A Message from Angela Werner...

A Reflection on the Gospel: Luke 2:22-40

"The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him."

In some particular way, God presents Himself to each of us. In the same way that Simeon and Anna recognized the Messiah, the soul in each of us has the ability to recognize God. That is why we are considered temples of the Holy Spirit. And the best way that we can present ourselves to the Lord is as sinners, in need of salvation.

No event in Simeon's earthly life could possibly have been more sublime than the moment he saw God with his own eyes. And Anna spent years spiritually preparing herself for that same moment. When we choose to see God in others, and allow others to see God in us, we are not only getting a glimpse of the love God has for us, but we are also preparing

for that infinite love that awaits us when we ourselves come face to face with the Savior of the World.

Simeon said to Mary, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel." Each fall on the way to Calvary, and each drop of blood that fell from the Cross was a sacrifice that Jesus made for a fallen mankind, so that we might all have a chance to rise to eternal happiness with Him in Heaven. Simeon understood that true joy is found not in any earthly gift, but in the One heavenly Sacrifice. Simeon also said to Mary, "And you yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." He knew the pain that Mary's immaculate heart would endure at the foot of the Cross, while witnessing her Son being crucified, and while witnessing a soldier thrust a sword into Jesus' side. However, this would be a 'single edge' sword, because with the Sacrifice...came the redemption.

A mother's heart is happy when her child is happy, and suffers when her child suffers, because their hearts are entwined. For the child, a mother's love is a sanctuary, but for the mother, it is a garden of joys...and sorrows. That's the deal.

Our Blessed Mother Mary spent years of her early life in the temple, while Anna spent years of her later life in the temple, for with the Church comes comfort, wisdom, and strength. When Jesus was being presented

> there according to Jewish law, Anna saw a baby, but she also realized that the 'King of Kings' was in His house.

> The Presentation of the Lord is not only a Feast in the Church, but it is also one of the Joyful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary. Although these mysteries celebrate the joyful accounts in the life of the Holy Family, they also relate to those five joyful accounts in our own human families. We think first of the

joy of a wife hoping to become a mother, learning that she is pregnant (represented by the Annunciation). Next, there is the joy that comes from sharing that news with her loved ones (represented by the Visitation). Then comes the joy of meeting that baby on the day of the little one's birth (represented by the Nativity). Then there is the act of consecrating that child to God, which we celebrate today (the Presentation). Finally, there comes the joy of finding that your child has the individual desire to go to church, without any prompting (represented by the Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple). It is then that parents realize that their child is now creating his or her own path to Heaven.

Could there be any greater joy on Earth for a parent than that?

- ⇒ Medical care referrals
- ⇒ Male advocates available to speak with fathers
- ⇒ Material aid including car seats, cribs, clothing, diapers, and many other baby needs

We are asking that you pick up a baby bottle next weekend and fill it with your donations, and return it the weekend of February 22 & 23. Please make checks payable to the Life Center of Long Island.

More importantly, we are asking you to recite the prayer attached to the baby bottle. Prayer brings about something very powerful at the Life Center... a change of a mother's heart! We believe these prayers lead abortion-minded women to reach out to the Life Center in the beginning of their pregnancy.

A Message from Msgr. Walden...


There is a great difference between being entertained and being enriched. Unless and until we find the true source of enrichment, we will always have the feeling that something is missing and that there is more to our lives than we are experiencing in the present moment. We have our routines with work, meals, appointments, and the people we live with and encounter everyday. To be physically healthy, we need a good diet of food, exercise, and a sense of purpose and joy. Each day is a gift to be nourished and renewed. What and who nourishes and renews us? Ultimately, we are renewed when we are loved and love in return. As much as we do things for people and with people, we are truly enriched and are sources of enrichment by our presence to and with one another.

In the Gospel for today's Mass, we see the ultimate joy we all hunger for expressed by Simeon, who is in the temple when Mary and Joseph bring the infant Jesus to the temple for the presentation ritual. Simeon joyfully took into his child **Jesus** arms exclaimed: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your my eyes for have salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your Israel." How blessed it was for him to hold God Himself in his arms in the child Iesus.

That is an experience we all deep down hunger for: God giving Himself to us out of pure, unconditional love. He did not come to be pampered and cooed, but to give Himself to us with a depth of love that is a pure gift. How do we ever get to the point of Simeon and say to God, "Thank you. In you I have all I could ever want and need."?

It is only through constant contact with an open and faithful heart that this can become a reality for us. Daily prayer and Sunday Mass are key. Jesus is in the temple of our parish

church and readily listens and responds to us through our daily prayers, wherever we may be. One



of the inspiring points about prayer is from a book I use every morning during my prayer time entitled "Alter Christus, St. Paul Speaks to Priests". Last week, this simple point by Karl Rahner, S.J. was renewing and refreshing for me: "So often I consider my prayer as just a job I have to do, a duty to be performed. I "get it out of the way" and then relax, glad to have it behind me. When I'm at prayer, I'm at my "duty", instead of being with you." There are people we constantly text, e-mail, call. They are not a duty, but a source of joy, enrichment, and love. Would that every prayer and Mass experience be such for us. In that experience, Jesus is not changed into me, I am changed into Him.

I offer this passage from Isaiah 26:1-4, 7-9, 12 for your prayerful reflection:

A strong city have we; he sets up walls and ramparts to protect us.

Open up the gates to let in a nation that is just, one that keeps faith.

A nation of firm purpose you keep in peace; in peace, for its trust in you.

Trust in the Lord forever!

For the Lord is an eternal Rock.

The way of the just is smooth; the path of the just you make level. Yes, for your way and your judgments, O Lord, we look to you; Your name and your title are the desire of our souls.

My soul yearns for you in the night, yes, my spirit within me keeps vigil for you; When your judgment dawns upon the earth, the world's inhabitants learn justice.

O Lord, you mete out peace to us, for it is you who have accomplished all we have done.






GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Mary and Joseph bring their 40-day-old infant Jesus to the temple in order to fulfill the Mosaic law. There, they are met by Simeon and Anna, the faithful prophets who have spent their lives waiting for the coming of the King of Glory. These many years of waiting were like the "refiner's fire" which the prophet Malachi describes in the first reading. Refined like gold by prayer and fasting, Simeon and Anna are prepared to meet their Lord. And in this moment, the Old and New Testaments meet and the fulfillment of the Old is foreseen. Imagine the splendor of the moment when they finally laid their eyes on this king of light and glory – the culmination of a lifetime of hope, prayer, and preparation. Overcome with peace and joy at seeing his Lord, Simeon declares, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace," for he had seen the glory of God.

GO EVANGELIZE


PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Have you ever marveled at the beauty of a shiny, gold ring? Gold has long been regarded as one of earth's greatest treasures, yet the gold we admire today doesn't emerge in its pure, radiant form. To produce such beauty, gold must first undergo a process of intense refinement. A crude material is exposed to extreme heat to be melted and purified – until something of profound value emerges. Like gold, we, too, must be forged in fire to be made pure and holy. This is one way we can understand the prophet Malachi's words. The "fires" we experience in our lives are not without purpose – God is purifying us so that one day we may live with him in eternity. He isn't afraid of our "crude material"; rather, he gazes upon us with such intense love that our own beauty is revealed. As we undergo personal purification, let us stand in holy confidence like Simeon and Anna, witnessing to the truth that it is through the refiner's fire that we are brought to glory.

REFLECT

We can become discouraged, feeling that our prayers are unanswered or that a life devoted to Christ is too difficult. When these moments arise, consider the prophets Simeon and Anna, who gave their lives in quiet devotion, trusting in God's promises. Pray Simeon's canticle, meditating on the glorious gift we have been given in our salvation, and the promise that even in the darkest of days a bright and shining light awaits us.


present moment. We're living the lessons which is comforting when we're in pain, we have a lot of laughs too. We're there for each other! The book will be provided,


PASTORAL INTERVENTION TEAM
