NEW PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now—seen to the right—has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also need to purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space.

Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.

Last year, a nice tradition developed that I hope we can continue. Members of the parish who had lost family members in the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one. If you and/or your family would like to do that, we would be most grateful and appreciative. You can leave a donation in the Parish Office. Please note clearly that it is for the new Paschal Candles.

LENT 2019

ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Good Friday fast and abstinence.


Seton Chapel + Convent Building

OBITUARY

Sister Ann Kathleen Bolton, OP

On Saturday morning, February 23, 2019, God called Sister Ann Kathleen Bolton home to eternal rest and joy. Sister was 91 years old and had devoted 72 years to her faithful Dominican religious life.

Alice Mary Bolton was born in Brooklyn on September 27, 1927, the daughter of John and Roseann (Winters) Bolton. Both of her parents were from Scotland.

The family lived in the parish of St. Theresa of Avila, Brooklyn where she went to elementary school. She first met the Dominican Sisters of Amityville at Bishop Mc Donnell Memorial High School. Having formed a fast friendship with several of the Dominican Sisters there, she entered the Novitiate at Queen of the Rosary Amityville under the sponsorship of Sister Francis Loretta, OP on September 8, 1946. On August 4, 1947, Alice received her Dominican habit and the name Sister Ann Kathleen; the following year, on August 7, 1948, Sister Ann Kathleen pronounced her vows and soon after began her ministry in Education.

Sister's first assignment was to the parish school of St. Pancras in Glendale where she taught elementary grades from 1948-1958. Ann Kathleen loved history and received a B.A. in History/Social Studies from St. John's University, Queens, NY. She later received her M.A. in History/Social Studies from St. Bonaventure University in upstate New York. From 1958-1960 Ann Kathleen taught history at All Saints High School. She was then transferred to teach History at Queen of the Rosary Academy in 1960. When she arrived, Sister found out that the Motherhouse rooms, set aside for the faculty Sisters, were filled, so she and two other Sisters were to live in a small cottage on the grounds. This turned out for her and

the other Sisters to be an unexpected pleasure. They had a semblance of greater freedom and the pleasure of a type of small group living which she enjoyed immensely. In addition, she loved teaching the students at QRA who, in turn, loved her. She was an excellent teacher as well as kind and friendly. Both she and the students had many happy days at QRA.

In 1967 Sister Ann Kathleen was transferred to Maria Regina Diocesan High School where she remained until 1984. During this time the rules on religious dress were relaxed and Sisters could choose what they wanted to wear. For her history classes she decided to wear an outfit that fit the era she was teaching. To do this she borrowed some items from the girls and even their mothers to make an outfit in order to play the part of someone from the era under consideration. She changed outfits as history studies advanced through the centuries. Her classes were both fun and rigorously historical. For her own clothes of choice, however, she loved to wear good, pretty clothes which she bought only when there were sales. Ann Kathleen loved to travel and especially wanted to see some of the countries about which she taught in her history classes. Thus, she visited France, England, Scotland and other countries abroad as well as places in the U.S. She had a true admiration for these places and the history they held.

In 1984 Ann Kathleen felt a call to be involved in a parish and moved to St. John the Evangelist in Center Moriches teaching in the elementary school. Hoping to become a hospital Chaplain, Ann Kathleen entered the C.P.E. program of studies at the Central Islip Psychiatric Hospital. From

1991-1992 she went to Greenville, North Carolina to do Pastoral Care Ministry at the Pitt County Medical Center in Greenville. She returned to residence at St. John's in Center Moriches intending to go into hospital work but there were no open positions. Her Pastor, Father MacDonald, had another idea: she would start an Outreach Program in the parish. She started the program in 1992 and loved the ministry, especially to the Seniors. In turn the people loved her. In her last week of life, the Sisters received a phone call from the Outreach office requesting that Sister be told they were praying for her. Just as Ann Kathleen had been with people to the end, they remained with her in prayer in Center Moriches.

In 2009 Sister realized it was time to retire and moved to the convent at St. John the Baptist in West Islip. Failing health, however, necessitated a move in 2011 to Carlin Hall at the Motherhouse for care. Sister was always grateful for the care she received and had special gratitude for her friend and aide Marilyn.

Sister Ann Kathleen, affectionately called Annie, was a lovely person, a fine prayerful, friendly woman who was a joy in community. She loved ice cream, especially Friendly's, and enjoyed singing and dancing. Her friend, Sister Beata, was often her dancing partner and frequently had trouble keeping up with Annie's energy. Annie loved to do everything quickly even dancing, sometimes skipping a beat to make a dance with four beats into one with only three beats. Keeping pace with Annie was sometimes difficult. In her prayer life she never hurried, however, and maintained a love for St. Ann and St. Therese of Lisieux throughout her life. Annie was a delightful, even-tempered Sister who brought joy and laughter to almost any situation.

Sister Ann Kathleen will be dearly missed by the Sisters in the Congregation, her family whom she loved unconditionally and her many friends. Her parents, brother John and sister Cathleen McCrane predeceased her. She is survived by her many loving and faithful nieces and nephews, her brother-in-law William McCrane, and a large extended family and many friends.

All services will take place in St. Albert's Chapel at Queen of the Rosary Motherhouse in Amityville. The wake will take place on Wednesday, February 27, 2019 beginning with a prayer service at 3 pm. On Thursday, February 28, 2019, Morning Prayer will be said at 10:10 am followed by the Mass of Christian Burial at 10:30 am. Burial in the Sisters' cemetery will follow Mass.

Dear Parish Family:

I hope you take some time to read about Sister Ann Kathleen Bolton. I did not know her personally but have only heard wonderful stories about her from so many of you and from the Sisters of St. Dominic in Amityville.

Pope Francis uses a phrase entitled "the saints next door". In *Rejoice and Be Glad*, he writes, "I like to contemplate the holiness present in the patience of God's people: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick, in elderly religious who never lose their smile. In their daily perseverance I see the holiness of the Church militant. Very often it is a holiness found in our next-door neighbors, those who, living in our midst, reflect God's presence."

Sounds like for many years SJE was blessed by a true "saint next door". Now she prays for us as we commit to pray for her!

Street Outreach

As Long Island continues to increase in its cost of living, more and more individuals and families are being squeezed out of permanent housing. After numerous parishioners have reached out to share their experiences, I figured that I would share the mindset of our Street Ministry on what we feel is the best way to facilitate and foster relationships with the homeless.



The question of what the responsible gift is to give to a person who is homeless is a difficult one. If I have the time, I'll hand out a gift card or even buy them a meal at

the most convenient restaurant. We would obviously never give money out to someone living on the streets right? Sure, the stereotype of a person who is homeless is addicted to drugs and alcohol but that isn't always the case of course. Pope Francis could not be any clearer when giving advice on what to give someone who is homeless. Not only does Pope Francis say it is NOT our place to judge on where the money is spent but we should also look them in the eye when speaking and giving them money. Ultimately, do what feels most comfortable. Even if you do not have any materiel donations to give, just by speaking with them you are restoring their dignity.

There are essentially three phone numbers that you will want to know of. 1) Suffolk County Department of Social Services has an emergency phone number (631-854-9100) you can call during the weekdays after 4:30PM and weekends at any time. They will provide a bed in a shelter and transportation to it. However, many shelters are infamous for being unsafe and/or unhealthy so do not be surprised if the person is reluctant to go and would rather sleep outside. 2) Maureen's Haven (631-727-6831) is a non-profit, interdenominational organization that houses the homeless in churches on the East End of Long Island during the winter months and provides other resources throughout the year. 3) St. John the Evangelist (631-878-0009 ext. 119). The Street Ministry provides hot meals and clothing every Thursday night. We also aid with case management, food, clothing, toiletries, etc. If there is someone who is in the area that you know of and is open to receiving these types of services, please give them the SJE phone number and tell them to leave a message with their name, phone number they can be reached on and what they are looking for help with while being as detailed as possible (say sizes of clothes and types of clothing).

The most important concept to remember is safety! Never drive anyone anywhere and always try to be with someone else you can trust. This advice is for those who have met a person who may be homeless outside of a clothing store or supermarket so don't go trekking in the woods looking for a "tent city." HANDS-ON LEARNING

"As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ." ~1 Corinthians 12

One of our Level 8 classes—while covering 1 Corinthians 12—used a puzzle activity to jump start a discussion on how we all come together as different pieces to be one body in Christ and enrich each other.

"...[The Apostles] anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them." ~ Mark 6:13



In Level 5, our students recently delved into the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. One class came up with a creative, hands-on experience to explain the different parts of the Sacrament. In creating "fluffy slime," the shaving cream represented the oil (the sign of healing), the glue represented the viaticum (Eucharist) which made the dying stronger, and the students used their hands to mix everything together, representing the laying on of the hands that occurs during the anointing of the sick.


