# A Message from the Director of Faith Formation...

**“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.” ~John 3:16**

We hear one of the most well-known Scripture verses in this week’s Gospel. Perhaps you’ve seen “John 3:16” on posters at sporting events or on a bumper sticker. The depth of “John 3:16” should be a cause for great rejoicing—God’s love knows no limits! It also remind us that even in the Season of Lent we are meant to rejoice. That is what this Sunday—Laetare Sunday—is all about!

We’ve reached the half-way point of Lent. It’s a good time to take a look at how our Lenten observances are going—have we been growing closer to God through our sacrifices or have we been distracted or discouraged? The good news is that, if we have been struggling, there’s still time to get it right! I don’t know about you, but for me sometimes Lent can feel more like a test of willpower as I try to “push through” the penitential season. But God calls us to instead rely on His strength, grace and mercy. Pope Francis recently spoke about this beautifully on social media:

**“Fasting, experienced as a form of self-denial, helps those of us who undertake it in simplicity of heart to rediscover God’s gift and to recognize that, created in His image and likeness, we find our fulfillment in Him.”**

God is “rich in mercy,” as we hear in St. Paul’s Letter to the Ephesians today. And Jesus tells us in today’s Gospel that He did not come to condemn us but to save us. Hopefully this can help us be less critical of others and perhaps be gentler with ourselves when we fall short, knowing God is always there to help us start again, if only we would respond to His invitation. We rejoice because we have a God who loves us beyond measure!

This month in our Faith Formation program, we have been reflecting on God’s love and mercy through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This week, our Level 2 students will receive this Sacrament for the first time! Our Levels 7 and 8 Penance Services also will take place this week, with students and family members given the opportunity to go to confession. (Our Grade 3-6 students and families will be offered the opportunity to go to Reconciliation on April 11).

We were also blessed to welcome Fr. John Crozier, associate vocations director for our diocese, come out to speak to our Level 8 students about vocations and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

During our Family of Faith (Grades 1-6) sessions, parents and students experienced Eucharistic Adoration and learned about different ways to pray with Scripture during Lent. Special thanks to Deacon Michael Hoonhout, who taught our families about the Eucharist and presided at Adoration.

Finally, we have two students seeking full initiation into the Catholic Church through our RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children)

program. They will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil - please keep them in your prayers. In addition to our normal classes, our RCIC volunteer Lorraine Hickey has been meeting with them once a month to help them prepare for their Sacraments.

I am deeply grateful to all our volunteers who give witness to our faith and generously dedicate their time in service to our families. Thank you to all our Faith Formation families for making the faith a priority in the lives of your children.

## CMA Spotlight...



Recently, the New York State Department of Health released a new report, with a staggering statistic: more than 1 in 5 Long Island adults worry about having enough money to buy nutritious meals. And while it is heartbreaking that so many of our neighbors worry about the cost of food, the reality is that food is only one piece of the puzzle for someone struggling to make ends meet.



The excessive cost of housing, heating costs, especially during this extremely chilly winter, gas prices, and healthcare costs also add a heavy burden on a family’s budget. It is certainly challenging to live on Long Island. Many families turn to our Parish Social Ministries to supplement their source of food and for relief to some expenses for their families. The PSM is a partnership between Catholic Charities and the parishes in our Long Island faith community. The ministry is rooted in the gifts of the people of God, enabling those within the parish community to receive spiritual nourishment by serving and supporting those in need. These PSM operate robust and incredibly active programs.


We recently spoke with Katie Spellman, Coordinator of the PSM of St. John the Evangelist, Center Moriches. Here is what she shared about the program at this parish. “We provide services across many avenues. We started with a food pantry in the 70s, and then a thrift shop. We are always looking to add programs. We have a Street Ministry that goes to the railroad station in Shirley serving folks on the street with hot meals, and clothing. There is a community of people who come for the welcome and love that volunteers share. We have a Chicken Ministry, so we get fresh eggs for the food pantry. The Garden Ministry, known as Heaven’s Harvest grows tomatoes and green, eggplant and cucumber beans, radishes, and summer squash. The plants all started as seedlings and the harvest will go into early October.

We have a monthly community hot meal dinner; volunteers make meals at home and people come to share this meal. This builds community and hospitality by bringing people together and allows volunteers to share talents in different ways.

The needs have grown immensely in the last year, there has been a continual need for food. The increase was so great that we had to tighten our parameters to have food for everyone. In the pantry, clients can serve themselves to get exactly what they want. We can never have enough food. One night we served 37 families in one hour. With the high price of food, the needs in the community are growing especially in our Spanish community so we try to get bilingual volunteers to help these families.


# EUCHARISTIC Adoration

**What is FASTING?**  
The **limitation** of food and drink – typically to one main meal and two smaller meals, with no solid foods in between  
*But remember to drink enough fluids!*

**When do we fast?**  
Ash Wednesday & Good Friday\*

\*Paschal Fast: Good Friday and Holy Saturday are days of prayer and quiet reflection. We honour the suffering and death of Jesus and prepare to share in the joy of his resurrection at Easter.

**What is ABSTINENCE?**  
**Avoiding** certain kinds of food or drink, typically meat or other desirable foods

**When do we abstain?**  
Catholics are obliged to abstain from **meat every Friday** throughout the year (except solemn feast days)

**TIP: Instead of abstaining, you may substitute special acts of charity or piety on Fridays**

**Why fast?**  
It helps us to **pray better**: an empty stomach can lead to more attentive prayer

**Who has to fast?**  
Catholics aged 18 to 60  
Those with impaired health should not fast in any way.

**Why abstain on Fridays?**  
It's the **day of Christ's saving death** on the cross; we abstain to share in His work of saving the world


**Who has to abstain?**  
Catholics aged 14 and older

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...



There are two very different ways to understand the concept of seeing through another person. Negatively, it means seeing that their words and actions are not in sync. They say one thing but believe another or live in contradiction to what they say. Out of fear of controversy or non-acceptance, they say what makes them acceptable. Positively seeing through another person means learning or seeing what we did not see before or totally understand.

In the Gospel for today's Mass that is optional to use (John 9:1-41), we have the account of Jesus healing a man who was born blind. As wonderful and awesome that miracle was, the religious leaders who did not accept Jesus tried to discredit Him. They questioned the man himself and his parents. They assured the religious leaders that he was born blind. Then they tried to discredit Jesus by saying He did it on a Sabbath, a day when no "work" is allowed. What becomes clearer and clearer in their displeasure, non-acceptance, or rejection of Jesus is how they missed the miraculous power of God to not only cure blindness and be present in their very midst.

Jesus communicated the love and goodness of God in all He said and did. To take His presence and words to heart is to find peace, hope, truth, and love that is the center and core of who we are. The way people speak to us and treat us reveals what they think of us. What I find particularly disturbing in our nation at this time is the attitude of politicians and those who support them, and what that shows about how they see us.

Under the Biden administration, there is absolute promotion and defense of abortion. What is that saying about us? It says we are not capable of controlling our sexual appetite or taking responsibility for the consequences of our sexual activity. That is compounded by the legality of an unbelievable onslaught of pornography readily accessible through the internet, through our phones, wherever we are. The phrase that is at times attributed to Marie Antoinette when told the peasants have no bread, "let them eat cake" is now, "Do what you want sexually and we will help free you of any responsibility because of your actions." Sexuality is a gift from God. When used in the context of marriage between a man and a woman, it expresses love, bonds them ever closer, and opens the

possibility for a new life. We are all the result of that act. Thank you, mom and dad! To vote for and support such politicians as we have in office now is to enable them to promote what is morally detrimental, harmful and, in the end, sinful.

There was big controversy when President Biden wanted to fund abortions for those in our military. How ironic to provide those who commit themselves to putting their lives on the line to defend us to enable them to take the lives of the innocent they have brought into being!

The other sexual issue that is pushed into our faces is the promotion of same sex marriage and the option of enabling young people to be surgically transformed from male to female or female to male. Yes, we are human being who are sexual beings. How we choose to live enables us and others to see through us in the best and in the worst sense possible.

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

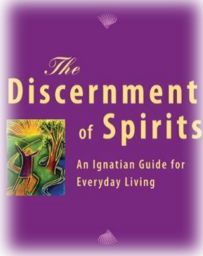

# Women's Group...

Fr. Timothy Gallagher's book on The Discernment of Spirits, lists St. Ignatius' 14 rules for discernment, then goes through each rule a chapter at a time, describing how to apply it in our lives. In the ups & downs, consolations and desolations of our spiritual life, we go through times of pure joy to "Where are You Jesus?"



St. Ignatius (1491-1556), recuperating from war wounds was given reading material on the life of Christ & the saints. As he thought about what he read, he became aware of his thought patterns, how the thoughts affected his feelings, and how the good feelings remained with him. When he had worldly thoughts, although he felt good while thinking them, he noticed that afterward the feelings left him empty. He continued reading spiritual books, growing in wisdom. God was leading him, fulfilling His Plan for him to be a great saint & to teach us. God's plan for us is the same, the *process is slow*.

As women who love Jesus, we need & want to learn to recognize Jesus' voice & grow closer to Him. At times we feel inadequate, wondering is this Jesus speaking, me or the enemy? In our group we begin to see we're all equal, with the same problems, emotions, weaknesses, confusion, strengths, desires, fears, doing the best we can, we don't have to be perfect. Jesus consoles us through our love for each other. If you feel desire to come but are fearful, we understand because we've been there & at times still are, so just come as you are, no rules or requirements, you don't have to read or share. We respect the privacy of others, sharing is *anonymous!*
