A Christmas Message from Fr. Patrick... "The Feast of the Epiphany"

Today's Feast of the Epiphany marks the beginning of the end of another Christmas Season. Traditionally, the Feast of the Lord's Baptism marks the official end of Christmas. Therefore, it is still Christmas! For the most part, for many, Christmas ends on the evening of December 25th. Society as we know tells us that Christmas is over after all the gifts are open. We no longer hear Christmas music on the radio after Christmas Day, when in reality Christmas has just begun.

Each year we have two full weeks to celebrate the Feast of Christmas in all of its festivity and solemnity. We have two full weeks to gather together as family around the Christmas tree and Nativity reflecting on the true meaning of Christmas. We reflect on the greatest mystery that brought all of humanity forgiveness of sins and life everlasting. Each year we have the opportunity to reflect on why Jesus entered into our messy and sinful world; on how God loved the world so much that He gave us



His only Son for our redemption and life eternal. He sent His Son Jesus into our lives so that we can look beyond this life itself with restored hope, knowing that something better awaits us in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Today's feast, the Feast of the Epiphany, reminds us that it is still Christmas! It reminds us and signifies for us the full manifestation of God's complete love for humanity. Today's feast reassures us that God's love for us is total, complete and universal. It reminds us how important we are to God and how endless His love is for each of us. It sums up for us the true meaning behind the Christmas celebration. It reminds us that no matter how broken and sinful we are, we can live our lives with eternity in sight, knowing that God has a special place in store for us when we seek His forgiveness and mercy.

We are reminded once again, that Jesus came into our lives to save us and redeem us. He came to reassure us of our greatest hope, life eternal! Today's feast reveals to us the fullness of God's glory and mercy found in the Infant Jesus. Christmas reminds us that we can live in hope of life everlasting. This is what the true meaning of Christmas is all about, how Jesus came to earth on that First Holy Night to save humanity from damnation and show us the way and path to heaven, the fullness of salvation with God!

Let us never forget that Christmas is all about the Nativity of the Lord, because without the Nativity, the birth of Jesus, there is no Christmas and no salvation without end. Because of Christmas day, we have been redeemed forever in a Kingdom that will endure forever. Christmas reminds us how close God is to us. Because of Christmas Day, we can now have a dialogue with God and be filled with His peace and wisdom. Because of Christmas, we have been strengthened in our faith in a God who shows us His Father's love and endless mercy.

As we near the end of another Christmas celebration, has this Christmas changed us for the better? Are we closer to Jesus than before this feast began two weeks ago? Have we grown in our faith and understanding of His Lordship? Has this season in all of its bigness and festivity changed the way we approach life? Do we approach it more joyfully in the Lord knowing the true meaning behind this glorious feast? If not, it is still not too late to be drawn closer to the Lord. All we have to do is look at the Magi (the Wise Men) in how they approached the Child Jesus during that First Christmas. In addition to the three gifts they presented to Him, the greatest gift they gave was themselves. They were so open to the Lord that they encountered Him with all humility and understanding, which is what the three gifts truly signified.

Knowing of His greatness and the power behind His Kingship, they encountered the Son of the Most High with complete and total trust and openness of heart. Thus, their lives were changed forever! Believing He was the true Messiah who came to reconcile all of humanity back to God, their full encounter with the Lord led them on a new path and new direction in life. Instead of returning back the same way they came, they headed home in a new direction, signifying great conversion of heart after their great encounter with the Lord of Creation.

Well, it is still Christmas! It is not too late to have an encounter with the Lord during this new Christmas. 




Moms on the Journey


Did you know ...

We'll continue with the history of St John's School, and pick up where we left off with the increasing student population creating 'pleasant problems'. An addition was built off the north side creating another two classrooms.



My experience in as a first grader in 1957, was sitting in a large classroom that had the 1st & 2nd graders combined and taught by a single Sister of Charity, Sr. Maria Esther. My conservative guess is that the two grades together totaled sixty students. So, promotion to 2nd grade meant just moving over to the other side of the room, (and another school year with Sr. Esther at the helm). By now though, the overcrowded classrooms, and antiquated school building were becoming a handicap.

During the 1950's, Fr. Stanislaus Kowalski, pastor of St John's, began planning & fundraising for the construction of a new school to be built on the property purchased by Fr. Christopher Molloy in 1928. This property, the



current site of the OLQA school, was sandwiched between the former parish rectory and the recently acquired convent on Ocean Avenue.

Sadly, Fr. Kowalski never realized his dream of a new and modern school, when he died in a car accident on April 1, 1959. His successor Fr. Andrew Klarmann, completed the planning, and groundbreaking for the 'new school', began on February 17, 1960.

On Friday February 10, 1961, the children of St. John's spent their last day in the 'old school'. It had served as a parochial school for nearly thirty-five years. On Tuesday, February 14, 1961, classes began in the 'new school'. For this nine-year-old fourth grader, it was

akin to being part of the Flintstones on Friday, to joining the Jetsons on Tuesday. There were eight classrooms, a library, a cafeteria with a fully equipped kitchen & staff plus this huge auditorium. Each classroom had a television, and a phone on the wall that the principal's office could speak directly to the teacher. Unbelievable!

Each grade had its own teacher. Sister Mary Bernadette was the principal, supported by a faculty of teachers were comprised of six Sisters of Charity and two lay teachers.

So from initial student registration in September 1926 of 64 students, to a total of 400 students registered in February of 1961. Fr. John Donlon's effort of the mid 1920's, and the pioneering initial team of the Sisters of Charity who served the first students, and subsequent generations of priests, nuns and lay teachers have served this parish and community with inspiring and dedicated.

- **REGISTRATION:** Our program begins when children enter 1st Grade. Registration for the 2023-24 Academic Year will run from June-August 2023—check the bulletin for future info!
- "FAMILY OF FAITH" (Grades 1-6) Our next sessions are January 3 & 5 at 5PM or 7PM in the Church. This program for our students in Grades 1-6 is a family catechesis model, where parents and students attend oncampus sessions once a month, then work at home with their children. This includes children preparing for First Communion, which is a two-year process.
- CONFIRMATION PREP (Grades 7 & Up): Our next sessions are January 9 (Level 8) and January 10 (Level 7) @ 7:15PM in the Church. Using a youth ministry model, our Confirmation prep is a two-and-a-half year process, typically beginning in 7th grade. We confirm in the Fall of 9th grade. We feature interactive, experiential learning and small group discussion.




