant that through our help the homeless may obtain proper housing. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader:** Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to you in praise and adoration: grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your greater glory. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

*After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer. The leader says the prayer of blessing with hands joined:*

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them (us) with the light of Christ, that their (our) concern for others may reflect your love.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

*The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:*

May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. R/. Amen.

*It is preferable to end the celebration with a suitable song, for example, "O Come, All Ye Faithful" or "We Three Kings."*

## BENDICIÓN DE UN CASA EN EPIFANÍA DEL SEÑOR

*Cuando todos se hayan reunido, se puede cantar una canción adecuada. El líder hace la señal de la cruz y todos responden: "Amén". El líder saluda a los presentes con las siguientes palabras:*

Alabemos a Dios, que llena de paz nuestros corazones y hogares. Bendito sea Dios por los siglos. **R /. Bendito sea Dios por los siglos.**



*Con las siguientes palabras o similares, el líder prepara a los presentes para la bendición:*

El Verbo se hizo carne e hizo su morada entre nosotros. Es Cristo quien ilumina nuestros corazones y hogares con su amor. Que todos los que entren en este hogar encuentren la luz y el amor de Cristo.

*Uno de los presentes o el líder lee un texto de la Sagrada Escritura, por ejemplo, Lucas 19: 1-9:*

Escuche las palabras del santo Evangelio según Lucas:

Jesús llegó a Jericó y tenía la intención de atravesar la ciudad. Ahora un hombre allí llamado Zaqueo, que era un recaudador de impuestos y también un hombre rico, buscaba ver quién era Jesús; pero no podía verlo a causa de la multitud, porque era bajo de estatura. Así que corrió y se subió a un sicómoro para ver a Jesús, que estaba por pasar por ese camino. Cuando llegó al lugar, Jesús miró hacia arriba y le dijo: Zaqueo, baja pronto, porque hoy debo quedarme en tu casa. Y descendió rápidamente y lo recibió con alegría. Cuando todos vieron esto, empezaron a quejarse, diciendo: "Se ha ido a vivir a la casa de un pecador". Pero Zaqueo se paró allí y dijo al Señor: "Señor, he aquí, la mitad de mis bienes se la daré a los pobres, y si he extorsionado a alguien, se lo devolveré cuatro veces". Y Jesús le dijo: "Hoy ha llegado la salvación a esta casa, porque también este hombre es descendiente de Abraham".

*Entonces se dicen las intercesiones:*

Líder: El Hijo de Dios hizo su hogar entre nosotros. Con agradecimiento y alabanza, invoquémoslo.

**R /. Quédate con nosotros, Señor.**

Líder: Señor Jesucristo, con María y José formaste la Sagrada Familia: quédate en nuestra casa, para que te conozcamos como nuestro invitado y te honremos como nuestra Cabeza. Oramos:

**R /. Quédate con nosotros, Señor.**

Líder: Señor Jesucristo, no tenías lugar para reclinar la cabeza, sino en el espíritu de pobreza.

Aceptaste la hospitalidad de tus amigos: haz que a través de nuestra ayuda las personas sin hogar puedan obtener una vivienda digna. Oramos: **R /. Quédate con nosotros, Señor.**

Líder: Señor Jesucristo, los tres reyes te presentaron sus dones en alabanza y adoración: haz que aquellos vivir en esta casa puede usar sus talentos y habilidades para su mayor gloria. Oramos:

**R /. Quédate con nosotros, Señor.**

*Después de las intercesiones, el líder invita a todos los presentes a rezar el Padre Nuestro. El líder dice la oración de bendición con las manos juntas:*

Señor Dios del cielo y de la tierra, revelaste a tu Hijo unigénito a todas las naciones con la guía de una estrella. Bendice esta casa y a todos los que la habitan. Llénalos (nosotros) con la luz de Cristo, para que su (nuestra) preocupación por los demás refleje tu amor. Te lo pedimos por Cristo nuestro Señor. **R /. Amén.**

*El líder concluye el rito firmando él mismo con la señal de la cruz y diciendo:*

Que Cristo Jesús more con nosotros, nos proteja de todo mal y nos haga uno en mente y corazón, ahora y para siempre. **R /. Amén.**

*Después de la bendición, el líder o otro miembro de la familia marca con tiza "20 + C + M + B + 20" o coloca la tarjeta distribuida en la Misa sobre la puerta. ## LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- **MASKS ARE NOW REQUIRED IN ALL BUILDINGS, INCLUDING THE CHURCH.** I have requested this over the past few weeks and it is now mandatory. This week, we were advised by the Diocese of Rockville Centre that as we do not check for vaccination status, all who enter the church building and other buildings must wear a mask.

As I wrote last week, I respect and honor that there are many opinions about this. I do not wish to get into any debates or stoke anyone's ire. For me, particularly, I hear more of our parishioners becoming more anxious about the risk of sickness to themselves and others, I believe it offers another layer of protection and another layer of care and concern for the other. If it is going to even offer the tiniest amount of protection or comfort for another, is there a reason I would not do it? (I do understand there are medical reasons that some cannot wear a mask. If this is the case, please do your best to keep a safe social distance from others.)

Thank you for wearing a mask at Sunday Mass and at other parish liturgies and events.

- **Not feeling great, STAY HOME!** Please do not take any chances for your sake or anyone else's! Join us via social media or watch Mass on the Catholic Faith Network. The risks are too great for you and for others in these days. There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are not well; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.)
- **Entering the Church:** You must enter through the main fellowship doors with your mask on. Please sanitize your hands, take a worship aid and enter the church. Remember, you may leave your gifts for the offertory as you enter and as you leave.
- **Holy Communion:** Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins and immediately before distribution of Holy Communion. When Extraordinary Ministers go to their station, they place the vessel on the small table near that station and sanitize their hands before distributing Holy Communion.
- **Communion from the Chalice:** The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.
- **Greeting of Peace:** The greeting of peace has been reinstituted. You do NOT need to shake hands to exchange the sign of peace if you are not comfortable.

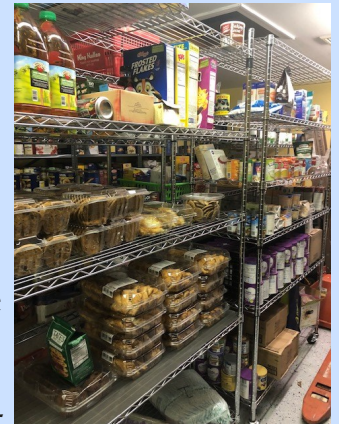

Welcome to Ernie's Place, St. John's food pantry. Ernie's is a place where the St. John's community comes together each week on Monday nights from 6:30 pm to 7:30 p.m. and again Thursdays from 3pm to 4pm. to provide food and great hospitality to the food insecure in our local community. Thanks to the incredibly generous parishioners from St. John's who make regular donations of food, a dedicated team of volunteers who work together to stock the shelves of our pantry a few days a week and a group who welcomes our families each week to Ernie's; together we provide food assistance to approximately 130 families per month, feeding almost 1000 families in 2021. Ernie's Place is a place where connections are made, help is provided, and friendships are made.

There are many ways you can help; you can leave your donations in the box outside of Ernie's Place, coordinate a food drive, or volunteer your time. We are vigilant with safety precautions which include masks and a limit to the number of volunteers/families in our "store" at one time to ensure social distancing. No commitment of time is too small.

In addition to providing food assistance, we make connections to the many services provided by the SJE Parish Social Ministry team, including introductions to other community services. The doors to Ernie's Place are open to everyone; while we may not be able to address every need we'll try to connect you with someone who can. 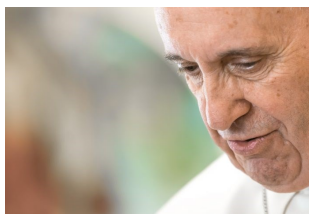

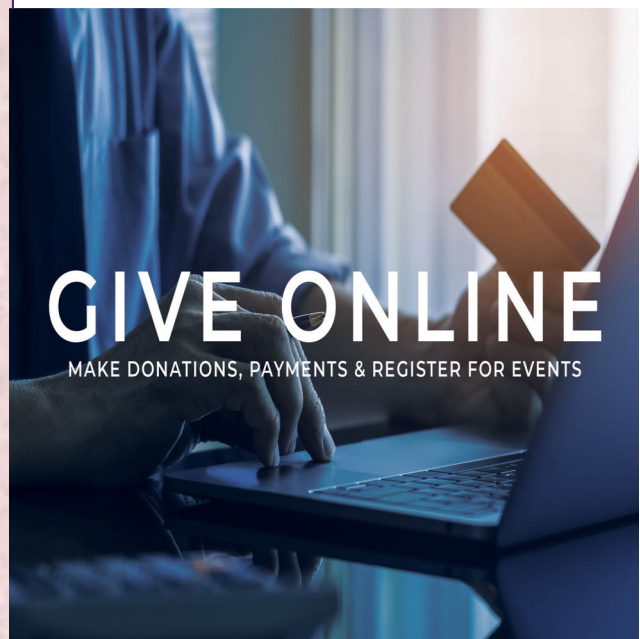
