# **LENTEN MISSION**

#### 33 Days to Greater Glory

We hope you are enjoying the beginnings of reading 33 Days to Greater

*Glory.* This week, we are going to begin reading Week One: Opening Characters (pp. 31-56). While there is no official rule, try not to go too far ahead and don't panic if you fall behind. Trust that God has you where you need to be. Use your Bible and pray with the Gospel of John as you read each day's reflection in the book.

We are providing a reflection question for each day this week. If it is helpful, please use it. If not, skip it. **Sunday, February 21, 2021**– A Prophet Like Moses (pp. 31-34)

Is there an image of Jesus you are drawn to that allows you to more powerfully see the face of God?

<u>Monday, February 22, 2021</u> – John the Baptist (pp. 34-37) What does humility mean to you?

Tuesday, February 23, 2021 – The First Disciples (pp. 37-40) As you read John 1:35-51, is there a particular disciple you are drawn to?

Wednesday, February 24, 2021 – The Jews (pp. 41-44) Pray with the questions on the bottom of page 42.

<u>Thursday, February 25, 2021</u> - Nicodemus (pp. 44-47) Re-read John 3:1-21. Nicodemus comes at night....does he leave enlightened?

<u>Friday, February 26, 2021</u> – Woman at the Well (pp. 47-51) What draws you into the character of the "woman at the well? What do you identify with/relate to?

<u>Saturday, February 27, 2021</u> – The Woman Caught in Adultery (pp. 51-54) Think about the gestures of Jesus. What does this reveal to you about humility?

## **LENT 2021**

## ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

#### **The Art and Environment Ministry** invites all SJE parishioners to join us on a very special **Lenten Journey.**



**LENT** is a season where we reflect on our sins and how they "mask" us from truly being close to God. During this Lenten journey, we would like to uncover our sins, be forgiven and "unmask" ourselves. Located on the table outside Our Lady's Chapel, you will find a frame and a basket with fabric strips. We invite you to take a strip of fabric (representing your mask of sin) and tie it onto the frame as you reflect on your relationship with God. We will begin this journey the first weekend in Lent (February 20/21) and end before Palm Sunday.

# PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space. Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.

A nice tradition has developed over the years at SJE. Members of the parish who had lost family members in the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one to assist with the costs related to the candles. If you and/or your family would like to do that, we would be most grateful and appreciative. You can send a donation to the Parish Office. Please note clearly that it is for the new Paschal Candles and list the name of who you wish to remember.

# LENTEN BAG CHALLENGE - BAGS STILL AVAILABLE!!

Our Parish Social Ministry needs your help this Lent! Make it a fast acceptable to the Lord by caring for the poor and vulnerable in our midst. Om Ash Wednesday, we asked you to take two purple bags. You keep one and use it for your own shopping experiences...and maybe encourage others to join you at SJE. We ask that you return the second bag at some point during Lent supporting our Street Ministry and Ernie's Place, SJE's Food Pantry Ministry. A list will be placed inside of each of bag. (Of course you can return both bags!)

When emptied, the returned bags will be used by our guests at the Street Ministry and at Ernie's Place - SJE's Food Pantry Ministry.

## "God, forever and ever..."

There is a slight change in our liturgical prayers that began on Ash Wednesday. The Congregation for the Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments called for a change in the Collects we use at Mass. The Collect, maybe more familiar to us as the Opening Prayer, set our prayer on its course as it takes place immediately before the Liturgy of the Word. The Congregations writes,

"In May of 2020 the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments wrote to the English-speaking Conferences of Bishops regarding the concluding doxology of the Collects in the Roman *Missal* (which also appear in other liturgical books).

Specifically, the Congregation pointed out that the current translation - which concludes '[...] in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever' - is incorrect. There is no mention of "one" in the Latin, and "Deus" in the Latin text refers to Christ. Therefore, the correct translation, which is already reflected in the Missal in other languages (including our own USCCB Misal Romano) is simply: '[...] in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.' The Cardinal Prefect has pointed out the importance of affirming the Christological truth amid the religious pluralism of today's world."

This is a small change that speaks to a deeper reality of our faith. Be patient as we – especially the priestpresiders – adjust to this change.

Peanut butter and Jelly are the easiest to make. Please keep in mind one loaf of bread makes 10 sandwiches. We will also accept cold cut sandwiches, we just ask that you label them.

If you need supplies, we will be leaving baggies and gloves with the Parish Office starting the Monday before Sandwich Sunday Please try to make sandwiches as close to Sunday as possible, as they will be delivered to Light House Mission in Bellport on Monday morning. We will also be accepting supply donations, such as, peanut butter, jelly, or bread. There is a quick instruction video on Facebook and Youtube. We miss you all and look forward to seeing you all soon.

# Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults Elected

This weekend, we celebrate the Rite of Election at St. John the Evangelist. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults tells us, "The celebration of the rite of election, which usually coincides with the opening of Lent, also marks the beginning of the period of final, more intense preparation for the sacraments of initiation, during which the elect will be encouraged to follow Christ with greater generosity" (118).

Most year, the catechumens and members of the parish travel to a central location to join with other catechumens from throughout the church and the bishop of the diocese. This year, in an effort to keep everyone as safe as possible, each parish will hold the Rite of Election and each pastor is delegated to be the presider at the Rite of Election.

# **KEEPING SAFE IN THESE DAYS!** LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

Since 2017, we have published updates regarding good health, particularly in the winter months. My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin. As we are approaching the winter season in a time of pandemic, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist and some things we have been encouraging for many years!

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Not feeling great, STAY HOME!</u> Please do not take any chances for your sake or anyone else's! Join us via social media or watch Mass on the Catholic Faith Network. The risks are too great for you and for others in these days. There is no obligation to attend Mass in this time; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.)
- <u>Entering the Church:</u> You must enter through the main fellowship doors with your mask on. NO MASK
   = NO ENTRANCE into the Church. Sanitize your hands, take a worship aid and enter the church. For
   Masses in the Auditorium, you may enter through the north or south entrances. Specific doors are marked
   for entrance and exit.
- <u>Seating:</u> Please sit as close to the front as possible. It works best for groups of one and two can sit closer to the front and/or fill the seats along the perimeter of the church. This allows us to make the maximum, safe use of our available seating. Please keep a safe distance from those on either side of you and/or your family.
- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins and immediately before distribution of Holy Communion. When Extraordinary Ministers go to their station, they place the vessel on the small table near that station and sanitize their hands before distributing Holy Communion.
- **<u>Communion from the Chalice</u>**: The distribution of the Precious Blood is suspended at this time.
- <u>Reception of Holy Communion</u>: Remember to bow as the person before you receives Holy Communion (this is not new). While you do this, please take down your mask. Please hold your hands out as flat as possible to receive Holy Communion. After placing the host in your mouth, put your mask back up and return to your seat.
- Greeting of Peace: The greeting of peace by shaking hands is suspended at this time.
- <u>Help!</u>: We are always looking for more volunteers to assist with the Cana Care Crew, particularly after Masses with the wipe down of the pews. If you and/or your family are willing to help, please see one of the volunteers in the orange shirts. We provide the gloves, t-shirt, towels and cleaning solution. You provide the arm strength and the positive spirit!
