




Sister Mary Alice Piil, CSJ, of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Brentwood, will preach at Evening Prayer.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A Year Later

Grace and Light

Dear Parish Family:

I don't know if you remember our Parish Mission last year. We prayed the Novena of Grace. One of our last public events as a parish was the Closing Evening Prayer of the novena. We welcomed Fr. James Donovan, S.J., to our parish on that night. A few days later we announced major changes in how we would pray, serve, learn, and live as a parish community. Many of the things we were used to, attached to, and that were accustomed to would be different.

The Novena of Grace is a nine day time of prayer that seeks the intercession of St.

Francis Xavier. I try to pray it each March and December. (St. Francis Xavier's feast day is the day of my priestly ordination. We've become pretty good friends since then.) As I write this letter, I am working and praying through the Novena of Grace. I find myself a few days behind. Part of it is because of the "busy"ness of these days. Part of it is that I find myself needing to give this prayer my focus and attention. (I remember Msgr. McDonald telling me he was happy that I prayed the Novena of Grace and that he did too. I remember it because right after that he said, "John, I can't believe you even know what a Novena is!" Those who know Msgr. McDonald will laugh at the line.)



I have always found great hope and peace in the Novena of Grace. I have prayed it for a number of years now and each year am usually overwhelmed in some way or another by the prayer. I take time to pray for a specific intention or two. This year, I am praying to better surrender and separately for an incredible person of grace who is facing a difficult medical diag-

nosis and treatment plan. I have always found that, in some way, my prayers are answered. Never as I hoped. As I look through my journal, I see, often later on, that God did provide. Never as I wanted (thank God) but as was needed (thank God again).

We used a reflection in the journal booklet made last year that I prayed with this Monday (again I'm about three days behind what is likely to be my 14 day novena!). Taken from the writings of the modern spiritual writer, the reflection begins:

"Each time you are anxious and afraid, it is because you may lose or fail to get the object of your attachment, isn't it? And each time you feel jealous, isn't it because someone may make off with what you are attached to? And almost all your anger comes from someone standing in the way of your attachment, doesn't it? ... And when you are depressed and miserable, the cause is there for all to see: Life is not giving you what you have convinced yourself you cannot be happy without."

To use another Catholic word, "Bingo!" It took me a while after reading this to pull myself together. I think it is probably because of my own humanity that I was hit by this passage. I think, too, of this past year. As we mark a year of the official recognition of the pandemic, we have been rocked. We have been rocked by sickness and death—over 500,000 Americans and many from our own parish, division and deception, pain and misplaced passion, acts of great sacrifice and service of the other and great self-ishness and self-centeredness. We have been forced to reckon with violence, with our own bias, prejudice and racial attitudes, with increasing social and moral issues that must be addressed, to an evil that is dividing us and moving us further and further away from another—Catholics included!

Maybe part of the challenge of this past year is not the just the realities of this pandemic. They are real, for sure. Perhaps it because this year has forced us to reckon with many of our attachments. Whether it be the practice of many of the things we have taken for granted, the changes in life style that inconvenience us so others can be safe, the reality that we may not always be in the majority or in power,

the alterations in how we shop, meet, care, share, plan, and so much more. Has it forced us to realize we are too attached to too many things—physical and even more not physical?

I would like to say "Yes and it has driven me closer to Christ". The absence of all I simply expected to always be has moved me to rely on God alone. I would like to say these things but I can't. Rather, I have found myself distant and angry at times, jealous and miserable because life is not going the way I want it to go. It is so sad that I have found myself at times more worried about me and my rights and relationships and reasonings that I failed to be as present or concerned for the other. At times, I was certainly so blinded by my attachments that there was not nearly enough time for God (even though there were days I had all the time in the world). I found myself not wanting to "not come toward the light", preferring the darkness of attachment (John 3:19-20). Maybe you can relate?

So I pray again for this boundless surrender that maybe one day I might just be free. Free of all that I hold on to so tightly. Free of it all that I may draw closer and closer to the Light. May the God who is "rich in mercy" open me up to his grace and light. Maybe you too?

St. Francis Xavier, pray for us!



LENTEN MISSION + 33 Days to Greater Glory

This week, we are going to read Week Four (pp. 115-143). While there is no official rule, try not to go too far ahead and don't panic if you fall behind. Trust that God has you where you need to be. Use your Bible and pray with the Gospel of John as you read each day's reflection in the book.

We are providing a reflection question for each day this week. If it is helpful, please use it. If not, skip it. **Sunday, March 14, 2021**– Rejection of the Truth (pg. 115-119)

What is truth? What prevents us from recognizing truth? How can we be witness to the truth in our contemporary world?

Monday, March 15, 2021 – I Thirst (pg. 119-123)

Do we thirst for Christ? Do we recognize the depth of Christ's thirst for us? How can we relate today's reflection to the Woman at the Well?

<u>Tuesday, March 16, 2021</u> – Mary Magdalene (pg. 123-127)

Why does Jesus tell Mary not to hold on to him? How does Jesus reveal the

Father in his encounter with Mary Magdalene? What does this revelation mean for all of us?

Wednesday, March 17, 2021 – The Upper Room, Again (pg. 127–131)

How does today's reflection of the Upper Room reflect the Father's mercy? "As the Father sent me, so I send you." How do we pray with this revelation of

Jesus? What does this mean for us in our daily lives?

<u>Thursday</u>, <u>March 18</u>, <u>2021</u> - Going Fishing (pg. 131-135)

We are back on the shores of Galilee. How do you imagine it? What would it be like to see Jesus walking along the shore and going fishing with you? Fr. Gaitley speaks about creating spaces for community life. How do you imagine that taking effect in our parish?

Friday, March 19, 2021 – Do You Love Me? (pg. 135-139)

Do we love Jesus "more than these?" What does this mean? How can we feed his sheep?

Saturday, March 20, 2021 – Follow Me (pg. 139-143)

How does Jesus's revelation of the Father restore our proper understanding of the world and our place in it?



ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.



SJE offers a number of ways to remember loved ones, or honor someone living.


Altar Bread and Wine

WHERE DO WE WANT TO BE IN 2023?

KEEPING SAFE IN THESE DAYS!

LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

Since 2017, we have published updates regarding good health, particularly in the winter months. My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin. As we are approaching the winter season in a time of pandemic, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist and some things we have been encouraging for many years!

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- Not feeling great, STAY HOME! Please do not take any chances for your sake or anyone else's! Join us via social media or watch Mass on the Catholic Faith Network. The risks are too great for you and for others in these days. There is no obligation to attend Mass in this time; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.)
- Entering the Church: You must enter through the main fellowship doors with your mask on. NO MASK = NO ENTRANCE into the Church. Sanitize your hands, take a worship aid and enter the church. For Masses in the Auditorium, you may enter through the north or south entrances. Specific doors are marked for entrance and exit.
- <u>Seating:</u> Please sit as close to the front as possible. It works best for groups of one and two can sit closer to the front and/or fill the seats along the perimeter of the church. This allows us to make the maximum, safe use of our available seating. Please keep a safe distance from those on either side of you and/or your family.
- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins and immediately before distribution of Holy Communion. When Extraordinary Ministers go to their station, they place the vessel on the small table near that station and sanitize their hands before distributing Holy Communion.
- Communion from the Chalice: The distribution of the Precious Blood is suspended at this time.
- Reception of Holy Communion: Remember to bow as the person before you receives Holy Communion (this is not new). While you do this, please take down your mask. Please hold your hands out as flat as possible to receive Holy Communion. After placing the host in your mouth, put your mask back up and return to your seat.
- **Greeting of Peace:** The greeting of peace by shaking hands is suspended at this time.
- <u>Help!</u>: We are always looking for more volunteers to assist with the Cana Care Crew, particularly after Masses with the wipe down of the pews. If you and/or your family are willing to help, please see one of the volunteers in the orange shirts. We provide the gloves, t-shirt, towels and cleaning solution. You provide the arm strength and the positive spirit!

Might you run into difficulties at times? When this happens can you remember that you are not alone and that you will always receive the grace you need?
