# The Feast of the Epiphany

"Reflecting on the true meaning of Christmas"

Each year, we celebrate Christmas big! We celebrate Christmas with great solemnity and festivity all around the world. We celebrate Christmas big because Christmas is everything! Christmas is the greatest story ever told! Christ entering the world is the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings. Christmas draws our attention to the Lord's Nativity in which prophecy was fulfilled. We are reminded every Christmas of how God remained true to His promise to bring salvation to humanity, salvation without end. Christmas reminds us that we have hope. It reminds us of our bright future in eternity, where Christ reigns forever!

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Today's feast, during this new Christmas Season, reminds us that God has revealed His complete love for us through His only Son Jesus Christ. It reminds us that the fullness of wisdom, knowledge and the love of God are found in Christ alone. We see on that first Christmas how God has made His



love known through Jesus. It is clear from that first Christmas, that when one encounters the Lord, one encounters the fullness of God. The Nativity of the Lord reminds us of this. It is also clear from the Magi, that when one encounters the Lord, one is transformed. The implications are enormous when one is touched by the goodness of the Lord. The Magi heading home by a different route after encountering the Lord at the Nativity signifies conversion of heart. Their lives are renewed and changed forever. They head on a new path filled with new life, wonder and understanding!

The truth is: no Christmas, no Jesus! No Jesus, no salvation! Christmas reminds us of our greatest hope, heaven without end. Yet every year, the Christmas Season is cut short. It seems like, for the most part, that Christmas ends on the evening of December 25th, when in reality the season is only beginning. Each year it ends on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It is two weeks long. Yet, according to today's standards, it is only one day long. Yes, we begin preparing for this great feast, with great joy and expectation during the Season of Advent. But in actuality, this season only begins on Christmas Eve with the celebration of liturgy.

For me, the days following the 25<sup>th</sup> of December leading up to the Feast of the Epiphany are my favorite because it is my time to be alone in prayer reflecting on the true meaning of Christmas. It is so hard, in the beginning of Advent with all the preparations, celebrations and social gatherings to be silent and reflective. However, this time during the Christmas Season, I find it very peaceful. I enjoy spending extra time in prayer next to my tree and the Nativity reflecting on the joy and wonder of Christmas; God's complete love for humanity found lying in the manger. For me, this is a time to be extra grateful for the countless blessings in my life; to be extra grateful for the gift of my family and for my assignment here at St. John's. It is a time to encounter the Lord once again, who comes to us each Christmas filled with the love and the joy and the wonder of God. God everlasting!

# From the Desk of Msgr. Walden

We think nothing of getting into our cars and traveling fifty or a hundred miles a day. We go to malls, stores, appointments, family and friends at the drop of a hat. Today we celebrate the Feast of Epiphany where three men at times referred to as kings traveled from the East by camel, guided by a star, to find the Christ child. What made them go out of their way on such a journey? Ultimately it was the inner hunger and need we are all born with, our need and hunger for God. As St. Augustine says, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in you!"

Our journey to the presence of Jesus can bring us to our parish church on Montauk Highway right here in Center Moriches where the Blessed Sacrament, the Body of Christ, is present in the tabernacle. We also have the blessing of the chapel in the convent were Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the altar there from 3:00 PM to 7:00 PM Monday through Friday where we have the opportunity to spend quiet time in Jesus' presence. The distance we have to travel is far more than just a few minutes or a few miles. As much as we look for some quiet time for ourselves we are constantly bombarded with messages, phone calls, convenience of the internet and TV. How does the time we spend with these electronic devices compare with the time we spend with God and our family and friends personally and physically?

When the Magi finally arrived at their destination and found the Christ Child they prostrated themselves and offered their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But most of all they expressed their joy, wonder, awe, and gratitude for the privilege of being in the presence of the Christ Child. It is so easy to take for granted the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in our churches. I use the word GIFT as an acronym sometimes when I talk with children and groups of adults to point our God Is Forever There! The words of the song Feelin'

Groovy come to mind: "Slow down you move too fast, you got to make the morning last." We are always enriched by the love we experience in the



presence of those we love. This Christmas season was another blessing to touch those we love with our presents, cards, most of all, our How blessed we are to touch presence. and be touched by the people we encounter everyday. How blessed we are when we slow down and take some quiet, focused time in prayer, recognizing first and foremost we are in the presence of God. The God of all life, the God of all creation is attentive to me!

One of my favorite Psalms is from Morning Prayer in the Breviary, Psalm 63. I share it with you to read slowly and reflect on. May we all come to know the wonder and joy of the Magi!

O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting. My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water. So I gaze on you in the sanctuary to see your strength and your glory. For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise. So I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands. My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy. On my bed I remember you. On you I muse through the night for you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice. My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Father, creator of unfailing light, give that same light to those who call to you. May our lips praise you; our lives proclaim your goodness; our work give you honor, and our voices celebrate you for ever.



# What We've Been up to...



We are grateful for your flexibility and support! We're always looking for more volunteers to mentor our young people! - **REGISTRATION:** Our program begins when children enter 1st Grade. Registration for the 2024-25 Academic Year will run from June-August 2024—check the bulletin for future info!
- "FAMILY OF FAITH" (Grades 1-6) Our next sessions are January 9 & 11 at 5 PM or 7 PM in the Church. This program for our students in Grades 1-6 is a family catechesis model, where parents and students attend on-campus sessions once a month, then work at home with their children. This includes children preparing for First Communion, which is a two-year process.
- CONFIRMATION PREP (Grades 7 & Up): Our next sessions are January 22 (Level 7) and January 23 (Level 8) @ 7:15PM in the Church. Using a youth ministry model, our Confirmation prep is a two-and -a-half year process, typically beginning in 7th grade. We confirm in the Fall of 9th grade. We feature interactive, experiential learning and small group discussion.



# The Epiphany of the Lord

Is 60:1-6 | Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6 | Mt 2:1-12

# GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It's interesting how an event can be interpreted by different people. God's revelation of himself in the birth of the child Jesus is clearly one such event. The Magi, Gentiles from the east, had heard of this "newborn king of the Jews" and undertook a long and arduous journey to see him and offer him homage. They were edified and eager in their search. Herod, himself a king - of the Jews - did not have the same reaction. The very thought of this "newborn king" threatened him and filled him with rage and suspicion. In this moment in human history, the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles (i.e., the Epiphany) unveils the truth of God's redemptive work for all of creation to be reconciled to himself. This truth has been accepted and rejected throughout time, and our celebration of this feast gives us an opportunity to give thanks in a focused and particular way for our acceptance of it - to give thanks for the gift of our faith. Perhaps it is even a moment for us to have our own, colloquial epiphany: an "aha moment," where we once again truly understand the depth of God's love for us.

### GO EVANGELIZE

### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The Magi, the Gentiles from the east, were changed after their encounter with the Christ Child; they were warned not to return to Herod and they obeyed and took a different route home. In today's second reading, St. Paul says it has been revealed that Gentiles are "coheirs, members of the same body" – the body of Christ. Just as the magi were forever changed by their journey, so must we be. Their journey is a model for us, but we do not have to seek Christ in the world as they did; he is here with us, in Word and in the Eucharist. The Incarnation of Jesus is pure gift to our weary, troubled world. As we heard in Isaiah, "rise up! ... [our] light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon [us]." As the Magi followed the light of the star, let us rise to the occasion and respond to God's light in our world by recognizing the good gifts God gives us each day. And then thank him for his enduring presence in our lives.



St. Ignatius (1491-1556), recuperating from war wounds was given reading material on the life of Christ & the saints. As he thought about what he read, he became aware of his thought patterns, how the thoughts affected his feelings, and how the good feelings remained with him. When he had worldly thoughts, although he felt good while thinking them, he noticed that afterward the feelings left him empty. He continued reading spiritual books, growing in wisdom. God was leading him, fulfilling His Plan for him to be a great saint & to teach us. God's plan for us is the same, the process is slow.

As women who love Jesus, we need & want to learn to recognize Jesus' voice & grow closer to Him. At times we feel inadequate, wondering is this Jesus speaking, me or the enemy? In our group we begin to see we're all equal, with the problems, emotions, weaknesses, confusion, strengths, desires, fears, doing the best we can, we don't have to be perfect. Jesus consoles us through our love for each other. If you feel desire to come but are fearful, we understand because we've been there & at times still are, so just come as you are, no rules or requirements, you don't have to read or share. We respect the privacy of others, sharing is anonymous!


