FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Novena of Grace

THIS WEEK!

Dear Parish Family:

During Lent, many parishes are offering Parish Missions or evenings of reflection. We have done that over the past years here at SJE. This year, after talking with members of the Pastoral Team, we are going to do something different. We are going to participate, as a parish I hope, in the Novena of Grace.



Tradition has it that the Novena of Grace traces back to 1633. A Jesuit priest, Father Marcello Mastrilli sought the intercession of St. Francis Xavier. In a message from St. Francis Xavier, Father Mastilli heard, "All those who implore my help daily for nine consecutive days, from the 4th to the 12th of March included...will experience my protection and may hope with entire assurance to obtain from God any grace they ask for the good of their souls and the glory of God." March 12th is the date of St. Francis Xavier's canonization.

Over the nine days of the Novena of Grace, we are going to implore the help of St. Francis Xavier through acts of prayer, community, and service. (An image of St. Francis Xavier is found about the South Vestibule doors.) It is my hope that this prayer will help us grow stronger as a parish and allow each one of us to know more intimately the passionate love God has for each one of us.

So how does this work? It's pretty easy! This week, at the doors of the Church, special booklets are available for all to use. We have worked to provide some reflections

for each day of the Novena. We will begin the Novena with a Solemn Evening Prayer THIS WEDNESDAY at 7:00 p.m. in the Church. I ask you to come, if you are able. We will pray the Liturgy of the Hours, led by our Music Ministry. At that service, each one of us will be asked to place a particular intention before the Lord as part of the Novena. It may be a prayer intention for you or for someone you love or for the Church or the world. This will help us to focus our prayer each day.

Each day of the Novena, I ask that you follow in the book that will be provided. There are directions, reflections and prayers. Please commit to take some time each day to pray the Novena.

In addition to the prayers, we ask that you consider being a part of some or all of the "events" of the Novena. You do not *have* to be part of any of them....but I hope you will. There is more information in these pages, but let me draw you attention to a few of the "event" type things:

<u>Solemn Evening Prayer</u>—This Wednesday. We will begin the Novena this Wednesday. Please try to come and pray with us at 7 p.m. in the Church.

<u>Day of Service and Mercy</u>—This Thursday. We would like each member of SJE to do some spiritual or corporal work of mercy. Did you forget them? Don't worry—they're on page 7 of this bulletin. It may be as part of an organization or something you do individually. Whatever you do, remember you do it in the service of the Lord and His people.


<u>Day of Fasting</u>—This Friday. We ask all parishioners to fast this Friday. To fast is to refrain from something, usually food but not limited to that. (How about that smartphone?) This absence links us to the poor and the vulnerable. It also reminds us that ultimately it is God alone who provides, not the things of this world. We ask everyone to fast and pray especially for victims of child abuse. As a church and a local community, we have seen this pain. Let us turn it all over to the Lord.

<u>Day of the Cross</u>—Monday, March 9th—We welcome Creative Ministries to SJE for a presentation of Journey, Cross and Crucifixion. This will take place in the Church at <u>7:30 p.m.</u> on Monday.

<u>Day to "Catch Up"</u> - Tuesday, March 10, 2020—Did you forget to fast? Failed to do your acts of charity and mercy? No problem. Use this day of the Novena to catch up or to fast and serve a little more!

<u>Day of Spirit</u>—Wednesday, March 11, 2020—A special call out to our young people for this great 3 on 3 tournament. See the enclosed flyer for more info!

<u>East End Holy Hour</u>—Thursday, March 12, 2020—This will conclude the Novena. We welcome Fr. Jim Donovan, S.J. to lead and preach at the Holy Hour.





I hope you can create the time and space needed to enter more fully into this Novena of Grace. The hope for us as individuals is that we might receive answer to our prayer—God's answer, not ours. Our hope, too, as a parish is that great fruit will be born from this Novena of Grace. You can see signs of it—desire for more people to be part of Exposition of the Blessed Sacraments, the beginning of plans for 2023 and more.

As you can probably relate, I have a connection to this Novena. Bishop Murphy ordained me to the priesthood on the 3rd of December, the feast of St. Francis Xavier. Someone introduced the Novena of Grace to me soon after and, honestly, it has made a major impact in my personal, spiritual, and pastoral life. I hope the same will be true for you!

Our Lady Queen of Apostles, pray for us! St. John the Evangelist, pray for us! St. Francis Xavier, pray for us! All holy men and women, pray for us!

And, if you can, please say a prayer for me.

What is this????

Eucharistic Adoration is simply being with Jesus. The same Host which is consecrated at Mass is put on display in a ornate liturgical device known as a monstrance for the faithful to come and adore. As Catholics we believe that Jesus is truly present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in Holy Communion. There is no "right" or "wrong" way to go to adoration. You just have to be with Jesus. It is kind of like being in front of the sun, just being there will eventually give you



a tan! Being with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration changes us, which in turn helps us to become saints and change the world.

Yes, that's right, being with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration is that powerful. Don't believe me? Here's what St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta had to say:

"What will convert America and save the world? My answer is prayer. What we need is for every parish to come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in Holy Hours of prayer."

Maybe this Lent instead of "giving something up" you can instead "do nothing". That's right, do nothing and just be with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration and you can even help save the world in the process!

We hope, after the Novena of Grace, to offer additional times for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 3 – 7 p.m. Mondays – Thursdays here in Seton Chapel beginning Monday, March 16th. This will be a great blessing for our parish and will require a weekly commitment from many.

The 3:00 p.m. hour will begin with Exposition and the Liturgy of the Hours then continue with the Divine Mercy Chaplet and the Three O'Clock Prayer. The hours from 4 - 6:30 p.m. will be silent. Evening Prayer will begin at 6:30 p.m. and conclude with Benediction.



The Novena of Grace, nine day of prayer, originated in the 1600s and became more popular after St. Francis Xavier was canonized a saint. This novena traditionally takes place from March 4 - 12. We will celebrate the Novena of Grace here at SJE this Lent.

ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence.

Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Good Friday fast and abstinence.

The Art & Environment Ministry invites parishioners to take part in a very special Lenten Journey.

We are looking to reflect, pray, and create our own personal action or commitment during the weeks of Lent. After reflecting on how we would like to grow with Christ, we would like to write those thoughts, commitments and actions on paper and place in the jars located on the sanctuary steps. These reflection slips will then be put together as a paper chain, connecting us as a community on a Lenten Journey towards Christ. Please feel free to write as many reflections as you'd like.

LENTEN LITURGICAL NOTES



· The Gloria (Glory to God) is not said or sung during Lent, except on the Solemnity of St. Joseph (Thursday, March 19th) and the Solemnity of the

Annunciation (Wednesday, March 25th). We will sing the Gloria again at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and then again at the Easter Vigil.

- The Alleluia is omitted from all hymns and as the Gospel Acclamation during Masses.
- · We will use the Apostles' Creed instead of the Nicene Creed. The Roman Missal (#19) clearly encourage the use of the Apostles' Creed during the seasons of Lent and Easter. It is a good practice to get used to. We will try to have these on cards.
- · We will use simpler Mass settings during the season of Lent.
- During the time when the gifts of bread and wine are brought forward and the altar prepared, there will be no music—instrumental or otherwise. (We'll make an exception for Laetare Sunday, the 4th Sunday of Lent.) It is our hope this will help us to reflect more on what has been proclaimed and preached during the Liturgy of the Word and enter more fully into the sense of the Lenten season.
- · During Weekday (Daily Mass), we will not sing an Entrance Hymn or a Closing Hymn as is our custom here.

On Long Island there aren't satisfactory transportation options for the growing population of seniors. Many that we serve can't wait outside for long periods of time for those services that are available."
