SJE HAPPENINGS

Quick to hear, Slow to speak, Slow to anger

JAMES

Dear Parish Family:

A few months ago I met a much wiser and older priest and shared about a challenging moment I was facing with administration and ministry. He listened with great compassion and then, truthfully, let me have it. It was just what I needed. I wrote him a note after we met thanking him for the "Spirit" slap I deserved and needed.

We have those moments in the spiritual life when God just shakes us up and wakes us up. Early this morning, I got another as I was working on my homily using today's first reading (Wednesday 2/16). It comes from the letter of St. James, a book in the Bible filled with a bunch of those wake up calls! He writes, "Know this, my dear brothers and sisters: everyone should be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger for anger does not accomplish the righteousness of God" (James 1:19-20). Perhaps those three steps might be worthy of our consideration as individuals and as a faith community in these davs.

Quick to Hear. I remember a teacher in elementary school saying, "That's why God gave you two ears and one mouth." She was right. I have written a great deal lately about the need for quiet in our spiritual lives. Without creating the room for silence it is very hard to discern what the Divine wants to speak to our hearts. Even our prayers sometimes can be so filled with noise. We need just to be! (In that spirit, see page 7 about taking some time for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament each week.) Would it be unfair to suggest that there is a likely correlation between how much time we take to the listen to the Lord and how much time we really take to LISTEN to one another? Isn't it true that we often know what our response will be before the other person has even finished speaking? When we listen, don't we settle sometimes just to listen to words instead of trying to listening with our hearts, with the compassion necessary for the other?

Slow to Speak. Did St. James know how we treat each other in the 21st century? :) How much better would we each be served by being quiet for a moment. As a social worker, I am often complimented and criticized by clients because I don't respond right away all the time. Generally, I'm not afraid of the silence. I overheard a new client say, "He doesn't say much and let's me just talk." Exactly. Linking to the first suggestion, would we better if we did not respond right away? I think of that with these phones and social media. Does every text message or post—particularly the ones that upset or hurt me—need an immediate response? Whenever I have done that it has generally been a disaster. Maybe the same for you? Taking a breath, giving some room for the Spirit to work, even if it means appearing a little hesitant, might be just what a situation needs.

Slow to Anger. I remember attending an afternoon of prayer for priests a few years ago. The priest who offered the homily, a noted spiritual director, said to those of gathered, "Brothers, you need to ask yourself what are you doing with you anger. And please notice that I didn't not ask you if you had any anger. I think we all know that answer." Naturally at the break, we had many angry responses to that comment but he was right. We all have a certain level of anger and frustration. (At times, it can motivate us in ways we never knew!) This is not who we are supposed to be. There is no place for the anger and fury that so many of us carry in this life, particularly in these days. Read the Gospel again for today. All of the situation Jesus addresses (anger, revenge, care for the poor, judgment) are not calls for the rage so many of us exhibit internally or externally. It is a call to love with the compassion, kindness and mercy the readings speak about today...from David to the psalmist to Jesus. It is our call too.

Looking for something to "do" this Lent? Turn to St. James for the wake up call from the Holy Spirit. Listen more, speak less, and pray to let go. The changes in you and me may be the spirit wake up call someone else needs. What a Lenten gift! Feetherd



PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space.

Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals throughout the remainder of the year. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.

A nice tradition has developed over the years at SJE. Members of the parish who had lost family members in the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one to assist with the costs related to the candles. THE LITTLE BLACK BOOK IS HERE!


This Lent, St. John's is once again offering everyone a little black book. They will be available next

THE WORD OF GOD



On the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Sunday of the Word of God, Pope Francis called us to a deeper appreciation of the Word of God—the Scriptures—in our daily lives. Each year, we try to incorporate a new emphasis on the Word of God. We have blessed our readers, instituted the Book of the Gospels and more. In 2022, we will begin an expanded bulletin page that will help us to focus on the

Scriptures, particularly how they relate to our Sunday and daily worship. Please make use of the resources on this page each week.

5. In this unity born of listening, pastors are primarily responsible for explaining sacred Scripture and helping everyone to understand it. Since it is the people's book, those called to be ministers of the word must feel an urgent need to make it accessible to their community.

The homily, in particular, has a distinctive function, for it possesses "a quasi-sacramental character" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 142). Helping people to enter more deeply into the word of God through simple and suitable language will allow priests themselves to discover the "beauty of the images used by the Lord to encourage the practice of the good" (ibid.). This is a pastoral opportunity that should not be wasted!

For many of our faithful, in fact, this is the only opportunity they have to grasp the beauty of God's word and to see it applied to their daily lives. Consequently, sufficient time must be devoted to the preparation of the homily. A commentary on the sacred readings cannot be improvised. Those of us who are preachers should not give long, pedantic homilies or wander off into unrelated topics. When we take time to pray and meditate on the sacred text, we can speak from the heart and thus reach the hearts of those who hear us, conveying what is essential and capable of bearing fruit. May we never tire of devoting time and prayer to Scripture, so that it may be received "not as a human word but as what it really is, the word of God" (1 Thess 2:13).

Catechists, too, in their ministry of helping people to grow in their faith, ought to feel an urgent need for personal renewal through familiarity with, and study of, the sacred Scriptures. This will help them foster in their hearers a true dialogue with the word of God.

Readings for Next Sunday—8th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Please look over these readings and consider these reflection questions before coming to Mass next Sunday.

First Reading + Sirach 27:4-7

- 1. Just as a tree is known by its fruits, Sirach says, so people are known by their conduct. How would you determine your vote? By what they say, or what they do? Or both?
- 2. The furnace shows what the potter molds, How does this relate to "tribulation is the test of the just"? Are you more likely to believe the words of people like Martin Luther King and Nelson Mandela, on the subject of anti-racism, over people who were not tested?

Second Reading + 1 Corinthians 15:54-58

- 1. Georges Bernanos says in <u>The Diary of a Country Priest</u>, "Grace is everywhere." How could that statement apply to the first sentences in this reading: "when this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality..."
- 2. Just as grace changes the corruptible, will it also change death? How? Why does St. Paul say death will lose its sting?

Gospel + <u>Luke 6:39-45</u>

- 1. "Brother, let me remove that splinter. ..." Before we undertake correcting others' problems, what does Jesus ask us to check out in ourselves?
- 2. Do you think these teachings of Jesus are a good start for Church leaders? "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice; blessed are the merciful." Could these help them learn to "see clearly" as leaders, discerning a right path?

SYNOD: Walking Together



Pope Francis is calling the Church to a time of synod—of discerning the Spirit in the Church in our times. This is an exciting time for the Church and one that we will each called to be part of in the months and years ahead. To prepare our hearts and minds for this, we will be printing information about what a synod is, the vision of a synod as well as information from our diocesan efforts when this becomes available. Let us pray

that we may each be open to the Holy Spirit!

Prayer for the Synod on Synodality

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.

This synodal approach is something our world now needs badly. Rather than seeking confrontation, declaring war, with each side hoping to defeat the other, we need processes that allow differences to be expressed, heard, and left to mature in such a way that we can walk together without needing to destroy anyone. This is hard work; it needs patience and commitment—above all to each other. Lasting peace is about creating and maintaining processes of mutual listening. We build a people not with the weapons of war but in the productive tension of walking together.
