Splinter Clues

Dear Parish Family:

I'm not sure if you would remember but a number of years ago we asked parishioners to bring in pieces of wood from their homes to help create a cross. The cross hung in the Auditorium throughout Lent. When we returned to the Church after the restoration, we hung this cross in the eastern hallway outside of the Sacristy. It's a good reminder for this priest whenever he enters the sacristy.

One of the things that has happened as this cross hangs near the door is that some of the wood on the cross has dried out a bit. It's a little rougher than it used to be. A product of this is that the wood is a little more brittle and it is much easier to pick up a splinter or two. I can tell you this from personal experience as I had to re-center it after a strong wind. I think I may have picked up two splinters from the experience. It wasn't all that painful. It was more annoying as I tried to pull out these pieces of small wood that had gotten into my skin. Even after I got those pieces of wood out, a small hole remained for a bit. It bothered me for the rest of the day.

The image of a splinter is used by Jesus in today's Gospel. He uses this as a reminder to keep the focus on ourselves. We often like to be "tweezers" for other people, right? "I see what you are up to!" "I know what is wrong with you." "I know why this is not a good path for you." "I will show you and then I will" pull it out for you. It's not that Jesus is saying it is wrong to express concern to another, even to offer charitable correction. I think it is that we become obsessed with the weaknesses of another that they distract us or bother us from what can and should be focused upon.

How can these "splinters" of others negatively impact us? We stop looking for the conversion needed within. We stop asking the Lord for help in our work of healing and reconciliation. We can make the splinter of another so all-consuming that we forget what so clearly needs work within you and me.

There's a link here that I find I struggle with in my life. Maybe the same is true for you? I find that there is a strong correlation between my passion for another's splinter and my own wooden beam. They are actually the same thing. What I am so quick to judge, condemn, ridicule in another is often what I know is wrong in me. This is not always the case, admittedly. It is probably more common than you might initially think, though. The truth is that it's much easier for me to tell you what you need to change than to have to face the change I know I am avoiding. It is easier for me to outside than to look within.

We sometimes convince ourselves that we don't have that restorative work to do in our own hearts. "I'm good" or "I'm not in the same place as that person..." These are distractions. Not sure where to look within for that beam? Start by considering what splinters you are consumed by in the lives of others. There may be a connection there that we're called to examine.

Jesus calls us out about this directly today and it's just in time. This Wednesday we begin the season of Lent. Here the church calls us clearly to do the hard work of looking within, of calling out the hypocrisy within each of us, and of living out our identity as the beloved of God. Is this work reserved to one liturgical season? Of course not. Is it easy? No way. It's the work of a life time and one that we cannot risk becoming distracted due to the actions or lack of actions of another.

At the end of that day when I was putting a band-aid on my hand, I remembered that splinter came about because of the cross. It hurt. It left a mark. Ultimately it would heal. This should offer us some hope as we try to examine some of the areas in need of healing in our own lives in these Lenten days. St. Paul reminds us, "But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:57). The cross brings about this victory.

Please, if you can, say a prayer for me.

PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space.

Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals throughout the remainder of the year. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.

A nice tradition has developed over the years at SJE. Members of the parish who had lost family members in the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one to assist with the costs related to the candles. If you and/or your family would like to do that, we would be most grateful and appreciative. You can send a donation to the Parish Office. Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time + February 27, 2022

The Word of God



On the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Sunday of the Word of God, Pope Francis called us to a deeper appreciation of the Word of God—the Scriptures—in our daily lives. Each year, we try to incorporate a new emphasis on the Word of God. We have blessed our readers, instituted the Book of the Gospels and more. In 2022, we will begin an expanded bulletin page that will help us to focus on the

Scriptures, particularly how they relate to our Sunday and daily worship.

Each week, we publish another excerpt from Aperuit Illis, Instituting the Sunday of the Word of God. This apostolic letter of Pope Francis provides an overview and encouragement of our use f Sacred Scripture. Please take time each week to read and to pray with teachings.

Before encountering his disciples, gathered behind closed doors, and opening their minds to the understanding of the Scriptures (cf. Lk 24:44-45), the risen Lord appeared to two of them on the road to Emmaus from Jerusalem (cf. Lk 24:13-35). Saint Luke's account notes that this happened on the very day of his resurrection, a Sunday. The two disciples were discussing the recent events concerning Jesus' passion and death. Their journey was marked by sorrow and disappointment at his tragic death. They had hoped that he would be the Messiah who would set them free, but they found themselves instead confronted with the scandal of the cross. The risen Lord himself gently draws near and walks with them, yet they do not recognize him (cf. v. 16). Along the way, he questions them, and, seeing that they have not grasped the meaning of his passion and death, he exclaims: "O foolish men, and slow of heart" (v. 25). Then, "beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the Scriptures" (v.27).

Christ is the first exegete! Not only did the Old Testament foretell what he would accomplish, but he himself wished to be faithful to its words, in order to make manifest the one history of salvation whose fulfilment is found in Christ.

• "The Word is near you..." Particularly consider this page in the bulletin, how is the Word of God near you? Can it be closer? How?

Gospel + Luke 4:1-13

- What images develop in your own imagination as you pray with this story? What does the desert look like? What are the encounters between Jesus and the devil like?
- How can your response to temptation be even more Christ-like?
