A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

GOSPEL REFLECTION ~ Luke 5:1-11 Trusting In God's Word

A few weeks ago, at the Feast of Cana, we saw the implications and wonders that the disciples had experienced once they were obedient to the Lord's command. Mary said, "Do whatever He tells you to do." Then Jesus said to His disciples, "Fill the jugs with water." Everything changed. They listened to Him, and it was no longer water, but wine and plenty of it.

In todays' gospel, in Luke's Call Narrative, we see something similar take place. After being out all

night and catching nothing (when the fish are more easily accessible), Jesus asks the impossible. He tells Simon Peter to go out a short distance on the boat. After teaching to the crowds, He tells Peter to "put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Knowing that this was an impossible task during daylight hours where fish are scarce, he says, "I have caught nothing all night, but at your command I will

lower the nets." It is also clear from today's passage that obedience to the Lord pays off. It led to an abundant yield! They caught so many fish that the nets were tearing.

We see in today's gospel the impact that this great catch had on the lives of the first disciples. This encounter that they had with Jesus out on the Sea of Galilee moved them deeply. They were so inspired by His wisdom and love that they dropped their nets and followed Him. Keep in mind that their nets were their basic security. It was their entire livelihood. It is how they survived and supported their families. For them, leaving their nets behind to follow Jesus signified their complete and total trust in His Lordship.

This gospel is one of the most popular passages in the history of the church because it was on this historic day on the Sea of Galilee that opened the eyes of the world at the time. This dramatic catch witnessed by many was the kickoff to saving souls and bringing souls to God. This catch signified the importance of bringing others to faith in God. It pointed to the mission of the early Church. Evangelization. But most of all, it illustrates how important it is for us to be obedient to God's word because of its saving implications. And we will see

how true this is when they become 'fishers of men" during the early Church.

A lot of times we find it easy to respond to God's word when it is less challenging, but when it demands more of us, we tend to ignore Him. As long as God's word does not affect our way of life, we tend to be more receptive. But when His word comes between us and our way of doing things (personal freedoms), we ignore it. Simeon said to Mary at the presentation of the Lord, "You yourself a sword will pierce." He is referring to how her son will be a sign of contradiction, and His word will lead to the fall and rise of many.

It is clear in the scriptures the enormous implications that take place when one is obedient to the Lord. Great things follow. He tells His disciples to gather what they can for the feeding of the multitude. They listened. They gave Him the little they collected. Yet over 5000 were fed.

The challenge for us is to love more and believe more. We need to recognize that we cannot be dependent upon ourselves in light of our shortcomings and failings.

We need to keep Jesus first in our lives above everyone else. We need to know the power and benefits behind His word and commands. He would not ask us to do anything if it was not for the greater glory of God. One way in which we can grow in our love, knowledge and appreciation of the Lord is to encounter Him more deeply in prayer. We must trust more in His saving word and power, knowing the great implications it can have on our lives today that we find in the scriptures.

The truth is, we need to be more still and more silent, so we can listen more attentively to what He is asking of us. We have to trust more knowing that He will be faithful to His word and promise, and lead us all to the shores of paradise. If we try to do everything on our own, we will fail miserably. But if we rely more on Jesus for strength, wisdom and courage, we will be effective in advancing His Kingdom in our world today. And if we really look into the heart of today's gospel narrative, it is clear what Jesus is asking of us all. He is commanding that we join Him and His disciples in evangelizing the world - to be "fishers of men." If we take the risk in proclaiming Christ deep into the world, many will respond and come to believe. The command is clear, and the implications are enormous!





SAFE ENVIRONMENT UPDATES

VIRTUS TRAINING ON CAMPUS...

February 12, 2025 at 6:30 PM will be held in the Barn All volunteers and employees in our parish are required to participate a training course called "Protecting God's Children" and complete a background check as part of our VIRTUS® programs. The importance of the program is



to create safe environments for all, including those who work and minister in our parishes, schools, or other programs. VIRTUS is the brand name that identifies best practices and programs designed to help prevent wrongdoing and promote "right doing" within religious organizations. The VIRTUS programs empower organizations and people to better control risk and improve the lives of all those who interact with the Church.

Our volunteers are required to attend because they are a part of the solution to the problem of child sexual abuse in our homes, parishes, and communities. When caring adults have a "healthy suspicion" about something in their surroundings, they can identify the risks to children early enough to prevent child sexual abuse from occurring.

Although the program is primarily designed to address the issues of creating a safe environment for children and youth, it is also applicable to the vulnerable adult population.

Even if you do not believe that your ministry will have any contact with either vulnerable adults or children you will be

covered if you should change or volunteer for additional ministries. The program includes two videos which are viewed and then discussed. You can sign up for the VIRTUS classes by visiting www.drvc.org or clicking here VIRTUS® Online (virtusonline.org).




present moment. We're living the lessons which is comforting when we're in pain, we have a lot of laughs too. We're there for each other! The book will be provided,


