# *A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...*

## **The Feast of the Epiphany**

*"Reflecting on the true meaning of Christmas"*

Each year, we celebrate Christmas big! We celebrate Christmas with great solemnity and festivity all around the world. We celebrate Christmas big because Christmas is everything! Christmas is the greatest story ever told! Christ entering the world is the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings. Christmas draws our attention to the Lord's Nativity in which prophecy was fulfilled. We are reminded every Christmas of how God remained true to His promise to bring salvation to humanity, salvation without end. Christmas reminds us that we have hope. It reminds us of our bright future in eternity, where Christ reigns forever!

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Today's feast, during this new Christmas Season, reminds us that God has revealed His complete love for us through His only Son Jesus Christ. It reminds us that the fullness of wisdom, knowledge and the love of God are found in Christ alone. We see on that first Christmas how God has made His love known through Jesus. It is clear from that first Christmas, that when one encounters the Lord, one encounters the fullness of God. The Nativity of the Lord reminds us of this. It is also clear from the Magi, that when one encounters the Lord, one is transformed. The implications are enormous when one is touched by the goodness of the Lord. The Magi heading home by a different route after encountering the Lord at the Nativity signifies conversion of heart. Their lives are renewed and changed forever. They head on a new path filled with new life, wonder and understanding!

**The truth is: no Christmas, no Jesus!** No Jesus, no salvation! Christmas reminds us of our greatest hope, heaven without end. Yet every year, the Christmas Season is cut short. It seems like, for the most part, that Christmas ends on the evening of December 25th, when in reality the season is only beginning. Each year it ends on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It is two weeks long. Yet, according to today's standards, it is only one day long. Yes, we begin preparing for this great feast, with great joy and expectation during the Season of Advent. But in actuality, this

season only begins on Christmas Eve with the celebration of liturgy.

For me, the days following the 25<sup>th</sup> of December leading up to the Feast of the Epiphany are my favorite because it is my time to be alone in prayer reflecting on the true meaning of Christmas. It is so hard, in the beginning of Advent with all the preparations, celebrations and social gatherings to be silent and reflective. However, this time during the Christmas Season, I find it very peaceful. I enjoy spending extra time in prayer next to my tree and the Nativity reflecting on the joy and wonder of Christmas; God's complete love for humanity found lying in the manger. For me, this is a time to be extra grateful for the countless blessings in my life; to be extra grateful for the gift of my family and for my assignment here at St. John's. It is a time to encounter the Lord once again, who comes to us each Christmas filled with the love and the joy and the wonder of God. God everlasting!



## **Parish Update**

I hope that all of you are having a great Christmas surrounded by the love of family and friends. I hope that we all experience great conversion of heart and are led on a new path filled with the joy and the wonder of the Lord. A special thank you for your generosity this Christmas Season in supporting our annual Christmas Appeal. I am grateful for your prayerful and financial support. Without your help, I cannot do my part. In the next couple of weeks, I will be sending out letters thanking you for your Christmas gift to St. John's Church. I also want to thank you in joining me in supporting this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal. It is never easy trying to meet our goal, but we have received 95% of our goal so far. As of now, we will receive a rebate of \$18,400 which will go towards the ongoing maintenance of our parish. Last year's rebate of \$24,000 went towards the cleaning of the outside of the entire church structure, and towards the upkeep of the church's parking lot.

## The Epiphany of the Lord

Is 60:1-6 | Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6 | Mt 2:1-12

### **GROW AS A DISCIPLE** | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Have you ever had a moment where you've been so joyful that your heart "throbbed and overflowed"? (Is. 60:5) Perhaps this prompt might call to mind moments we have been chosen or noticed, especially when we otherwise felt sidelined or forgotten. (Imagine expecting to be picked last for the team, only to be someone's first choice!) Today's first reading speaks of a moment like that. While the nations of the earth are shrouded in darkness, God shines his light and glory on Jerusalem, and all the nations come streaming to her bearing precious tributes. Similarly, our Gospel speaks about how God chose Bethlehem — a seemingly insignificant town — to be the birthplace of his Son: "And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people." Like Jerusalem and Bethlehem, we, too, have been chosen by God. As we continue our celebration of Christmas, our hearts are filled to overflowing when we recall that by taking on our flesh, God has chosen to make his home with us for all eternity.

### **GO EVANGELIZE**

#### **PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

Paul reminds us that God has chosen us, not only for ourselves, but for the sake of others: "You have heard of the stewardship of *God's grace that was given to me for your benefit.*" God gives Paul a special revelation to know the mystery of God so he could preach the Gospel to the Gentiles and to all peoples. We who know the joy of having been chosen to be God's beloved sons and daughters have the beautiful task of helping others to know that they, too, are chosen by God. Because of this, evangelization is not simply an item on our spiritual to-do list; it is a work of joy — the joy of helping others to discover their own "belovedness" as children of God. And of course, this message is for *everyone!*

### **INVITATION**

One of the best presents we can offer to someone is our presence. Make an effort this week to intentionally spend time with someone who may feel lonely or forgotten, setting aside other tasks to focus entirely on them. The goal is to help them feel special and *chosen* as a way of giving a glimpse of God's love that chooses each of us out of the many. May the gift of your presence help them to remember how very loved they are.



## A Message from Monsignor Walden...



Today we celebrate the Epiphany, the journey the three kings made to find the Christ child. While we do not know the exact distance, it is clear they followed a star and found the Christ child. Physical distances are no real problem for us today; air travel has turned hours and days, and long distances into a matter of minutes and hours. Mentally, we travel "miles" everyday as we follow one thought to another and physically travel distances that are short, but centuries ago would have taken hours or days.

The first reading for Mass today (Isaiah 60:1-6) has these joyful words of encouragement and hope: "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance." We have the blessing and opportunity of being in God's presence through our attentiveness in prayer at any time or place, and the gift of Church buildings here and around the world where we can come into the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. He is far more than the infant in the manger adored by the Magi. He is our God who has humbled Himself in taking on our human nature, giving His life on the cross for us, rising from the dead, and being present in every Catholic Church in the Blessed Sacrament. He feeds us with Himself in the words of the Scripture and literally comes into our very bodies in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. He is the Word of life and the Bread of Life. What gift do we bow down and give Him?

First of all, it is a true blessing and gift to be in the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The key is to focus on who we are with and communicating with. When we pray in places other than a church building, we find many even more distractions as we seek quiet, quality, enriching time in prayer and reflection. The key is to focus on who we are with in humble joy, hope, and gratitude. One of the greatest gifts we can give to each other is our undivided attention. The phone, TV, computer, and radio are all devices that are constantly at our fingertips and calling for our time and attention. How refreshing it is to spend quality, focused time with loved ones. That is what prayer is all about. It is simple but very challenging at times to experience the joy of the Magi through our prayer and reception of the Sacraments where we personally encounter God and

His love, mercy, and joy.

We are always uplifted when we experience the joy of quality time with one another. When we put our heart and soul into those we are with, we are enriched, uplifted, and inspired. The same happens when we spend quality time in God's presence in prayer and the celebration of Sacraments. Our undivided attention to those we are with is an expression of our love for one another. Recently I read this thought in the book I am reading, "Love Your Enemies" by Arthur Brooks: "Love is a verb, not a feeling." Hopefully, we see and experience that everyday. Would that everyday be an Epiphany where we mentally bow down in gratitude and joy for the gift of faith, the presence of Jesus, and the gift and presence of one another? That light is a true gift and sorely needed in our hearts and our world today.

I close with these words of St. Paul from 1 Corinthians 13:1-13. Notice all words we can use to express love and those that attack love.

*If I speak in human and angelic tongues but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails. If there are prophecies, they will be brought to nothing; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be brought to nothing. For we know partially and we prophesy partially, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I put aside childish things.*

*At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known. So faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love.*

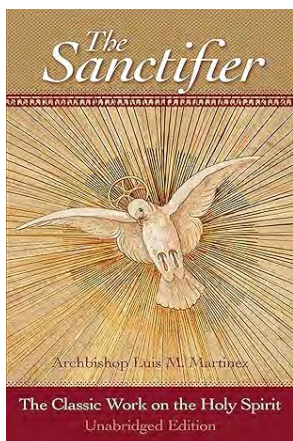

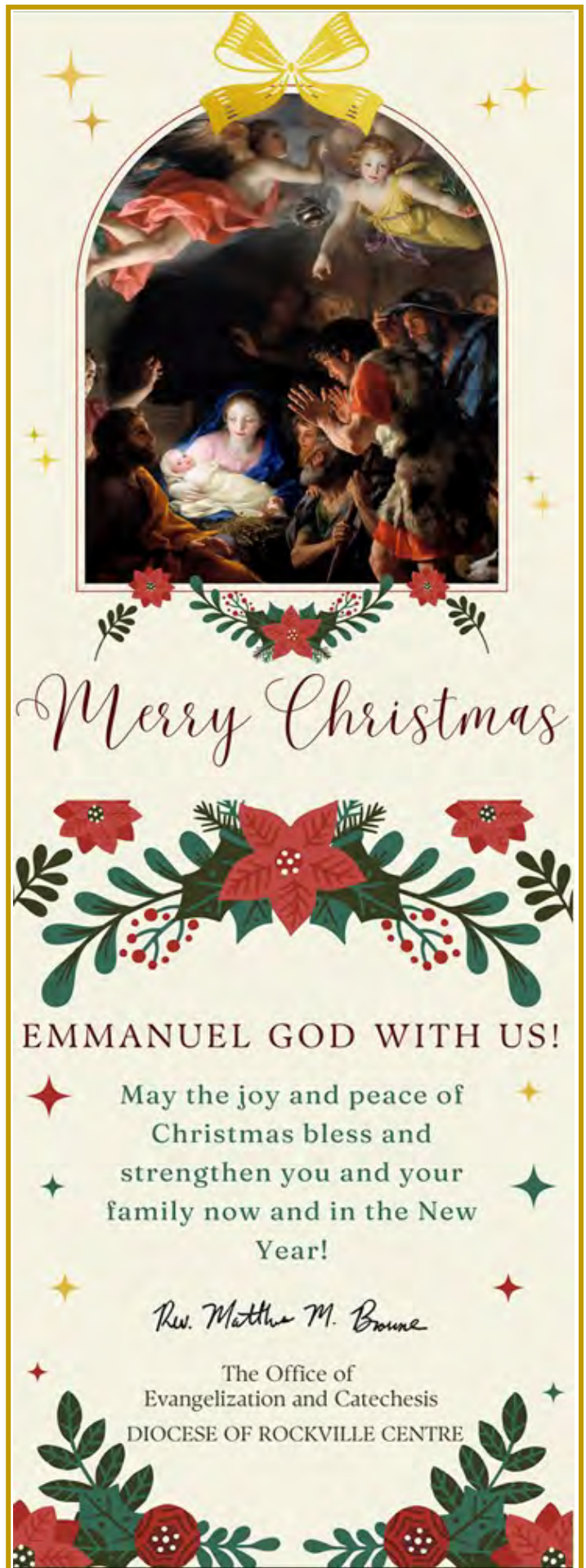
