A Message from the Director of Faith Formation ...

When I was little, my parents would tuck me and always made sure to say my night prayers with me. I have a vivid memory of one of those evenings, when I decided to have my favorite doll-a Kermit the Frog plush toy - pray with me too. As I moved "Kermit" into a kneeling position with prayer hands and started to say the "Our Father" in my best

"Kermit" voice, my dad smiled and said, "Let's have Kermit pray silently with us tonight."

This memory came to mind as I looked over the readings for this Sunday. You may be wondering why (with good reason!). Well, when I was in college and helping out with youth ministry here at St. John's, we did a whole lesson on "F.R.O.G" - which stood for "<u>F</u>ully <u>R</u>ely <u>On</u> <u>G</u>od." We had frog decorations, frog bracelets, and

"Kermit" even showed up to teach us more about how we can fully rely on God!

When we listen to the First Reading and the Psalm, we are reminded that our hope is in the Lord, and that all our trust needs to be in Him. At some point in our lives, it's likely we've experienced being let down or hurt by someone we trusted. That's a painful experience, and hopefully not something that happens too often. But we are human-we have our faults and failings. And

sometimes we put too much emphasis on one particular human figure or ideology. While we should have expectations, and work to be someone people can trust, Scripture reminds us that God is ultimately the only One we can fully rely on. This is why it's important to remember that Jesus

founded the Church; it is not merely a human institution. The Church is made up of human beings (who at times may falter), but God is in charge!

In the Gospel, we hear Luke's account of the "Sermon on the Plain," which is different from the "Sermon on the Mount" and the Beatitudes we read about in the Gospel of Matthew. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus had just chosen the twelve Apostles, and He



immediately challenges them (and us). He reminds us that we live in a reality which often can be unjust and divided between the and the "have "have's"


nots." While in Matthew's Gospel Jesus spoke of the

"poor in spirit," in Luke's Gospel Jesus is also speaking to the physical social issues we face in the world. He does so to explain that the Kingdom of God is not like this world-that there will be justice for the poor and those who weep, hunger will be no more and the focus is not on who has the most, but on loving God and others. Our goal is to bring that Kingdom of Heaven to earth-to work on our own generosity, trusting that God will provide; to encounter God in those

moments of mourning and trust that He has a plan and will see us through.

So as we move closer to the Lenten Season, let's do our best to "F.R.O.G." -Fully Rely On God!"

Our Faith Formation families in our "Family of Faith" program (Grades 1-6) are learning about trust in God this year as they learn about the Apostles Creed. This month, we were blessed to have youth and adult volunteers share the story of the Paschal Mystery through a visual presentation!



Our Level 8 students learned about the Rosary, with Tess Austin, director of Catholic Identity and Mission for the diocese, coming out to speak

on John's Gospel account of the Wedding at Cana and the beautiful devotion to the Rosary. Students were each given a Rosary (hand-made by the Leavy family!) and challenged to begin praying the Rosary at home.



ABSTINENCE & FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"It is so good to be poor, to have nothing, to await all from God!" These sentiments of the humble French religious sister St. Jeanne Jugan sum up the spirit of Jesus' words in today's Gospel. Jesus praises poverty, hunger, sadness, and rejection, but certainly not as ends in themselves; God does not take pleasure in our suffering! He does use our suffering, however, to awaken us to our need for him. Poverty can spur us to pursue heavenly goods, and thus Jesus assures the poor, "the kingdom of God is yours." Hunger can cause us to seek God who alone can truly satiate our desires, and thus Jesus says to the hungry, "you will be satisfied." Those who weep will laugh, Jesus says - so long as their sadness inspires them to seek happiness in the service of God and the joys of eternal life. For all of us, no matter our means or our circumstances, today's Gospel is a reminder to allow everything - including our difficulties, disappointments, and unfulfilled desires - to turn our hearts to God and rely on his loving care.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

It can be difficult to practice the spirit of the Beatitudes (as the "blessings" in today's Gospel are called) in the moment. Suffering, distress, and confusion easily divert our attention from God as we attempt to "make the problem go away." Sometimes we are even tempted to give up, to turn aside from God, and to seek consolation in other things. This is exactly the opposite of what he wants for us, and for good reason! God knows that it is best for us to always rely on him. This is why, as today's first reading explains, the man who trusts in the Lord is secure – "like a tree planted beside the waters ... it fears not the heat when it comes" – and fruitful – "its leaves stay green." For those who trust in the Lord, help comes from the all-powerful, infinitely loving Creator of the universe. When we entrust ourselves to him, we have nothing to fear.

ACCOMPANY

Is there someone in your life who is struggling with fear, loneliness, anxiety, or sadness? Take time to pray with that person and, together, try to discover God's invitation to a deeper reliance on him in the midst of the distress. These moments of suffering are never occasions for us to get "preachy." Instead, accompany your friend and be a reminder of the hope we have in God.

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Whenever we celebrate the feast of a saint who is a religious, there is this passage from the Song of Songs 8:7 in the Old Testament in the breviary to contemplate: "Deep waters cannot quench love, nor floods sweep it away. Were one to offer all he owns to purchase love, he would be roundly mocked." As we know all too well but can easily forget or not recognize in the present moment, God's love is seen and so clearly present through, with, and in Jesus. As children we innately trust our parents. What a beautiful simple example to contemplate! As we grow and mature, we seek opportunities to love and be loved in return. So the questions to ponder and be enriched and challenged by are: "Who is part of my life and whose lives am I part of? Who lives in my mind and heart, and whose heart and mind do I live in? In the Gospel from last Sunday's Mass (Luke 5:1-11) we see that "aha" moment in the life of St. Peter. Jesus had just finished preaching from Peter's fishing boat because the crowd was large and he needed room to speak to all on the shore. When Jesus finished preaching He looked at Peter and told him to take the boat out and lower the net for a catch. Peter, the man who made a living fishing was not optimistic as he said to Jesus, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." Peter's reluctance is quickly changed to wonder and unworthiness as they net so many fish they can scarcely haul in the net. He fearfully and humbly responds to this wonder by saying to Jesus, "Depart from me Lord, for I am a sinful man." Notice the two forms of address Peter uses. First he calls Jesus 'master' when he follows the directive to lower the net to catch fish. Once Peter sees the wonder of the catch, he no longer calls Jesus 'master', but 'Lord', as he says, "Depart from me Lord, for I am a sinful man."

What we see here is the love of God that cannot be conquered by our lack of faith, response, or wonder. The key is to come to the vision of Peter and see God's patience, wisdom, mercy, and all powerful love. No one's love is ever earned, for then it would not be love. Love can only be a pure gift or else it cannot be the essence of what love is. Pope Benedict XVI has this observation in the



book Benedictus, Day by Day with Pope Benedict XVI on February 9th: "At the very heart of sin lies human beings' denial of their creatureliness, inasmuch as they refuse to accept the standard and limitations that are implicit in it. They do not want to be creatures, do not want to be subject to a standard, do not want to be dependent. They consider their dependence on God's creative love to be an imposition from without... Human beings who consider dependence on the highest love as slavery and who try to deny the truth about themselves, which is their creatureliness, do not free themselves; they destroy truth and love. They do not make themselves gods, which in fact they cannot do, but rather caricatures, pseudo-gods, slaves of their own abilities which drag them down."

Psalm 63 and prayer:

O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting. My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water. So I gaze on you in the sanctuary to see your strength and your glory.

For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise. So I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands. My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy.

On my bed I remember you. On you I muse through the night for you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice. My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Father, creator of unfailing light, give that same light to those who call to you. May our lips praise you; our lives proclaim your goodness; our work give you honor, and our voices celebrate you for ever.

Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic



present moment. We're living the lessons which is comforting when we're in pain, we have a lot of laughs too. We're there for each other! The book will be provided,


