A Message from the Coordinator of Family Ministry...

MISSION: IMPOSSIBLE

"I don't really have any enemies."

"I forgive others."

"I love my neighbor."

"I give to those in need."

"I don't judge others."

"I pray for those who have hurt me."

Maybe these responses are valid... maybe true to some extent. But the message Jesus gives us in today's gospel challenges us to go above and beyond... to go to the uncomfortable places with the people who annoy us, disagree with us, take advantage of us, even those who have judged us, condemned us, hurt us... and yes... even those who have hurt our loved ones. Jesus doesn't make a few mere suggestions about how we might want to live our lives, He gives directives "To you who hear..." So, perhaps the first question to ponder is:

"Do I hear?"

Jesus often went off by Himself to pray. Will I take the quiet time that I need to hear and reflect on His words in today's gospel? Will I listen intently with an open mind and an open heart, acknowledging that Jesus is speaking directly to me? Will I take the time to honestly reflect on my words and actions... as well as on my lack of words and actions? Will I ask Jesus how and when and where He wants me to respond? Our individual calls to holiness are about the choices we make. Today's readings up the ante.

How will I respond?

The Christian life can be difficult at times. It requires us to sacrifice, to give, to forgive and to love, again and again and again. In the first reading, David had the chance to get rid of the problematic Saul once and for all. But he chose not to "harm the Lord's anointed." I don't know about you, but sometimes I am so tired of trying. I am exhausted by doing the right thing, trying to be kind, holding my tongue and giving to others even when I feel as if I have nothing left to give. Truth be told, sometimes I even want to hold a grudge because it's easier than doing the work of forgiveness and reconciliation. But it's not easier. In the long run, when we seek the greatest goodness in others, ask God for His grace, forgive and pray for those who have hurt us, the love of God is released, and His love conquers all of our hurts and fears and prejudices and griefs. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are unleashed, and we are blessed with the fruit of life in the Spirit. For us... MISSION IMPOSSIBLE. For God... just another way to show His love for us and to help us to love others.

So, what next?

The season of Lent is less than two weeks away and calls us to sacrifice in clearly defined ways: pray more, give more, fast more. Somehow Lent gives us the motivation and the unity that helps us respond to today's readings. A challenge? YES! A reason for self-condemnation or discouragement? NO! Our responsorial psalm reminds us very clearly that our Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in kindness. He is forgiving and compassionate, pardoning our iniquities, healing us and providing the grace that we need to truly love one another. While the mission

may seem impossible, it is a challenge that we as Catholics should approach with hope and confidence, trusting that the God who called us to this high standard will provide all that we need to respond. We need but to trust Him, to follow His plan, to receive His grace and mercy, and depend on Him. While independence and self-sufficiency are applauded in the secular world, surrendering to and dependency upon our God is the true measure of real strength. Jesus meets us where we are and shows us where we need to go.

He will lead... we just need to follow.



ABSTINENCE & FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.




Moms on the Journey:

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

One of titles we use for the Sacrament of Penance is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. To be reconciled is to become one with those who we are at odds with, those who have offended us, or those we have offended. In the Gospel for today's Mass (Luke 6:27-38) we have these words from Jesus: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it To say the least, these words are certainly challenging. They go against our initial reaction to protect ourselves, strike back and get even. Yet, Jesus lived these words to His very last breath as He prayed on the cross for His persecutors, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:24)

Before we even think about being reconciled with those who have hurt us, we must first reconcile ourselves to the fact that we do not know everything and that our lives are far more than just being winners and losers. As we reflect on these words of Jesus they are clarifying and can only be accepted with humility, trust, and faith: "I am the way, the truth, and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6). How do enemies become friends? It is unbelievably challenging to take the first step, especially when there seems to be no hope of reconciling. Is it a waste of time? Jesus' death on the cross shows us that in the end we will only be at peace with God if we make the effort and try our best. Sometimes all we can seem to do is simply not to make matters worse or not widen the gap between those we are at odds with. That opens the door to light, even if it is only slightly ajar.

As much as we pray for forgiveness and the wisdom and courage to seek reconciliation, we must first truly trust Jesus. Before we approach the altar to receive Holy Communion at Mass we say, "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul will be healed." If we cannot find peace, hope, and inspiration from Jesus' love and mercy toward us personally, the light that illumines the path to peace and reconciliation will not open our minds and hearts and guide us.

A good way to find hope and light is to receive God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance. For most of us it is a Sacrament we do not take advantage of often enough. Yet as we humbly and hopefully look at ourselves and seek peace, this Sacrament is a pure gift. Jesus never says, "What kept you away" or "Where have you been" or "You did what". It is only the gift of God's mercy and forgiveness that reconciles us to Him and gives us the grace to seek reconciliation with one another.

I offer Psalm 51 for your prayerful reflection, a Psalm prayed in the Breviary on Friday mornings:



Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness. In your compassion blot out my offense. O wash me more and more from my guilt and cleanse me from my sin. My offenses truly I know them; my sin is always before me Against you, you alone, have I sinned; what is evil in your sight I have done. That you may be justified when you give sentence and be without reproach when you judge, O see, in guilt I was born, a sinner was I conceived. Indeed you love truth in the heart; then in the secret of my heart teach me wisdom. O purify me, then I shall be clean; O wash me, I shall be whiter than snow. Make me hear rejoicing and gladness, that the bones you have crushed may revive. From my sins turn away your face and blot out all my guilt. A pure heart create for me, O God, put a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, nor deprive me of your holy spirit. Give me again the joy of your help; with a spirit of fervor sustain me, that I may teach transgressors your ways and sinners may return to you. O rescue me, God, my helper, and my tongue shall ring out your goodness. O Lord, open my lips and my mouth shall declare your praise. For in sacrifice you take no delight, burnt offering from me you would refuse, my sacrifice, a contrite spirit, a humbled, contrite heart you will not spurn. In your goodness, show favor to Zion: rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. Then you will be pleased with lawful sacrifice, holocausts offered on your altar. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Father, he who knew no sin was made sin for us, to save us and restore us to your friendship. Look upon our contrite heart and afflicted spirit and heal our troubled conscience, so that in the joy and strength of the Holy Spirit we may proclaim your praise and glory before all the nations.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"Love your enemies" may be one of the most oft-quoted verses of Scripture. We tend to think of it as a moral principle to guide us in our dealings with people who rub us the wrong way. But do we ever consider what it tells us about God? After all, Jesus, who is God himself, speaks it. God tells us to love our enemies because God loves his "enemies" – that is, those who freely choose to oppose his plan of life and love. On the cross, Jesus forgave and prayed for the people who sought to kill him while they were crucifying him. But his mercy was not confined to that time and place alone; he died for each of us who, whenever we sin, refuse to love him. If we get this into our heads and our hearts – "God loves and forgives me" – we can begin to rest in his embrace like children confident in the unconditional love of their father's heart.

GO EVANGELIZE


PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

If, as a child, you learned a musical instrument for which regular recitals were the norm, you know how many hours of practice are required for a few short minutes of performance. You know, too, that if you are well prepared, a musical composition which appeared impossible months before comes easily and naturally on the day of the recital. For most of us, loving our enemies as Jesus commands us to do appears far beyond our reach – impossible, in fact. But this kind of heroic love is nevertheless God's call for us, and he will never deny us the grace we need to respond to his call. What's required on our part is a willingness to practice. If we practice loving in small things even when it's difficult – listening patiently to someone whose conversation bores us, for example, or taking on an extra chore without seeking recognition or thanks – we will be prepared for the day when God asks us to make an even greater act of love for his sake.

PRACTICE

This week, go out of your way to find opportunities to love even when it's difficult. Do your best to be conscious of your intentions, even in the moment, by asking God for the grace to love generously and by offering your act of love to him.

Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic




present moment. We're living the lessons which is comforting when we're in pain, we have a lot of laughs too. We're there for each other! The book will be provided,


