FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Isaiah 58

Making Light Shine

Dear Parish Family:

The way the liturgical year works light has been prominent over the past three weeks from the 3rd Week in Ordinary Time, the Presentation of the Lord (celebrated on a Sunday this year) and the readings from this Sunday. I do not know if it's because of the liturgy alone or perhaps my own need to feel more of Christ's Light these days but is definitely impacting me.

I have always loved today's first reading. It's part of the reading we proclaim on the Friday after Ash Wednesday (so come to Mass on February 28th to hear more!). The prophet Isaiah speak very clearly about what happens when light shines. Can I share some thoughts—admittedly my own and probably not the best—that might be a help? Might be a good pre-Lenten check up for you and certainly for me?

So "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them"....and then your light will shine! If you are reading this bulletin you know this parish works pretty hard to do these things. What would make them even better would be if even more peo-

ple engaged in these activities! How about these ideas? What about donating a percentage of your food budget (maybe 2 or 3 or 10%) to Ernie's Place or our Street Ministry? How about each time you get a new item of clothing you donate an existing item to our Thrift Shop? (How many t-shirts, sweatshirts, jackets, etc. do we need?) What about getting involved in our Street Ministry or Community Meal who serve many who are in need of shelter? How about volunteering in our Parish Social Ministry as we are constantly seeking housing for individuals and families? Then, your light shines. Actually, the Light of Christ shines through you!

After all this then "your wound shall quickly be healed" when the light shines. There is something about this isn't there? When we move out of ourselves, particularly in moments of struggle, and go out of our way to be there for others we are lifted. We pray this in the Prayer of

St. Francis when we say it is in "giving that we receive." Our giving helps the other. When we allow God to use us for the good of the other, don't we become a little more of God's healing presence?

Further, Isaiah writes, "If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech...then the light shall rise for you in the darkness." This focus moves us from exterior action to interior reflection. For the words we speak, the oppression we allow or encourage, and the false accusations we consider so often come from an interior darkness. We can quickly judge, condemn, castigate, slander, or destroy one another pretty quickly. We do this with the words we speak, the thoughts we hold, the posts we make, and bandwagons we jump on. As we approach the days of Lent, could we consider removing those internal weaknesses that so quickly lead to external destruction?

What's common in all cases here? It involves a real letting go. We need to let go of so much of the "stuff" we hold on to. You and I know that, in many cases, we can do with less so others can have a little more. As we let the healing Light of Christ touch our wounds, we become stronger. When we speak less, think less negatively and are more open, do we not encounter the presence of Christ in the other, even the one we may have judged wrongly or too quickly?

Know what the next verses are "Your people shall **rebuild** the ancient ruins; the foundations from ages past you shall raise up '**Repairer** of the breach,' they shall call you, '**Restorer** of ruined dwellings'." It just takes a little light.

Preparing for Ash Wednesday

We are all familiar with the practice of receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday, which this year is February 26, 2020. The ashes are a sign of the public penance to which we are all called during the Lenten season. As we promise to repent and believe in the Gospel, the ashes brand us with the sign of the cross — a sign of our commitment to the journey of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, a journey which ends with the new life of baptism and baptismal renewal during the Easter season. Penitential acts are undertaken as a community, as together we journey to the cross and resurrection.





What you may not know is where the ashes come from. Very simply, the ashes used on Ash Wednesday are the ashes from palms saved from Palm Sunday the previous year, which have been burned. This year we once again invite you to share in our communal celebration of Ash Wednesday in a special way. We ask you to bring old palms from your home and deposit them in the baskets which will be available. These palms will then be burned and used as ashes on Ash Wednesday, February 26th.

LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin that runs during the winter months. With his permission, I have reprinted it here. As we are in the midst of the winter season, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist.

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Holy Communion:</u> Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are especially encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands befor Mass begins. If Communion ministers need to clean their hands during Mass, it must be done discreetly. The best way for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to clean their hands during Mass is to use a sanitizing liquid in the pew before coming into the sanctuary (sanitizing liquids have no place on the altar or among the Communion vessels and other sacred items on the credence table).
- <u>Communion from the Chalice</u>: The faithful should refrain from drinking from the chalice when one has a cold or is fearful of being infected.
- <u>Receiving on the Tongue:</u> Faithful who normally receive Holy Communion on the tongue should refrain from receiving on the tongue and instead receive in the hand when one has a cold or is otherwise contagious. Do not spread your saliva to the hand of the Communion minister if you are sick; receive Communion in the hand instead.
- <u>Greeting of Peace:</u> Use your own discretion and best judgment when invited to exchange the greeting of peace during the liturgy; limit physical contact with others if necessary. If a handshake is not advisable, a simple bow of the head is acceptable. Do not be insulted if someone prefers to avoid shaking your hand.
- <u>Mass Attendance</u>: MOST IMPORTANTLY, IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE DO NOT COME TO MASS! There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are sick; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.) Personal prayer and reflection on the Sunday Scripture readings is encouraged; many people also enjoy viewing the Mass on television.

26 January 2020 Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

I write to you a little over a month after the celebration of Christmas. Those days and the days leading up to them are busy ones in the life of the parish. This year, we cared for nearly 150 individuals through our Toy Drive and hundreds more through our Advent Giving Tree. We welcomed thousands here on Christmas Eve and Day.

This past Christmas I preached about how God does some of his greatest work in the darkness. Christmas is celebrated during, literally, the darkest time of the year. Yet it is here that God breaks into the world. Admittedly, I write during some dark times in the Church.

Yet, the Light of Christ must continue to shine! The psalm we prayed with this weekend reminds us of this. You and I both know that this is the mission of the Church. Regardless of good times or bad, times of great hope and even during times of some disillusionment, we must work to build the Kingdom of God both in our own parish and throughout the Church of Long Island. As you know, we rely on the larger church in many ways from education and formation of seminarians to assisting with the larger work of evangelization throughout Long Island and beyond. We see it in other parts of our diocese that are not directly supported by the CMA like the Catholic Faith Network or Catholic Health Services. The truth is this – amid a lot of darkness in these days – the light of Christ still shines. We need to keep it burning brightly.

Would you consider being part of the 2020 Catholic Ministries Appeal? I will. After a lot of prayer and consideration I know how important it is to support this work of the "larger" church on Long Island. I hope you do too. Everything you need to make a pledge is included here in this mailing. Our parish goal this year is \$103,200. Twenty percent of this goal returns to SJE. If we go above the goal, which I hope we will, we will receive back 80% of the amount over goal. As I have written before, this effort benefits the larger work of the Church and our parish as well. The truth – the CMA is our parish's largest single fundraiser. (I also want you to know that I have been reassured that no monies from the CMA go to anything related to the child sex abuse scandal or to settlements or anything of the sort. If you choose to make an offering it is going to ongoing work of diocese.)

Thank you for the many ways you support the larger church, our parish and me. I am grateful and humbled.

Do you want to improve your immune system, lower your blood pressure, lessen depression, improve balance, have better sleep, and/or reduce your symptoms of arthritis and chronic pain? If you answered yes to any of the above, why not join our **T'ai Chi Chih** group that meets every Tuesday morning at 11:00 in the Convent for approximately 40 minutes. This is an

easy moving meditation that consists of 10 simple repetitive movements. Those who have been attending this group will attest to it.

Since I have not gotten any responses for a Retreat Day on February 20th, perhaps an afternoon closer to the middle of Lent for a meditation, **Walking with Mary** during those difficult first Lenten days would be more appropriate. As a result, let's plan on **Friday, March 20th**. We can attend the 12 Noon Mass in the Church, walk (or drive) to the convent, have lunch, and begin at approximately 1:30. That allows you to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and have lunch. There will be a reflection on Walking with Mary during those first Lenten days, time for quiet reflection, **Stations of the Cross for Seniors** (like we had last year) and it will be finished at approximately 5:30. PLEASE CONSIDER IF THIS MIGHT WORK FOR YOU. Please RSVP to Sr. Ann by **March 6th** as these activities do take time to plan.

There have been many funerals during the past year. As of now, we have held successful **Bereavement Support** meetings on Wednesday mornings. I would like to change them to evenings so that those who are still working can take advantage of them. As I've often said, these gatherings are non-threatening, supportive for all who are grieving and finding it difficult. They are for ANYONE, not just "Seniors" who need support. Too many people who have not experienced the death of a close one often mean well but do not completely realize that it sometimes takes longer for some people to go through this difficult period.
