

A Reflection from Deacon Ed Grieb ...

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time



What a beautiful Gospel passage this weekend!

Some scripture scholars have said that the Beatitudes are a 'lesson in humility, love and justice.' Each Beatitude starts with phrase, a humility, and then is followed by a glory/blessing that will follow if we can submit to the humility with God's assistance.

I've watched some of the episodes of television series 'The Chosen' (although I admit I'm not an avid viewer). One of the earlier episodes I more vividly remember (I looked it up, it was in season 2), was when Jesus delivered the Beatitudes. That episode, and a few earlier ones, were building up to Jesus giving His great Sermon on the Mount. In this episode, Jesus wakes Matthew early one morning and asks him to take notes as he prepares for the great Sermon. He then goes on to reflect and slowly recite the beatitudes, while on screen we see flashbacks to several of the disciples experiencing these humilities in prior episodes. We then see how Jesus had comforted them through the difficult times and then together had made it through their experiences. The most impactful line comes at the very end of the scene when Jesus tells Matthew, 'if someone wants to find me, these are who they should look for.' I found it to be a very moving episode, in particular the reaction you see in Matthew's facial expression as he is beginning to understand this new Law of Love that Jesus is trying to explain to His early followers (full disclosure, The Chosen is 'based' on the Gospels, and not meant to be a precise re-telling; there are story lines written around the Gospel passages).

As we heard in last week's Gospel, the central message of Jesus' preaching is the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven and our need for repentance - a change of heart, attitude and behavior, on the part of those who hear God's call. This message resonates as much today with each of us as it did when Jesus first spoke these words, and as millions have listened over the past 2000 years.

The first and second readings we hear today

convey that same message of humility. The prophet Zephaniah was a contemporary of Jeremiah, preaching the coming judgment on Judah and Jerusalem, but he also prophesized a restored Jerusalem - the hope of what will come to the Jewish people. We hear about this latter part of his prophesy today as he tells of those who escape God's wrath of judgement:

"But I will leave as a remnant in your midst, a people humble and lowly, who shall take refuge in the name of the LORD: the remnant of Israel."

In our second reading from his Letter to the Romans, St. Paul reminds us that it's a humble heart that hears God's call. And by putting aside our own ego, we can honestly ask ourselves if we've gotten too caught up conforming to the message we hear in society about prioritizing comfort and wealth, and as a result, we find ourselves neglecting Jesus' call to serve others.

"God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong, and God chose the lowly and despised of the world, those who count for nothing, to reduce to nothing those who are something, so that no human being might boast before God. Whoever boasts, should boast in the Lord."

Our minds may think sometimes that it's those who are rich, have no need to grieve, are free of enemies and troubles, or appear to be most admired in the media that are truly blessed among us. But Jesus flips this around and reminds us that when we deal with our difficulties and challenges with God's guidance and help, it is then we are truly blessed. Because we can boast in the Lord knowing our trust is in Him.

We will continue to hear from Matthew's account of the Sermon on the Mount over the next several weeks, as Jesus announces His message on the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven and our need for repentance.

And that will lead us right into the beginning of Lent (!) at the end of the month.

ABSTINENCE & FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse.

A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.







GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

There have been many times when I have experienced "imposter syndrome" in my work, where I doubt my own ability. In these times, I often looked to others to try to determine if I was doing enough. But instead of giving me the validation and encouragement I was seeking, this act of comparison frequently led to dissatisfaction. I began to wish I was more like others — more outgoing, more disciplined, more organized. But who I am and the gifts that I have to offer are exactly what I am being called to give in my vocation. Saint Paul reminds us in his First Letter to the Corinthians that we were not called because we possess a specific talent or personality; we have been called to bear witness to the work Christ is doing in us. And this witness comes from living our vocation authentically, with the gifts we naturally possess. When we not only accept but love and value our unique qualities, we give glory to the One who so lovingly and perfectly created us.

REFLECT

As we go through life, there can be times when we feel unprepared for the vocation God has called us to. Consider how these feelings of inadequacy may be an invitation for us to rely more fully on Christ working within us. Bring this to prayer and ask the Lord to reveal how he may be using this particular circumstance to draw us closer to him.

GO EVANGELIZE**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

In proclaiming the beatitudes, Christ reveals that those who will experience the rewards of heaven aren't those we might consider "blessed" by human standards. What our culture values as markers of success and happiness are not always what is valued in the kingdom of God. Indeed, the joys of life in the kingdom are deeper than those here on earth; we were created for fulfillment greater than what this world can offer. Therefore, we must live confidently in the hope of Christ's promises instead of comparing ourselves to others who might appear more successful. And as we live our vocation, we are called to live out the countercultural message of the beatitudes — a radical trust in the eternal promises of God in spite of earthly poverty, grief, or persecution. In doing so, we invite others to see and experience the joy of the abundant life that Christ proclaims.



A Message from Monsignor Walden...

There is a lot of attention today with regard to artificial intelligence. While many good things can be done with it, we must first of all remember that it is only a tool that has been invented by human research and intelligence. Like any other tool, it can be used to do good or to do harm. The Gospel for today's Mass (Matthew 5:1-12) proclaims the fruit of what divine intelligence summarized in the Ten Commandments is all about. In my reflection book from Pope Benedict XVI that offers a thought for each day of the year, there is this thought: "If the Ten Commandments, as expounded by rational understanding, are the answer to inner demands of our nature, then they are not at the opposite pole to our freedom but are rather the concrete form it takes. They are then the foundation for every law of freedom and are the one truly liberating power in human history." In other words, in the Ten Commandments we have everything we need for the moral foundation of our lives as individuals, families, communities, states, countries and the world we live in.

In proclaiming the Beatitudes in today's Gospel, Jesus lays out the inner dynamics of how our attitudes and actions emanate from our thoughts, words, and actions. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." In the first beatitude proclaimed, we see that we do not wallow and wander in confusion when we live in the light of faith. It is not every person for himself or herself, but every person coming to see ever more clearly how much peace, hope, courage, humility and wonder lead to the light of fulfillment that we have been created and blessed to live in as God's sons and daughters. We are blessed to mourn the evil and injustice we experience and are exposed to because we have the light, vision, and Spirit of God guiding us. Being meek does not mean we are pushovers but that we are empowered by the wonder and strength of God's Holy Spirit in all things. We hunger and thirst for righteousness

sustained by God's truth and justice. In a world that can be so harsh and merciless, we experience the freeing effects of God's mercy and in that process become vehicles of that mercy ("forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us"). To be pure or clean of heart means we are seeking not only what is good for us personally but for all whose lives we touch. In a society that embraces competition and entertains itself with countless games and sporting events, we rise above the desire to win to seek what will reconcile and make us one with each other and live in an atmosphere of pure peace. The final beatitude makes it clear that this will not be easy. How sorely the world and our society need human beings created and living in the image and likeness of God! We are chosen, invited and blessed, and everyday is another opportunity and challenge to be all we have been created to be.

Genesis 1:26-31:

"Then God said: Let us make human beings in our image, after our likeness. Let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, the tame animals, all the wild animals, and all the creatures that crawl on the earth. God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them and God said to them: Be fertile and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it. Have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and all the living things that crawl on the earth. God also said: See, I give you every seed-bearing plant on all the earth and every tree that has seed-bearing fruit on it to be your food; and to all the wild animals, all the birds of the air, and all the living creatures that crawl on the earth, I give all the green plants for food. And so it happened. God looked at everything he had made, and found it very good. Evening came, and morning followed—the sixth day."
