LENT 2018

ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Good Friday fast and abstinence.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

First Sunday of Lent Drowned by Temptations

Dear Parish Family:

Lent is only about four days old! How are you doing with your Lenten practices? Are you like me? I'm presuming, even though I'm writing this letter on Ash Wednesday, that I may have started coming up short and tried to figure out a way to justify getting around this act of almsgiving or fasting. It starts small, right? If I have chosen to give up a bad habit, say not eating dessert, or promised to take on a renewed effort at prayer or service, have I started to move away from it bit by bit? (I bet I have!)

I met a former student this week. He is married now with a family. He's a great role model of faith and charity. In his 30s, he is involved in his parish, a good husband, a faithful father. As a student he had the privilege of having me as a classroom teacher in his freshman and senior years. He was very lucky :). I remember one of the first times I met him in ninth grade. He spoke to me about all of the things he would "never do". He did so with a sense of immature arrogance not uncommon to many 14 year old freshmen. When I had him in class as a senior, he had done most of those things and more. I know because I was his counselor for all four years. We have spoken many times since. He'll often say to me "I never thought that would be me" or "I'm not really sure how it turned so bad so fast."

Temptation is a reality in our lives. Evil dwells in and around us and we would be quite foolish and naive to consider otherwise. People speak often of Pope Francis and his messages of joy and hope (and that smile!). Yet, if you read his homilies and talks there are very few that do not, in some way, come back to the reality of evil in our world. Evil is not in the form of a guy in a red outfit with horns. In some ways that would be a lot easier. Simply stay away from that guy.

Rather evil works in often more insidious and subtle ways. Sometimes we're not even sure where it came from, right? We find ourselves doing things, saying things, feeling things. We stop resisting temptation. We get distracted. We fall. How did this become my sin? How did it go so bad so fast?

One of my favorite spiritual writers is Fr. William Barry, SJ. I have written and preached about him before. He writes, "The discernment of the spirits rests on the belief that the human heart is a battleground where God and the evil one struggle for mastery. Jesus of Nazareth himself believed this. In the desert he had been tempted by the evil one masquerading as an angel of light."

We need to pay attention and maybe that is the best Lenten practice of all. To pay attention to the movement of the Spirit within us and the lack of that movement at times. To see the signs of temptation winning. To see where we are drowning from the onslaught of the waves of this life (see 1st reading). Lent is a good time to practice that discernment, to do that reflection. To see "how it got that bad" or "how I couldn't see it coming".

As a social worker and even at times as a priest, I often meet people after it has gotten "that bad". It's a process to understand the journey and the path. Sometimes its clear. There was an event, an encounter, an incident. Often it's not. It's muddled. It's hidden. It's hard to see.

I'm not writing this as a social worker. I'm writing it as a Catholic priest. There is a huge difference in how we look at that journey. We can stay in the clinical and analytical. Or we can be humble and vulnerable enough to allow the Lord to help us to see. We can ask him to pull us out of the water and warm us with the rainbow of his love (Genesis 9:16). We can speak to him about the temptations in our own deserts. We can confess to him both in our private prayer and through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We can discern with his help to make the next right decision. If we're open to it, we can count on his mercy and compassion to pull us through.

Please pray for me.

PRAYER AND WORSHIP

LENTEN LITURGICAL NOTES

The season of Lent calls us to a time of deeper reflection and repentance. We are called to do this in our own lives but also in how we pray liturgically. Read below and learn more:

• The Gloria (Glory to God) is not said or sung during Lent, except on the Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 19th). We will sing the Gloria again at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and then again at the Easter Vigil. It is also sung on the Solemnity of the Assumption. Because that date—March 25th—is the Palm Sunday, the Solemnity of the Assumption is transferred to Monday, April 9, 2018.

• The Alleluia is omitted from all hymns and as the Gospel Acclamation during Masses. The Gospel acclamation is still sung but different words are used. This Lent, the refrain is, "Glory to you, O Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ."

 \cdot We will use the Apostles' Creed instead of the Nicene Creed. The Roman Missal (#19) clearly encourages the use of the Apostles' Creed during the seasons of Lent and Easter. It is a good practice to get used to. These will be on cards inserted into *Breaking Bread*.

 \cdot We will use simple Mass settings during the season of Lent. We are working to have cards in the Breaking Bread hymnals that will have the music for these settings. (We learned from the last time we changed Mass settings in Advent.)

• During the time when the gifts of bread and wine are brought forward and the altar prepared, there will be no music—instrumental or otherwise. (We'll make an exception for Laetare Sunday, the 4th Sunday of Lent.) It is our hope this will help us to reflect more on what has been proclaimed and preached during the Liturgy of the Word and enter more fully into the sense of the Lenten season.

 \cdot During Weekday (Daily Mass), we will not sing an Entrance Hymn or a Closing Hymn as is our custom here.

Discussion Questions

LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin that runs during the winter months. With his permission, I have reprinted it here. As we are in the midst of the winter season, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist.

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are especially encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins. If Communion ministers need to clean their hands during Mass, it must be done discreetly. The best way for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to clean their hands during Mass is to use a sanitizing liquid in the pew before coming into the sanctuary (sanitizing liquids have no place on the altar or among the Communion vessels and other sacred items on the credence table).
- **Communion from the Chalice:** The faithful should refrain from drinking from the chalice when one has a cold or is fearful of being infected.
- <u>Receiving on the Tongue:</u> Faithful who normally receive Holy Communion on the tongue should refrain from receiving on the tongue and instead receive in the hand when one has a cold or is otherwise contagious. Do not spread your saliva to the hand of the Communion minister if you are sick; receive Communion in the hand instead.
- <u>Greeting of Peace:</u> Use your own discretion and best judgment when invited to exchange the greeting of peace during the liturgy; limit physical contact with others if necessary. If a handshake is not advisable, a simple bow of the head is acceptable. Do not be insulted if someone prefers to avoid shaking your hand.
- <u>Mass Attendance</u>: MOST IMPORTANTLY, IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE DO NOT COME TO MASS! There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are sick; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.) Personal prayer and reflection on the Sunday Scripture readings is encouraged; many people also enjoy viewing the Mass on television.
