

# The Feast of the Epiphany

"Reflecting on the true meaning of Christmas"

Each year, we celebrate Christmas big! We celebrate Christmas with great solemnity and festivity all around the world. We celebrate Christmas big because Christmas is everything! Christmas is the greatest story ever told! Christ entering the world is the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings. Christmas draws our attention to the Lord's Nativity in which prophecy was fulfilled. We are reminded every Christmas of how God remained true to His promise to bring salvation to humanity, salvation without end. Christmas reminds us that we have hope. It reminds us of our bright future in eternity, where Christ reigns forever!

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Today's feast, during this new Christmas Season, reminds us that God has revealed His complete love for us through His only Son Jesus Christ. It reminds us that the fullness of wisdom, knowledge and the love of God are found in Christ alone. We see on that first Christmas how God has made His love known through Jesus. It is clear from that first Christmas, that when one encounters the Lord, one encounters the fullness of God. The Nativity of the Lord reminds us of this. It is also clear from the Magi, that when one encounters the Lord, one is transformed. The implications are enormous when one is touched by the goodness of the Lord. The Magi heading home by a different route after encountering the Lord at the Nativity signifies conversion of heart. Their lives are renewed and changed forever. They head on a new path filled with new life, wonder and understanding!

The truth is: no Christmas, no Jesus! No Jesus, no salvation! Christmas reminds us of our greatest hope, heaven without end. Yet every year, the Christmas Season is cut short. It seems like, for the most part, that Christmas ends on the evening of December 25th, when in reality the season is only beginning. Each year it ends on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It is two weeks long. Yet, according to today's standards, it is only one day long. Yes, we begin preparing for this great feast, with great joy and expectation during the Season of Advent. But in actuality, this season only begins on Christmas Eve with the celebration of liturgy.

For me, the days following the 25th of December leading up to the Feast of the Epiphany are my favorite because it is my time to be alone in prayer reflecting on the true meaning of Christmas. It is so hard, in the beginning of



Advent with all the preparations, celebrations and social gatherings to be silent and reflective. However, this time during the Christmas Season, I find it very peaceful. I enjoy spending extra time in prayer next to my tree and the Nativity reflecting on the joy and wonder of Christmas; God's complete love for humanity found lying in the manger. For me, this is a time to be extra grateful for the countless blessings in my life; to be extra grateful for the gift of my family and for my assignment here at St. John's. It is a time to encounter the Lord once again, who comes to us each Christmas filled with the love and the joy and the wonder of God. God everlasting!





You simply write the number of the new year and the letters C, M, and B in chalk on the door or doorframe. The letters stand for the three traditional names of the Magi in Matthew 2: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The letters can also be a Latin acronym for "May Christ bless this dwelling."

### **CHALKING THE DOORS LITURGY FOR HOMES (2025)**


Leader: Peace be to this home, and to all who enter here. All: Amen.

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Happy Epiphany! Today we celebrate the power of God to open human hearts and experience the joy of His presence. We do not know exactly how far the Magi traveled following the light of the guiding star, but tradition has given us their names: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Tradition tells us Melchior offered gold, which symbolized Caspar offered gift kingship. the which symbolized frankincense, divinity. Balthazar offered the gift of myrrh, which foreshadowed Jesus' Their encounter with the child Iesus death. obviously changed who they were, as they went back another way because of Herod's quest to kill the newborn king symbolized.

We take time to pray everyday and come to Mass every week to encounter the same Iesus the Magi encountered. How blessed we are to know what we know about who Jesus is and how he invites and enables us to be part of God's life and experience His loving We do not bring gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Our gifts are much more personal and precious. They are the time, attention, and gratitude we offer. The more focused we can be as we pray and when we speak and listen at Mass, the more we experience the joy and hope of the Magi. Our challenge is not to find another way home from Mass or to look for a guiding star. challenge is to offer the gift of our time, attention, and presence. How inspiring and encouraging to allow ourselves to invite God into our minds and hearts, into the very depth of who we are.

The Magi were not distracted by Herod. In a book I am reading entitled "100 Bible Verses That Made America" by Robert J. Morgan, there is this insight: "There were limited forms of entertainment in colonial times, and little reason for people to get together in assemblies except in times of crisis. That's why churches were so important and sermons so influential. People gathered weekly to fellowship, pray, worship, and learn from Scripture. Many of the events that shaped the mind-set of colonial America occurred because of bible sermons preached by

gifted pastors."

What a contrast to Sunday worship in 21st century America. Now we are inundated with temptations



to shop, travel, go to ball games, surf the internet, go to shows, and a host of seemingly worthwhile ways to entertain and amuse ourselves. Then there is that phone in our hand that can be such a time and attention distraction. Electronic devices in our cars so easily cause distracted driving. They can also cause distracted living, depriving us of the joy of one another's time and attention and, on Sundays, God's time, attention, presence, and love.

Each one of us is worth far more than gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Our time, attention, and love are invaluable as is God's time, attention, and love. What a joy it is to recognize the gift of our presence to and with one another as well as God's time and attention to us, in us, through us, and with us.






# Sunday's Word 2025...

Sunday's Word is for use in conjunction with a hymnal and service book or other music resource, and

is intended for those who wish to pre-read the scriptures of the day as a preparation for the celebration, who have difficulty hearing, or who feel the need to read the text as it is proclaimed for full comprehension. The Eucharistic Prayers are also included. It contains the assembly's responsorial psalm refrain for each



Sunday and major feast. Sunday's Word also contains the Order of Mass.

The weekday section includes the entrance antiphon, Psalm response, gospel verse, and communion antiphon for all feasts, memorials, and weekdays of the year. In addition, the Order of Mass texts (including both the Nicene Creed and the Apostle's Creed) are printed on the inside front cover for convenience.






