A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

Lent: A Time of Renewal and Growth (Mk 1:12-15)

A new Lent is among us. A new beginning and a new journey towards God has begun. Today's gospel officially marks the beginning of the 40 days of Lent when we recall Jesus' entrance into the desert. Our 40 days officially begins at sundown on the Saturday after Ash Wednesday (first weekend of Lent) and continues through Holy Thursday evening, which marks the beginning of another Easter Triduum. Today's gospel reminds us that Lent is here and now is the time for us to head back into the desert to join the Lord in prayer and reflection.

Jesus is telling us again, right now during this new season of Lent, to repent and believe in the Gospel, the Gospel of life! He is telling us that now is the time, the mandated time, to change our ways and to turn our lives around. He is making it clear that we need to follow the Gospel that is both from God and about God. In other words, when speaking to us today about the importance of taking God's Word seriously, He is reminding us during this new season of Lent of the urgency of remaining close and faithful to God and His teachings!

Who knows how many more Lents we will have to turn our lives around and conform our lives to Christ; in living for the Lord in service to one another. This new season of Lent offers us another opportunity to render our hearts over to God and to take His Gospel more seriously, because through baptism, we now belong to God and to God alone who is our hope and our joy!

For me, I was never crazy about Lent growing up. I never really understood the true meaning behind this season. But now I know how important it is and how joyful it can be in being drawn closer to God. I always associated Lent with giving up something until Easter. Now I realize the importance behind fasting. Fasting can lead us closer to God, especially if we fast from the things that pull us away from Him. I try to give up something I enjoy or something that keeps me from praying more, like watching television. I try to watch less TV (less news), something I enjoy in the evening hours, and pray more. I try to do more spiritual reading, which I find to be more delightful and fulfilling than watching the same old news. I enjoy learning more about God in the silence of prayer and reflection when I take my prayer time more serious.

The truth is Lent is a time for spiritual growth. It is a time to re-connect with the Lord who alone can satisfy and refresh our souls. It is a time to grow in our awareness and appreciation of the importance of God in our lives. Lent affords us another opportunity to grow in our love for God. It is a time of renewal; it is a time of grace and transformation. Lent is a time to reform our lives and make all the necessary changes we need to make in order to make more room for God in our lives. This season of conversion invites us to soften our hearts a bit more and to walk more humbly with God, to be one with Him in prayer and adoration, and grateful for the blessings we have received, including life without end. We need to see what we have to do differently so that we can live our lives more joyfully and fulfilling in the Lord. Lent brings us closer to God if we make a conscious effort on our part. Lent brings us home to God, especially through the spiritual disciplines that this season has to offer prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

More importantly, Lent shows us the way to the Lord. We need Lent because we need to learn how to put God first in our lives. St. Augustine says, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in God." That is why now is the time again, as Scripture says, to repent and believe. To believe in the Gospel of God! Now is the time for change and renewal. Now is the time to take our relationship with God more seriously, knowing that He alone is the fulfillment of our hopes and longings. This new season of Lent invites us to trust more in God, who has been faithful to His promise since ancient times and who leads us to all truth and understanding of the Easter Mysteries, life everlasting!


Votive Candles/Altar Candles



A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"You can't handle the truth!" That is a line from the movie "A Few Good Men" where Jack Nicholson was a commanding officer on trial for the unjust death of one of his soldiers, and Tom Cruise was the military lawyer prosecutor questioning him. There are truths that we all have to deal with that are not always easy to accept: a devastating sickness, the death of a loved one, the loss of a job are just a few of the difficulties we have a hard time dealing with. Ironically in the Gospel for last Monday, we had these words: "The pharisees came forward and began to argue with Jesus, seeking from Him a sign to test Him." (Mark 8:11). It is absurd to think we can argue and correct Jesus or get Him to see things our preferred way. In the Gospel for today's Mass (Mark 1:12-15), we see Jesus coming out of the desert after being tempted by Satan for forty days.

This past Wednesday, we began our forty day Lenten journey to Easter. Like Jesus, we can be tempted. Our temptation is to make good resolutions and just never begin to live them out. What truth do we need to handle? Even more, what truth do we need to clarify and make a part of our daily lives as well as our journey to the fullness of God's presence when we die? It is not that we have to handle the truth about who we are in the core of our being and how God fits into that picture. Life is a gift, a journey with a clear purpose. That purpose is to one day, our last day in this life, to meet God face to face. That is not meant to "scare the hell" out of us, but to open the door of our hearts to embrace Jesus and His love and presence in His life.

When I was growing up, there was a real focus on fasting, on giving up things we liked to do, to discipline our hearts. Today we are bombarded with words and messages, even if we live alone. What words and speakers of those words get our undivided attention? In the very beginning of his Gospel, St. John powerfully says Jesus speaks the word of God and is the Word of God (John 1:1-15): "In the beginning was the


Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and



without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him. But to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to those who believe in his name, who were born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God. And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth."

This passage presents the truth that we need to handle who we are, where we are going and how we are going to get there. To contemplate these words is not to escape from the world, but to see it through Jesus the Word of God, the God whose Word created all things and ourselves as human beings in His very image.




