Duar Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

In our Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent. Saint Matthew tells us that before Jesus began His public ministry. He was "led by the Spirit into the desert" (Mi. 4.7), where He prayed, fasted, and gave Himself over to a fife of Gospel poverty. Lent is the sacred time in which, following the example of Jesus, we are led by the same Holy Spirit into the solitude of the desert to deepen our relationship with the Father and purify our hearts to become like the Son. The Spirit that draws each of us into this period of preparation does so through the practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These three pillars of Lenten observance call us away from the selfishness of sin and lead us to a deeply personal encounter with Jesus Christ.

Recognizing that many have never experienced this personal relationship with Jesus, the Holy Spirit has led our local Church to embark on a period of Eucharistic Revival—a movement aimed at leading many to encounter Jesus by restoring understanding and devotion to the great mystery of the Eucharist. Following the Spirit's desire to rekindle Eucharistic amazement in our hearts, let us reflect on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as practices deeply moted in devotion to the Body and Blood of Jesus.

The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church, the "source and summit of the Christian life" (CCC 1321). Lenten prayer focused on the Eucharist calls us to rediscover the Catholic practice of praying the Mass by offering our intentions, work, hardships, and family life as "spiritual sacrifices" united to the priest's offering of the Lord's Body (Luman Gentium, 34). In this way the great prayer of the Church becomes the great prayer of our lives; the summit to which all our daily sacrifices are directed and the source from which graces flow into everyday life.

Prayerfully receiving the Eucharist not only requires bodily fasting from food but also spiritual fasting from worldly attachments that keep us from communion with God. At prayer in the desert, Christ rejects the temptations of Satan by reciting a scripture verse from Deuteronomy 8:3, "One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." The Lord recognizes that bodily fasting becomes a prayer only when it moves us to cling to God's Word. This Lem may we take time to prepare for the Sunday Eucharist not only by fasting, but also by meditating on the weekly scriptures.

In the second century, Saint Justin Martyr wrote one of the earliest accounts of the celebration of the Sunday Eucharist, He recounts that after the breaking of the bread, the early Christians would be moved to give alms and "take care of all who are in need" (First Apulogy, 67). The Church has always recognized an inseparable bond between the sacrifice of the Mass and the sacrifice of almsgiving. Saint John Chrysostom even understood almsgiving as a Eucharistic action. He described the poor person as an "altar" where one could encounter the Body of Christ and offer everywhere a daily sacrifice (Homily 20 on Second Corinthians). As we remember the sacrifice of Christ at each Sunday Eucharist, may we always remember the poor.

Christ entered the desert for 40 days to prepare for the mission ahead of Him. Following the Lord's example, we enter the Lenten desert of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving with the goal of becoming Eucharistic missionaries. The Holy Spirit is leading each of us to a personal encounter with the Lord and calling us to pray and fast for the conversion of many hearts during this grace-filled moment of Eucharistic Revival.

Let us follow the Spirit's guidance with open hearts ready to receive the Lord; and may the heart of Jesus, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, be praised, adored, and loved with grateful affection, at every moment, in all the tabernacles of the world, even to the end of time.



ABSTINENCE & FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.



Did you know...

That our parish was served for over thirty years by 'Sister Ann'. Not one, but two.

Our first 'Sister Ann', was Sister Ann Kathleen Bolton.



Sister Ann Kathleen, devoted 72 vears of her life faithfully as member of the Dominican Sisters of Amityville. She received her Dominican habit on August 7, 1948. It was not until 1984 that Sr. Ann Kathleen arrived here at St. John's, and began teaching at our parochial school. Her stay was interrupted for an

assignment in North Carolina at a medical facility. She returned to our parish intending to go into hos-

pital work but there were no open positions. Our Pastor at the time. Fr. McDonald, had another idea: she could start an Outreach Program in the parish. Sr Kathleen started Ann the program in 1992 and loved the ministry, especially as it related to the seniors; in turn people loved her. An offshoot of her efforts was the Thrift Shop, that



still thrives today. In 2009 Sister realized it was time to retire and moved to the convent at St. John the Baptist in West Islip. Failing health necessitated another move in 2011. Sr. Ann Kathleen Bolton passed in February of 2019. Her legacy to us is very much alive and well today.


Our second 'Sister Ann', was Sister Ann Berendes. Sister Ann is member of the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Around 1985 Sister Ann was living and working in Palm Coast, Florida as a Bereavement Facilitator. She had been there for seven years at that point. One day, with little notice she was advised that her contract would not be renewed: the parish could no longer afford her services. Like any good networker,



be an opportunity becoming available in Center Moriches, because a Sister there would be retiring. St. John's Pastor at the time, Fr. Joe Coschignano was made aware of Sister Ann's availability, invited her in for an interview, and subsequently hired her on the spot. Fr. Joe asked that she start as soon as practical so that Sr. Ann Kathleen would provide the required familiarity with the growing Outreach Program. Sr. Ann Berendes served the pastorships of Fr. Joe, Fr. Walter Kedjierski and Fr. John Sureau, for a total of 13 years. Like Sr. Ann Kathleen, Sr. Ann worked closely with the Seniors in the parish. However, in Sr. Ann's opinion, she felt her most successful endeavor was with the Bereavement Group. Additionally, Sr. Ann was very active in the Extraordinary Ministry For The Homebound. Like Sr. Ann Kathleen, Sr. Ann also spoke of her time spent in the Thrift Shop where, in her words "We prayed, laughed, planned celebrations, and just enjoyed being together." Sr. Ann retired from parish ministry in

June of 2022, and began a new ministry at the motherhouse of the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Scranton, Pa.
