A Reflection from the Director of Family Ministries ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Jesus,

Today's readings provide clear blueprints for the Christian life, as well as the security offered to us by the God who created us, the God who provides all that we need, the God who walks with us every step of the way and the God who unconditionally loves us.

In today's reading from the prophet Isaiah, the Lord provides a clearly defined list of what we should do, as well as an amazing promise of what we can expect if we follow through. (Isaiah 58: 7-10)

The "To Do" List

- Share your bread with the hungry
- Shelter the oppressed and the homeless
- Clothe the naked when you see them
- Do not turn your back on your own

The Promise

- ♥ Your light shall break through like dawn
- ♥ Your wound shall be quickly healed
- ♥ Your vindication shall go before you
- ♥ The glory of God will be your rear guard

And the Bonus!

- ♥ Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer, you shall cry for help, and He will say: Here I am!

And just to lend some extra credibility to the prophet's words, roughly 700-750 years later, in the gospel of Matthew (20 chapters after today's gospel-), the gospel writer shares Jesus' teaching on "The Final Judgment" (Matthew 25: 31-46) in which Jesus outlines:

The "To Do" List

- I was hungry and you fed me
- Thirsty and you gave me a drink
- A stranger and you received me in your home
- Naked and you clothed me
- I was sick and you took care of me
- In prison and you visited me

The Promise

- ♥ Come, you that are blessed by my Father!
- ♥ Come and possess the kingdom which has been prepared for you ever since the creation of the world.

And the Bonus!

- ♥ Whenever you did this for one of the least brothers of mine, you did it for me!

Still not sure? Double back and re-read today's responsorial psalm (Psalm 112: 4-5, 6-7, 8-9)

- The "To Do" List
- Be gracious and lend
- Conduct your affairs with justice
- Lavishly give to the poor
- Keep your heart firm
- Trust in the Lord

The Promise

- ♥ You shall never be moved
- ♥ You shall not fear
- ♥ Your legacy of justice will endure

And the Bonus!

- ♥ The just man is a light in the darkness to the upright. And today's gospel uses a slightly different approach to ensure that we are using your God-given gifts for the glory of God and the good of all.

It's all in the Bonus! God gave you specific gifts to be used to do good works to glorify God in Heaven. Don't lose them. Don't hide them. Use them to the best of your ability so that others may come to know and glorify God. And just in case you're wondering if this applies to you, the gospel says, "Your light must shine before others."

Not an inch of wiggle room there my friends.

I am always in awe every time I read the scriptures and I see the Old Testament and New Testament correlations. How much does our God loves us that He will keep delivering the same message in countless ways for hundreds and thousands of years until we will finally "get it". That's a lot of patience, perseverance and love. Thank You Lord, God!

I have to say, I think here at St. John's, we are "getting it". Our parish is full of faith-filled, parishioners who are extremely generous with our resources and our talents and our time. That being said, we should never become complacent. We must continue to ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten our minds and hearts so that we know where, and when, and how God is asking us to humbly shine our lights, for His people and for His glory. Some of us are called to give...others are called to pray...others to serve. Let us pray for each other and with each other, that our individual paths to holiness will become crystal clear...perhaps a part of our Lenten journeys?

Our paths of holiness are all different, but I would like to share just one insight. Let me preface what follows with this: dear brothers in Christ...please do not be upset or offended in any way but what I share in the paragraphs below. My intention is to take a moment to celebrate some...not to leave out or fail to recognize others.

Ash Wednesday

ABSTINENCE & FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals.

Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse.

A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

Let's come together as a parish community to support this life-affirming mission.





A Message from Monsignor Walden...

In spite of all the hype in the media and on TV today about this being Super Bowl Sunday LX, even more importantly and hopeful is today is the fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The adjectives super and ordinary seem like opposites. But in reality the hope, nourishment, joy, and inspiration we receive on the fourth Sunday in Ordinary time at Mass is far more nourishing than the hours of entertainment we will experience later this evening. I am not putting the Super Bowl down (we have a gathering in the rectory for the game) but it offers an opportunity to see what this Sunday and every Sunday offers us as God's beloved sons and daughters.

This Sunday and next Sunday the Gospel comes from chapter five in St. Matthew's Gospel which began at Mass for us last Sunday with Jesus giving us the Beatitudes. Today we are told that if we take the Beatitudes seriously we will be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. There are many ways we make a difference to the people we encounter and live with everyday. It is wonderful when that difference is a positive, loving, life giving difference. Sadly there are those times when our encounters result in negative, angry, frustrating thoughts, words, and actions. Respect, listening, and sincere hope for a peaceful and life giving result is all too often the last thing that results. But in the inner recesses of our hearts we know that the only way to true peace is to be open to the truth of who are as the people of God created in His very image and likeness.

The key is to embrace Jesus who humbly, truthfully, and lovingly proclaims in John 14:6, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." Jesus never sought to condemn or belittle, but to enlighten and enrich us as the Way, Truth, and Life. Out of pure love God created us in His very own image. To be fully alive is to put our faith in Him. Jesus came to reconcile us to the Father with Him and the Holy Spirit. Over and over again He was met with rejection but He was not deterred. A key part of His love for us is His life giving mercy. In Jesus we see that mercy from the heart seeks only the good of those to whom it is shown. Mercy cannot be demanded and cannot be given reluctantly. There is no greater example of that than Jesus' words on the cross, "Father forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34). Mercy taken to heart frees us from vengeful hearts and spiteful words and actions. It frees us from being defensive and plotting to get even or prevail. Everyday as we pray the Our Father, the prayer

Jesus Himself taught us, we conclude with these words: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." How bright the light of love burns with mercy given and accepted and how real Jesus' words in today's Gospel become, "You are the light of the world."

In the 2000 years of Christ and His Church there have been over 104,000 Sundays of His followers gathering to praise, thank, and seek His love as His family. That far surpasses the joy of a 60th Super Bowl. May we keep all things in perspective for our good and the good of those we love.

I offer Psalm 2 for your prayerful reflection:

*Why this tumult among nations,
among peoples this useless murmuring?
They arise, the kings of the earth, princes
plot against the Lord and his Anointed.*

*Come, let us break their fetters,
come, let us cast off their yoke."
He who sits in the heavens laughs;
the Lord is laughing them to scorn.*

*Then he will speak in his anger,
his rage will strike them with terror.
It is I who have set up my king on Zion,
my holy mountain."*

*I will announce the decree of the Lord:
The Lord said to me: You are my Son.
It is I who have begotten you this day.
Ask and I will bequeath you the nations,
put the ends of the earth in your possession.*

*With a rod of iron you will break them,
shatter them like a potter's jar."*

*Now, O kings, understand,
take warning, rulers of the earth;
serve the Lord with awe
and trembling, pay him your homage
lest he be angry and you perish;
for suddenly his anger will blaze.*

*Blessed are they who put their trust in God.
