

SJE HAPPENINGS

Fashioned by Grace

PLEASING DWELLINGS

Dear Parish Family:

I tend not to use this space for practical things related to the life of the parish. I try to use it for pastoral reflection or something related to the liturgical season or a deeper movement we're called to as a parish in the midst of the Church in the midst of the world.

This week, I want to provide some updates to you about some of the buildings and grounds (and behind the scenes) work we have undertaken over the past few months. Sometimes when you're in the

midst of things you just keep going without taking the time to keep everyone informed. I am sorry for not communicating in a more regular way about these things. (I overheard someone say "Now what is <u>he</u> doing? The steps? What's next?" I think they were talking about me...and I'm not sure it was a compliment....so I figured it might be a good time to write!)

First, raising the roof. I want to offer some updates about the roof of the rectory/parish office. We are in the process of finalizing bids and then will begin our work with Office of Procurement in the Diocese of Rockville Centre. As I have learned again and again, everything takes longer than you think! We will get there. I hope to have some more updates and a request for help in the weeks ahead.



We received an early Christmas gift which will change the some of the efforts that will be needed for this project! A few days before Christmas the Knights of Columbus presented the parish with a donation of \$50,000 for the roof work. This was an incredible gift that relieves some of the financial pressure



of the project. How blessed is our parish for the many incredible ways the Knights of Columbus humbly support, encourage, and enable our parish to thrive.

In addition to the roof of the rectory, we have been able to undertake and/or plan for more work to these dwelling places, both physically and virtually. Because of the generosity in the Summer Appeal and the Christmas Collection, we are able to address a few other issues....again everything has taken longer than you think!

• New pavers on the ramp and by the main entrance of the Church were installed in January. This has been cited as an area of concern on numerous insurance reports and a number of people have fallen over the past year. Not only does this make our parish appear more beautiful, it makes our buildings safer!

• **The Barn was painted in the Fall.** Again, this was another insurance citing as other repairs were required in the process. There is still some additional work to do which will take place in the Spring. Thank you to so many commented on the beautiful work done on the Barn and

the Thrift Shop.

• A new camera/security system will be installed in the weeks ahead. The existing camera system is outdated and has been very unhelpful when it has been needed for use. The existing system will be discarded and the Blink cameras that have been installed will be relocated to other buildings. This improvement will allows us to better monitor the church building and another measure to keep our environment—as well as those who work and serve here—safe.

• In the next few weeks, the parish will move to a fully cloud based server system for our computer and telephone systems. Our existing server –that provides support for technology in all parish build-ings—was purchased in August of 2016. This will make our networks more secure and consistent.

Projects like these come about sometimes because of long range planning goals and, at others times, because things just need to get done. We're blessed with a wonderful Pastoral Team and good advisory committees that help us to make good use of the gifts God has given the parish through you.

I never imagined in my life I would be involved in these things as a priest or ever, to be honest. Hanging a picture has become a long term maintenance project at times for me. These things can be pretty draining and overwhelming. I find myself saying, "Now what?" What drives me in these areas is that these buildings and dwellings have been gifted to us by generations before and allow us to worship, serve, minister, teach and carry out the many works of building the Kingdom of God here at SJE and beyond.

The Collect—the opening prayer– at Mass this weekends says, "O God, who teach us that you abide in hearts that are just and true, grant that we may be so fashioned by your grace as to become a dwelling pleasing to you." I like to think the work we do on the outside—the practicalities of the parish, etc.—may only be a symbol of the work needed for the interior dwellings that are you and me. Perhaps we are being fashioned by grace when we're in need of a little reconstruction, some updating, a clean up, a little extra security. This has nothing to do with our exterior. Rather, it has everything to do with the interior of our lives. When that is transformed, amazing things can happen. You might find it happening and it may not always be so ready for it.

You might find yourself saying, "Now what is <u>**He**</u> doing?" Get ready. It's probably a sign great things are on the horizon.

Please say a prayer for me!

At each Mass at St. John the Evangelist we bring forward the gifts of bread and wine and offerings for those who are poor and in need. This procession of gifts is symbolic of the gifts we bring to the table of the Lord and the gifts the Lord has given us—fruit of the earth, fruit of the vine— to become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

If you would like to bring forward the gifts of bread and wine at Sunday Mass, please see a member of the Cana Care Crew.

If you would like to bring forward the gifts of bread and wine at daily Mass, please sit in the back of the center sections of the Church near the offertory table.

At this time, all who are part of the procession with gifts must wear a mask.





THE WORD OF GOD



On the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Sunday of the Word of God, Pope Francis called us to a deeper appreciation of the Word of God—the Scriptures—in our daily lives. Each year, we try to incorporate a new emphasis on the Word of God. We have blessed our readers, instituted the Book of the Gospels and more. In 2022, we will begin an expanded bulletin page that will help us to focus on the

Scriptures, particularly how they relate to our Sunday and daily worship. Please make use of the resources on this page each week.

The return of the people of Israel to their homeland after the Babylonian exile was marked by the public reading of the book of the Law. In the book of Nehemiah, the Bible gives us a moving description of that moment. The people assembled in Jerusalem, in the square before the Water Gate, to listen to the Law. They had been scattered in exile, but now they found themselves gathered "as one" around the sacred Scripture (Neh 8:1). The people lent "attentive ears" (Neh 8:3) to the reading of the sacred book, realizing that in its words they would discover the meaning of their lived experience. The reaction to the proclamation of was one of great emotion and tears: "[The Levites] read from the book, from the law of God, clearly; and they gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, 'This day is holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn or weep'. For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. Then he said to them, 'Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions to him for whom nothing is prepared; for this day is holy to our Lord; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength'" (Neh 8:8-10).

These words contain a great teaching. The Bible cannot be just the heritage of some, much less a collection of books for the benefit of a privileged few. It belongs above all to those called to hear its message and to recognize themselves in its words. At times, there can be a tendency to monopolize the sacred text by restricting it to certain circles or to select groups. It cannot be that way. The Bible is the book of the Lord's people, who, in listening to it, move from dispersion and division towards unity. The word of God unites believers and makes them one people.

Readings for Next Sunday– 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Please look over these readings and consider these reflection questions before coming to Mass next Sunday.

First Reading + <u>1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23</u>

1. In what way does this reading teach us about magnanimity (which means 'generous in overlooking injury and insult, rising above pettiness and meanness')? Can you think of any saints/prophets who were or are magnanimous? Do you know any magnanimous people in your own life? What about you?

2. Saul was mean and insane but David showed respect for him because he was anointed. Can you show respect for someone yet disagree with him/her? What do you think the outcome is when neither side respects the other?

Second Reading + <u>1 Corinthians 15:45-49</u>

1. <u>Hans Urs von Balthasar</u> said that Christ "cut a path" for us as grace ascending and grace descending. Is Christ just as much creation's highest response to the Father as he is the Father's Word to creation. Does the heavenly Adam coming together with the earthly Adam cut a path for us? What does bearing the image of the heavenly Adam allow us to do?

Gospel + <u>Luke 6:27-38</u>

1. Jesus goes one step farther than David's "don't kill" your enemies. He says, "love" them. Don't expect anything back when you lend, and if someone takes something of yours, give that person much more. Who practices absolute generosity like this? Who do you know besides God who comes close? A parent with his/her child? With grace, can we think of everyone as our family?
