# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

# National Migration Week

# **Two Four Popes**

Dear Parish Family:

Each year with the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, the Church in the United States leads us to a reflection on the plight of immigrants and refugees in our country and our world. With the Gospel from the Feast of the Holy Family (Matthew 2:13-23) proclaimed in this year's cycle of readings and the Gospel of today, the Scriptures draw us more deeply to reflect upon this issue.

Like all moral issues, there is strong opinion on many "sides", a strength of opinion that in the negative to hatred, resistance to dialogue, pain, marginalization and anger (among many others). Inside and outside of the Church, this is challenging issue to discern and debate regardless of one's opinion. The truth...if there was one perfect solution to the challenges of migrants and refugees in this country or others we would all probably take it.



I know there is a lot of buzz about the recent Netflix movie, *The Two Popes*. Working off of that title, I want to use the words of four popes to give us, as Catholics, some opportunity to reflect on this issue in light of the teaching of the Church which we seek to follow:

"We cannot insist too much on the duty of giving foreigners a hospitable reception. It is a duty imposed by human solidarity and by Christian charity, and it is incumbent upon families and educational institutions in the host nations....Emigrant workers should also be given a warm welcome. Their living conditions are often inhuman, and they must scrimp on their earnings in order to send help to their families who have remained behind in their native land in poverty."

"The Church considers the problem of illegal migrants from the standpoint of Christ, who died to gather together the dispersed children of God (cf. In 11:52), to rehabilitate the marginalized and to bring close those who are distant, in order to integrate all within a communion that is not based on ethnic, cultural or social membership, but on the common desire to accept God's word and to seek justice. "God shows no partiality, but in every nation any one who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him" (Acts 10:34-35).

The Church acts in continuity with Christ's mission. In particular, she asks herself how to meet the needs, while respecting the law of those persons who are not allowed to remain in a national territory. She also asks what the right to emigrate is worth without the corresponding right to immigrate. She tackles the problem of how to involve in this work of solidarity those Christian communities frequently infected by

a public opinion that is often hostile to immigrants."

— Pope St. John Paul II, Message for World Migration Day, 3

"Certainly every state has the right to regulate migration and to enact policies dictated by the general requirements of the common good, albeit always in safeguarding respect for the dignity of each human person. The right of persons to migrate – as the Council's Constitution <u>Gaudium et Spes</u>, No. 65, recalled – is numbered among the fundamental human rights, allowing persons to settle wherever they consider best for the realization of their abilities, aspirations and plans. In the current social and political context, however, even before the right to migrate, there is need to reaffirm the right not to emigrate, that is, to remain in one's homeland... Today in fact we can see that many migrations are the result of economic instability, the lack of essential goods, natural disasters, wars and social unrest. Instead of a pilgrimage filled with trust, faith and hope, migration then becomes an ordeal undertaken for the sake of survival, where men and women appear more as victims than as agents responsible for the decision to migrate."

### January 5, 2020

"Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid!" (Mt 14:27). It is not just about migrants: it is also about our fears. The signs of meanness we see around us heighten "our fear of 'the other', the unknown, the marginalized, the foreigner... We see this today in particular, faced with the arrival of migrants and refugees knocking on our door in search of protection,

security and a better future. To some extent, the fear is legitimate, also because the preparation for this encounter is lacking" (Homily in Sacrofano, 15 February 2019). But the problem is not that we have doubts and fears. The problem is when they condition our way of thinking and acting to the point of making us intolerant, closed and perhaps even — without realizing it — racist. In this way, fear deprives us of the desire and the ability to encounter the other, the person different from myself; it deprives me of an opportunity to encounter the Lord (cf. Homily at Mass for the World Day of Migrants and Refugees, 14 January 2018).

Led by the star, the foreigners from the East alert the world to the presence of the newborn King. Aware of their need to go "another way" to avoid Herod, let us pray for those who are refugees and migrants and pray for the wisdom to discern our faith-filled response to their needs as a parish, community, country and world.

# **EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING**

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung. The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply, "Amen." The leader greets those present in the following words:

Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever. **R**/. Blessed be God forever.

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing: The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Luke 19:1-9: Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead

and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my



possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham."

# **EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING**

The intercessions are then said:

**Leader:** The Son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him.

**R**/. Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader**: Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our Head. We pray:

**R**/. Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader:** Lord Jesus Christ, you had no place to lay your head, but in the spirit of poverty


accepted the hospitality of your friends: grant that through our help the homeless may obtain proper housing. We pray:

**R**/. Stay with us, Lord.

**Leader:** Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to you in praise and adoration: grant that those

living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your greater glory. We pray:

**R/.** Stay with us, Lord.



Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them (us) with the light of Christ, that their (our) concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **R/.** Amen.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever.

**R**/. Amen.



Following the blessing, the leader or another family member marks in chalk "20 + C + M + B + 20" or place the card distributed at Mass above the door.

It is preferable to end the celebration with a suitable song, for example, "O Come, All Ye Faithful" or "We Three Kings."


## SAFE ENVIRONMENT UPDATES AND TRAINING

# EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS TO THE HOMEBOUND

Suffering wears a thousand faces, and every face is that of Christ's.

The above line so aptly describes those who we see, when we visit those parishioners who are homebound or bedridden in a facility due to sickness or age; who no longer are able to attend Mass due to their infirmity. I so often hear their repeated desire to attend Mass in church, "maybe just once more." I also am overwhelmed by their deep and heartfelt appreciation that someone from their Parish, will visit with them, pray and administer the Blessed Sacrament to them where they reside. It is a humbling, but joyous emotion to bring our Lord in Holy Communion to these wonderful people; and absolutely a privilege.




