

A Pilgrimage...

Sometimes God's Providence is so clear.

Providence is when in the middle of imperfect circumstances all seems to fall in place effortlessly because God's hand has ordained it. The call came when I least expected it. A friend wanted to tell me that someone had cancelled her reservation for a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, and would I be interested in going?

And so, with little effort, my flight was made, I was confirmed for the trip, all the details were finalized. I was going to the land of our Savior. I was going to the Holy Land.

Arriving in Tel Aviv was as expected. Soldiers were there to protect the travelers and I felt very safe. It had been a long day and night, and I was meeting fellow sojourners at the airport, so my only mission was to find them. All 42 women on this pilgrimage represented 8 different countries. This was going to be a grace-filled journey, and we all were eager to meet and get started.

A pilgrimage to the Holy Land is rigorous as the land is vast and the terrain is rocky and uneven. All we could think about was how difficult it must have been for the Holy family, the Apostles, and the people of that time to trudge this land without the modern conveniences that we all take for granted! How on earth did they do it? Providence.



Every morning we got on the bus at 6:50 a.m. The priest who travelled with us would give us a meditation along the way specific to the Holy sites we would be traveling to that day. He would prepare us interiorly by sharing thoughts on how Our Lord's life was his message. Our first full day was a trip into Palestine and the West Bank~ The Church of Lazarus/




Mary/Martha in Bethany, and the Church of The Nativity in Bethlehem. This was deeply moving to be in the place where Our Savior was born. There are chapels throughout the church where groups can have Mass said, and our chapel happened

to be in the area where the stable of our Lord's birth was located. The manger is preserved in a little alcove in this chapel. In the Church of the Nativity, it is Christmas there 12 months out of the year! The only Gospel that is read is the birth of our Savior (Luke 2:8-19), and the only hymns that are sung are Christmas hymns. It is glorious to experience!



The actual location of where Jesus was born is highly venerated. Lines of fellow pilgrims wait to move into the tiny area to kiss the ground that the Author of Life was born on. Yes, the second person of the Holy Trinity was a helpless newborn. It brought the words of the Mass into a whole new light for me during the preparation of the gifts in the Mass in the Chapel: "By the mystery of this water and wine, may we come to share in the Divinity of Christ,

who humbled Himself to share in our humanity." God deeply desired to be one of us!



where our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph walked, worked, and raised Jesus. All I could think about was our Lady washing the clothes of Our Lord and St. Joseph, talking with the other women of the village in a way that would inspire, gathering the fresh fruit and vegetables to prepare meals for the Holy Family. The distance from Nazareth to Bethlehem is about a 2-3 day walk worth. Let's





remember that this was done on a donkey and Our Lady was 9 months pregnant! It is hard to imagine when you see the vastness of the land.



There were excursions to our Blessed Mother's birth-place, the Church of the Transfiguration, Magdala~ the town where Mary Magdalene was from, The birth place of St. John the Baptist in Ein Karem...

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time + February 12, 2023



There was Mass at an outdoor chapel at the Church of the Beatitudes on All Saints day on a warm sunny morning overlooking the Sea of Galilee. The gardens there are spectacular with lush palms and vista

views. The Gospel reading that day happened to be the Beatitudes where our priest read the words our Lord proclaimed on that very same spot over 2000 years ago. It was awesome to witness. The sea of Galilee is breathtakingly beautiful. There is an emerald green hue to the water, and it is a VERY large body of water. It's hard to fathom that Jesus and His disciples "walked across to the other side" as often as they did. The terrain is hilly, and when riding on a boat in the water you can imagine the crowds gathered on the shore to listen to Our Lord preach.

The stop along the Jordan River has become very commercialized and touristy, so it was not one of the main highlights of the trip. Yet, our Lord was baptized in that river, and he made the water Holy, so it was a site that



we all wanted to experience. Touching the water was a sacred moment. I touched the water that Jesus Christ had been baptized in.

When driving back later that day, we went through Jericho where the tree that Zacchaeus climbed stood in the town center. In this modern time, it has become a type of rotary, but back during the time of Jesus' ministry imagine the thrill of Jesus calling for Zac-

chaeus to come down from the tree. Again, the Son of God calling his children to follow him!





One of the most extraordinary days was in Jerusalem when we walked and meditated on the Way of the Cross. With our headsets secure, we walked with our pilgrim coordinator to each station as she read the station's meditation through the narrow cobblestone streets amongst the hustle and bustle of the marketplace. It was a hectic and very urban area. But to the 42 of us we would stop and kneel at each station: "We adore you, oh Christ, and we bless you, because by Your holy cross You have redeemed the world..." it was PROFOUNDLY moving. How our Lord carried the cross uphill through these small uneven roads is beyond me. And we know from tradition that the roads were packed with spectators and those whose curiosity drew them in. For us, we understood what it

meant to be "contemplatives in the middle of the world." We were re-living the passion and crucifixion of our Lord Jesus Christ, while those around us were picking up foodstuffs for that night's dinner.

Lastly, was the Holy Sepulcher~ the place where our Lord was crucified, and laid in the tomb. There were large crowds of people, pushing



their way to see and touch this holy site. But for us we locked arms and prayed the rosary while waiting. Once you enter the tomb, you have a moment to touch your religious items to this stone where Our Lord was laid once he was taken down from the cross. I wish I could say I prayed for all those I love. Instead, I was overcome by emotion, and still am as I think about it. It was here that I fell in love ... again. If there is any takeaway from this journey, it is to know one thing: that we are deeply loved by our Creator!

Every day was extraordinary, and there were many more sites that we journeyed to. Our Lord's life became more intimate in a human way and more awesome as we encountered His divinity through the places where he lived and performed miracles. Jesus Christ IS true God and True Man!

Each holy site drew me in more deeply, and scripture came alive in a way it had not done before. When I read the New Testament and hear the readings of the Mass now, I can envision exactly where our Lord is, the color of the sky, the aroma of the village. One cannot go to the Holy Land and come back unchanged.

The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.



Did you know...

Did you know Thomas Tebbens Sr,?

Tom was a member of our parish for 83 years...his entire life.

Born on December 30, 1938, until his passing on September 17,2022, he received all six of the Sacraments here at Saint John the Evangelist.

Tom attended St. John's School, grades 1 thru 8, graduating in June 1952.

After graduating from St. Johns in 1952, Tom went on to Center Moriches High School, where he met his future wife, Elsie. From the age of 14, Tom would work weekends and summers with his dad, Alfred Tebbens at the family metal fabricating shop on Canal Street in Center Moriches. Then in 1957, he enlisted in the Coast Guard, serving two years of active duty, and 4 years as an inactive reservist, fulfilling his commitment and separating from the service in 1963. But...along the way, he and Elsie were married in January of 1960.

Tom joined his dad full time in 1960 in what was to become, and still is today — Tebbens Steel. Tom and Elsie went on to raise five children (all graduates of St. John the Evangelist / OLQA school), 4 daughters and a son, Thomas, who is the current COO of the company. From the original and still existing shop on Canal Street, the company has expanded to a much larger additional facility in Calverton. Tom Sr. remained active with the company from 1960 through his semi-retirement period, assisting in projects, a span of 62 years.



Tom's participation in the parish began early as an altar boy in grade school, continued on through to becoming a member of the St. John's school board, serving from 1974

to 1982. Well prior to and

beyond, he and Elsie

helped organize parish dances, bazaars, Christmas fairs, holiday celebrations and fundraisers. He and Elsie were also active in the Extraordinary Ministry for the Homebound, bringing Holy Communion to homebound parishioners.




