FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Liable to Judgement?

HOLY ANGER

Dear Parish Family:

I recall attending an Evening of Prayer for Priests a few years ago. The presenter, addressing priests specifically, asked, "What are you doing with your anger?" Then he said, "Please note: I did not ask if you had any anger. We know that answer, don't we?" I didn't like the feeling of either comment but I had (and have to admit) he was correct.

Anger often shows itself in the negative. We say something hurtful. We become violent in word or action. We post something in fury. We jump on the bandwagon of hate against this group or that one.

I don't believe that anger is always bad. We see, in the Scriptures, times when Jesus was angry or extraordinarily frustrated, to say the least. It is true that anger can often inspire us to make change – within ourselves or in the world in which we live. Recently, in our community, we are so angered by the death of Thomas Valva. We show some signs that anger may bring about some positive change. However, anger can often be a blaze that quickly fades or becomes its own focus or subject. We find ourselves always angry – even if we keep it under wraps.

I suppose there is a call to transform that anger into a holy anger, an anger the drives us to more Christ-like action. How does that happen? I wish I had a clear answer. The words of today's psalm gave me some thoughts to share. Now, I just have to work on following them myself!

First, we need to pray. Period. End of sentence. Hear the words of the psalm - Be good to your servant (119:17). In moments of anger – whether justified or unjustified – we need to bring that to the Lord. I am not always so sure a big list of words or prayers is needed. Sometimes just being quiet and taking time to contemplate is all that is needed. He helps us to keep things in perspective. Ask the Lord to be good to you in the midst of the moment of anger you are facing. Ask him to help you go deeper.

Second, ask the Lord for the vision to look within. Here, again, the words of the psalmist, "Open my eyes, that I may consider" (Psalm 119:18). A priest I sometimes listen to was speaking to a group and offered this tag line as part of a larger talk, "if you don't look in you're going to lash out." Ask God to help you get that inner vision so you may see what is really upsetting you. I find it's often not the external thing that I am reacting to in my angry responses. There's something deeper in me that I am not letting the Lord touch.

Third, pray the Lord will "give me discernment, that I may observe your law and keep it with all my heart" (Psalm 119:34). Ask the Lord to help you take the next steps. How can I make this moment of anger holy? How should I respond? What should I do? And sometimes nothing is a good answer! Let me share an example.

A few months ago, someone came up to me after Mass livid. He was angry about one part of a homily I delivered at that particular Mass. His finger was loudly in my face. It was definitely a "close-talker" moment. What did I do? I reacted. I did not respond in love. I shot back one better in my own anger. There was nothing holy about it or me in that moment. I should have put my head down and let him walk away. My angry response did nothing to help the situation. I have not seen that person in church since.

I find it is better for me to take a step away. Let God's spirit help me to respond. Not every action needs an immediate reaction – either in person, on the phone, via email, etc. A little time and a little space for God's grace to work can go a long way. It allows us to take the long view. To move from an immediate, short-term reaction to a reaction of depth and reflection.

So what are you doing with you anger? Maybe with God's help it can lead you to deeper holiness!

Preparing for Ash Wednesday

We are all familiar with the practice of receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday, which this year is February 26, 2020. The ashes are a sign of the public penance to which we are all called during the Lenten season. As we promise to repent and believe in the Gospel, the ashes brand us with the sign of the cross — a sign of our commitment to the journey of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, a journey which ends with the new life of baptism and baptismal renewal during the Easter season. Penitential acts are undertaken as a community, as together we journey to the cross and resurrection.





What you may not know is where the ashes come from. Very simply, the ashes used on Ash Wednesday are the ashes from palms saved from Palm Sunday the previous year, which have been burned. This year we once again invite you to share in our communal celebration of Ash Wednesday in a special way. We ask you to bring old palms from your home and deposit them in the baskets which will be available. These palms will then be burned and used as ashes on Ash Wednesday, February 26th.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the Church's process for adult women and men who want to join the Catholic Church. It involves learning about the Catholic faith, sharing faith with others and participating in the life of the Church.

PRAYER AND WORSHIP

LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin that runs during the winter months. With his permission, I have reprinted it here. As we are in the midst of the winter season, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist.

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Holy Communion:</u> Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are especially encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands befor Mass begins. If Communion ministers need to clean their hands during Mass, it must be done discreetly. The best way for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to clean their hands during Mass is to use a sanitizing liquid in the pew before coming into the sanctuary (sanitizing liquids have no place on the altar or among the Communion vessels and other sacred items on the credence table).
- <u>Communion from the Chalice</u>: The faithful should refrain from drinking from the chalice when one has a cold or is fearful of being infected.
- Receiving on the Tongue: Faithful who normally receive Holy Communion on the tongue should refrain from receiving on the tongue and instead receive in the hand when one has a cold or is otherwise contagious. Do not spread your saliva to the hand of the Communion minister if you are sick; receive Communion in the hand instead.
- <u>Greeting of Peace:</u> Use your own discretion and best judgment when invited to exchange the greeting of peace during the liturgy; limit physical contact with others if necessary. If a handshake is not advisable, a simple bow of the head is acceptable. Do not be insulted if someone prefers to avoid shaking your hand.
- <u>Mass Attendance</u>: MOST IMPORTANTLY, IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE DO NOT COME TO MASS! There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are sick; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.) Personal prayer and reflection on the Sunday Scripture readings is encouraged; many people also enjoy viewing the Mass on television.
