FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

From Feet to Hands....

More Hands Needed

Dear Parish Family:

This week, I'll speak at all of the Masses about two areas where we are in need of your help and assistance. To be honest, I'm uncomfortable about the first topic because it is a bit of risk to talk about, particularly with all that we are journeying through as a parish family. I'm uncomfortable because we have been asked to do a lot as a parish over the past months and it seems almost unreasonable to ask more. I know this.

Yet, you and I know that our work as the parish of St. John the Evangelist is never, can never, should never be about us as individuals, families or even a parish. It must always be about building up the larger Church here in the Diocese of Rockville Centre and throughout the world.

It's in that spirit that I announce that the work for the 2018 Catholic Ministries Appeal is beginning this weekend in parishes throughout the diocese. The theme this year is "Hands of Mercy" aware of the many ways the Church on Long Island is called to bring the mercy of God through formation programs (we can testify to this with Paul Clores and Fr. Michael in our midst), the work of Catholic Charities and so many other works of the larger church. This involves administration of the diocese and the numerous offices and works of the diocesan church.

Last year, we made our goal in about a month and a half. This year, I know it may be harder. After all, we have together supported the Summer Appeal and recently nearly 1,000 individuals, families and corporations have supported the Fund a Foot campaign. How can I come to you again?

I do so because each one of us knows our responsibility to support and strengthen the larger church on Long Island under the leadership of Bishop Barres. We know of his great support for us in prayer—after the destruction of the church building and at Thanksgiving, specifically, and in many other ways generally. We are linked with and support the larger church when things are going exceptionally well within our local parish and when things are challenging as they are in these days here at SJE.

As a parish we have a set goal of \$100,600. This is set by the diocesan office of (I wrote in November 2017 to have the goal reduced and am advancement. awaiting a response). Even if our official goal is reduced I hope that we can still reach it. Here's why...it's helps us! Last year we earned nearly \$30,000 for St. John the Evangelist from the Catholic Ministries Appeal. This was a huge help to us in many, many ways! I would like us to hit (and exceed) goal if possible this year again.


Can I make a one request? We are really good with **feet** here! Did you know that because of the nearly 1,000 contributors to the Fund a Foot Restoration campaign as well as others who made donations to the work of the Church, we raised just under \$200,000 (and monies are still coming in).

I am hoping we can be good with our **hands** in this "Hands of Mercy" campaign. Last year, approximately 350 parishioners or families supported the Catholic Ministries Appeal. This year, I would like to see if we can increase this to 400 or even 450 individuals and families! So if you have never participated in the Catholic Ministries Appeal would you be able to help us out this year? In a real way, become a "hand of

mercy", support the larger church on Long Island and help our own parish in the midst of what has been an overwhelming year!

Here's my second hope! I would like us to be finished with the appeal (i.e. reaching our goal) as quickly as possible. We have so many other things to work and focus on—see the pages of this bulletin for a start- that I want our focus on those things. So can I ask you to get your "hands moving" and become a hand of mercy via check, online donation, envelopes, whatever works to help us reach our goal and bring the CMA to conclusion?

Thank you for reading this letter and for listening today at Masses. I'm grateful for your understanding and openness. You make a tough job and talk a lot easier.



P.S. Now what's that second things with eyes and mind? You'll find out at Masses this weekend!

Over the next few weeks, please bring last year's palms and place them in the baskets by the doors of the Church.




Art and Environment **GETTING READY FOR LENT**

LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin that runs during the winter months. With his permission, I have reprinted it here. As we are in the midst of the winter season, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist.

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are especially encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins. If Communion ministers need to clean their hands during Mass, it must be done discreetly. The best way for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to clean their hands during Mass is to use a sanitizing liquid in the pew before coming into the sanctuary (sanitizing liquids have no place on the altar or among the Communion vessels and other sacred items on the credence table).
- Communion from the Chalice: The faithful should refrain from drinking from the chalice when one has a cold or is fearful of being infected.
- Receiving on the Tongue: Faithful who normally receive Holy Communion on the tongue should refrain from receiving on the tongue and instead receive in the hand when one has a cold or is otherwise contagious. Do not spread your saliva to the hand of the Communion minister if you are sick; receive Communion in the hand instead.
- <u>Greeting of Peace:</u> Use your own discretion and best judgment when invited to exchange the greeting of peace during the liturgy; limit physical contact with others if necessary. If a handshake is not advisable, a simple bow of the head is acceptable. Do not be insulted if someone prefers to avoid shaking your hand.
- Mass Attendance: MOST IMPORTANTLY, IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE DO NOT COME TO MASS! There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are sick; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.) Personal prayer and reflection on the Sunday Scripture readings is encouraged; many people also enjoy viewing the Mass on television.

PRAYER AND WORSHIP

As mentioned we'll be publishing excerpts from Pope Francis' recent audiences on the Mass. Each week we will publish another excerpt. Please take time to read them each week and perhaps share them with someone you know.

Now let us try asking ourselves a few simple questions. For example, why do we make the sign of the Cross and perform the Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass? And here I would like to add another side note. Have you seen how children make the sign of the Cross? You do not know what they are doing, whether it is the sign of the Cross or an outline. They do this [gesturing]. Children must be taught how to make the sign of the Cross



properly. This is how the Mass begins; this is how life begins; this is how the day begins. This means that we are redeemed by the Lord's Cross. Watch the children and teach them how to make the sign of the Cross properly. And those Readings, during Mass, why are they there? Why are there three Readings on Sunday and two on the other days? Why are they read? What do the Readings at Mass mean? Why are they read and what is their purpose? Or, why does the priest presiding at the celebration say at a certain point: "Lift up our hearts"? He does not say: "Lift up your cell phones to take a photo!". No, that's bad! I tell you, it makes me sad when I am celebrating here in Saint Peter's Square or in the Basilica to see many cell phones lifted up, not only by the faithful but also by some priests and even bishops! But please! Mass is not a spectacle: it is going to encounter the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord. This is why the priest says: "Lift up our hearts". What does this mean? Remember: no cell phones.

It is really important to return to the basics, to rediscover what is essential, through what we touch and see in the celebration of the Sacraments. The question of the Apostle Saint Thomas (cf. Jn 20:25), seeking to see and touch the nail wounds in Jesus' body, and the desire to be able in some way to "touch" God in order to believe in him. What Saint Thomas asks of the Lord is what we all need: to see him, to touch him so that we may be able to know him. The Sacraments meet this human need. The Sacraments, the Eucharistic celebration in a particular way, are signs of God's love, the privileged ways for us to encounter him.

Thus, through these catecheses that we are beginning today, I would like to rediscover with you the beauty that is hidden in the Eucharistic celebration and that, once revealed, gives full meaning to each person's life. May Our Lady accompany us on this new stretch of road. Thank you.


RESTORE, REPAIR, REBUILD

At St. John's we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation every day. During the week, we celebrate the sacrament after the 7 a.m. and 12 Noon Masses. Generally, the priests will be in the IHM Meeting Room or the Chapel area of the Convent. He will wait or be around for 10 minutes after the last person has come.

On Saturday and Sunday evenings, confession are heard in the Youth Ministry Office (near the Main Entrance of the Auditorium) or in the back of the Auditorium itself.

With all of our movements in these weeks, we don't want to lose our commitment to and celebration of the sacrament of Reconciliation. (Of course, you can - and should - approach one of our parish priests whenever you want to celebrate the sacrament.)
