On our own...but never on our own...

### INDIVIDUAL PRAYER

#### Dear Parish Family:

The season of Lent is less than two weeks away. For some, this is not significant. For others, we are caught up in what we are going "to do" for Lent (give up something, some act of charity or something like that). For others, Lent is a busier time of the year than others. It sounds strange but we can be so caught up in doing that our relationship with God takes a back seat.

I am hoping this Lent, as a parish both individually and communally, we can increase our focus on prayer. This week, I am going to write about some individual invitations. Next week, we can focus more on some of the communal invitations.

I am always challenged by the writings of Sister Ruth Burrows, OCD. Whenever I read one of her books I am challenged and excited, disappointed and hopeful, all at the same time. The disappointment is usually in myself. She presents such ideas of what a spiritual and holy life should be. I am forced to confront how I come up short. Yet, she gives many paths and opportunities for one to consider. I am presently reading *Essence of Prayer*. In it she writes (3-4),

"We must remember that prayer takes place at the deepest level of the person and escapes our direct cognition; therefore we can make no judgment about it. It is God's holy domain and we may not usurp it. We have to trust it utterly to God."



I guess we have to begin sort of like the father in the ninth chapter of Mark's Gospel, "I believe, help my unbelief." (We will pray with this Gospel at Monday's daily Mass.) Trust utterly that this is God's work, God's domain. Start there.

This Lent, I think we can all pray a little more deeply. I am not speaking about you personally, but I am going to guess that every single one of us can pray more deeply as individuals. Remember, our prayer is never individually focused. It is in a context always of loving God and neighbor.

#### Here are some ideas:

- **Make use of Scripture**. Bishop Barres has published a letter for Lent. (We have not received it yet so it may not make this bulletin.) He focuses on *Lectio Divina*, a powerful practice of prayer using scripture. Read this letter. Take time with this process. Allow God to use his Word to transform you and me. You can use the readings of the day or perhaps start with a Bible passage you are already comfortable and familiar with and begin.
- The Little Black Book. This is a great little tool that uses Scripture and reflection. They will be available either this weekend or next. (Note: There is no fee for this book. If you can, please place a donation of your choosing in the Poor Box.)
- Quiet Time. Can I ask you to think about creating a solid time for prayer? For me and for many others, it's the early morning. People laugh at me when they get email at 5:30 a.m. I am up most days about an hour and a half earlier so I can try to make some time for quiet and prayer. It may not be the morning for you. But find a quiet time where you can just be. Again, take your time. Maybe it's not a holy hour of quiet. It might have to be a holy 15 minutes or even 5 minutes. It's OK. Start somewhere. Try to be consistent about it. (Please note: Even the Venerable Fulton Sheen acknowledged the need for coffee

before prayer! He states, "The average American is physically, biologically, psychologically and neurologically unable to do anything worthwhile before he has a cup of coffee. And that goes for prayer too. Even sisters in convents whose rules were written before electric percolators were developed would do well to update their procedures. **Let them have coffee before meditation**." Get that coffee timer set early or the K-cup machine warmed up!)



• **Find a place.** Time and place matter in our openness to God's domain. Where can you **be**? Where can God work best with you? Is it here at SJE? Did you know the Church and Chapel are open to 6:30/7:00 p.m. each night? Have you thought about taking some time in quiet prayer here—maybe in the Peace Garden, Seton Chapel, Our Lady's Chapel in the Church, the Church itself? Try to find a consistent place. Perhaps a "make a visit" before the Blessed Sacrament outside of our times of communal prayer? Pray the Rosary quietly before an image of the Blessed Mother? Maybe come and light a candle each day in the midst of the quiet at one the shrines?

For many, coming here every day may not be possible. So find the quiet place near you. It might be a place that is only quiet certain times of the day....then find that time and place.

• **Finding the Expert.** There are a few spiritual writers I follow—Sister Burrows is one of them. When I learn they have written or published something, I buy it and then usually about 10 other copies for others I care about. I admit I am often looking for a new way, some idea, some method that might help me get prayer right. The truth? Often I am wasting my time. The one expert you and I can come to know better this Lent is the only one we need—**Jesus Christ**. Talk to him. Remember what you learned about him. Think about what you know about him. Ask him to help you. I use a book called *Sacred Reading* to help me. If you think it might help you, look into it. This book and these other things—good methods, spiritual writers, etc.—can help. Nothing replaces our relationship with Jesus Christ. Nothing.

Sister Ruth Burrows writes later in the same work, "On our side prayer is simply being there: open, exposed, inviting God to do all God wants. Prayer is not our activity, our getting in touch with God, our coming to grips with or making ourselves desirable to God. We can do none of these things, nor do we need to, for God is there ready to do everything for us, loving us unconditionally. We all know this in theory; but how many really know it in terms of practical living" (28)?

I hope this Lent finds each one of us more open to God's domain and God's working with us so he can better work through us knowing that is ready to do everything for us.

Please pray for me.

#### LITURGY OF THE HOURS

O God, come to our assistance...

The purpose of the liturgy of the hours is to sanctify the day and the whole range of human activity. Therefore its structure has been revised in such a way as to make each hour once more correspond as nearly as possible to natural time and to take account of the circumstances of life today. Hence, "that the day may be truly sanctified and the hours themselves recited with spiritual advantage, it is best that each of them be prayed at a time most closely corresponding to the true time of each canonical hour."

-From the General Instruction of the Liturgy of the Hours, 11

Beginning this Lent, we will begin the pray the Liturgy of the Hours more frequently at SJE. You may have noticed this in some of our literature about Seton Chapel. We pray the Liturgy of the Hours to unite our prayer with the Church that seeks God at all times.

There is a certain ritual to the Liturgy of the Hours that involves our posture (sitting and standing), our voices (in praying the psalms), our listening (to the Word of God).

Some of us pray the Liturgy of the Hours regularly. This is wonderful. I hope you can help us in establishing this rhythm of prayer at SJE.

We will pray the Liturgy of the Hours in the Church on Saturday at approximately 6:15 p.m. and on Sunday at approximately 6:45 p.m. in Our Lady's Chapel. Booklets will be provided for you.

During the week, we will pray the Liturgy of the Hours in Seton Chapel beginning and ending our times of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament:

Monday—3 p.m.—Daytime Prayer

Monday—8:45 p.m.—Night Prayer Thursday—1 p.m.—Daytime Prayer

Thursday—4:45 p.m.—Evening Prayer

Friday—8 a.m.—Morning Prayer


Friday—11:30 a.m.—Daytime Prayer

For these times, we will use books of the Liturgy of the Hours that will be provided for you. (NOTE: It will take us each a little time to get used to these—so always have patience!!!!)

You do not need to come to each of these times of prayer—come when you can!

#### FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTIONS

"Do not let the past disturb you, just leave everything in the Sacred Heart and begin again with joy." ~ Saint Teresa of Calcutta

The tradition of First Friday is part of the larger devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in the Catholic Church. While the context for the start of First Friday devotions is different than our times today (this originated in the 1600s and 1700s), I think there is a value to our focus, particularly on First Fridays.

#### On Friday, March 1, 2019,

- We will pray Prayers and the Litany to the Sacred Heart after the 7:00 a.m. and 12 Noon Masses and at 6:30 p.m.
- The East End Holy Hour will be held.
- The opportunity to receive the sacrament of Reconciliation will continue to be offered after the 7 a.m. and 12 Noon Masses and around the East End Holy Hour.

Let's pray that for those who are able and so desire, this devotion may inspire a deeper conversion to the ways of the Lord. Related to this, beginning in Lent, we will offer additional time for Eucharistic Exposition in Seton Chapel from 8 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. (taking place in between our two daily Masses). This will not be limited to First Friday but will take place on all Fridays beginning on Friday, March 8, 2019.

#### **Preparing for Palm Sunday**

We are all familiar with the practice of receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday, which this year is March 6, 2019. The ashes are a sign of the public penance to which we are all called during the Lenten season. As



we promise to repent and believe in the Gospel, the ashes brand us with the sign of the cross — a sign of our commitment to the journey of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, a journey which ends with the new life of baptism and baptismal renewal during the Easter season. Penitential acts are undertaken as a community, as together we journey to the cross and resurrection. What you may not know is where the ashes come from. Very simply, the ashes used on Ash Wednesday are the ashes from palms saved from Palm Sunday the previous year, which have been burned. This year we once again invite you to share in our communal celebration of Ash Wednesday in a special way. We ask you to bring old palms from your home and deposit them in the baskets which will be available. These palms will then be burned at our Mardi Gras celebration on March 3rd and used as ashes on Ash Wednesday, March 6th. Please join us!

# CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Beginning Sunday, March 10, 2019 at the 9 a.m. Mass Open House—Sunday, March 3, 2019 after the 9 a.m. Mass St. John's new program CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD will begin Sunday March 10<sup>th</sup> at the 9:00am Mass. The program is structured to help children hear

#### Here's how it works:

• At the 9:00am mass, after the Collect (opening prayer of the Mass), children in Kindergarten – 5<sup>th</sup> Grade are invited to come forward and sent forth so they can hear God's Word in a special way. (Children do NOT have to participate. That's up to their parents and family members. We hope everyone will.)


God's message in a way that is more understandable for them.



- At the Children's Liturgy of the Word, we will use the Lectionary for Mass with Children. These are the same readings everyone else is hearing but in a slightly different translation that is easier for them to understand. A special homily is also given—by a homilist—to better help them understand the readings.
- The children will then return back to Mass with our Shepherds (guides) to participate in the Liturgy of the Eucharist with their family.

The purpose is not to offer a babysitting service or to isolate the children. Rather, it is a chance for them to participate in Sunday's readings on their level with our *dedicated and trained* volunteers. The program will run every Sunday until Mid-June. Don't worry we will be back in September!

The Children's Liturgy of the Word is a great opportunity to encourage young children to participate more fully in Mass and can help open up conversation between parents and children on what they heard in the readings. Let's help them know how much Jesus loves them!

#### LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin that runs during the winter months. With his permission, I have reprinted it here. As we are in the midst of the winter season, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist.

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are especially encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins. If Communion ministers need to clean their hands during Mass, it must be done discreetly. The best way for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to clean their hands during Mass is to use a sanitizing liquid in the pew before coming into the sanctuary (sanitizing liquids have no place on the altar or among the Communion vessels and other sacred items on the credence table).
- **Communion from the Chalice:** The faithful should refrain from drinking from the chalice when one has a cold or is fearful of being infected.
- Receiving on the Tongue: Faithful who normally receive Holy Communion on the tongue should refrain from receiving on the tongue and instead receive in the hand when one has a cold or is otherwise contagious. Do not spread your saliva to the hand of the Communion minister if you are sick; receive Communion in the hand instead.
- <u>Greeting of Peace:</u> Use your own discretion and best judgment when invited to exchange the greeting of peace during the liturgy; limit physical contact with others if necessary. If a handshake is not advisable, a simple bow of the head is acceptable. Do not be insulted if someone prefers to avoid shaking your hand.
- <u>Mass Attendance</u>: MOST IMPORTANTLY, IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE DO NOT COME TO MASS! There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are sick; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.) Personal prayer and reflection on the Sunday Scripture readings is encouraged; many people also enjoy viewing the Mass on television.
