

Turning Aside

MISSING IT?

Dear Parish Family:

Today's first reading is a favorite of a friend of mine. I have heard him preach often about it and each time I hear the reading and the reflections he offers I generally find something new to consider. In preparing for this Sunday's readings I heard it a little differently this time. It's probably because of my own life —which we must always bring to our reading of Scripture—but also because of the *Liturgy of the Hours*. In the Office of Readings—usually prayed early in the morning—the readings for the first five weeks of Lent are from the book of Exodus telling the story of the events leading to the Passover and the story of God's people.

If you look back a few verses before today's first reading, Moses did not wind up in this place by his own choosing. He had actually killed an Egyptian, was found out, saved women who were about to harassed by shepherds, married one of the women he saved....and became a shepherd for his new father-in-law. Not a bad turnaround for a few verses! This all leads to the encounter in today's first reading.

Moses is on a mission. He had a job to do, if you will. Yet he stopped long enough, pulled away from the task at hand, and "turned aside" (Exodus 3:4) to see what was happening. This uniquely burning bush caused him to stop for a moment and see. Then notice what happens, "God called out to him from the bush: Moses! Moses!" (Exodus 3:4).

There it is! Stop. Turn aside from all we are doing. Take some time. Let God find you! Let God find me! Then, get ready for some sparks as God builds a beautiful relationship with Moses and his people—certainly with ups and downs—but one that endures.

Some time last year at Mass I shared this poem from the late Father Francis Doerff, a priest of the Norbertine community, entitled *Lightening the Load*.

The first thing we have to do is to notice that we've loaded down this camel with so much baggage we'll never get through the desert alive. Something has to go. Then we can begin to dump the thousand things we've brought along until even the camel has to go and we're walking barefoot on the desert sand. There's no telling what will happen then. But I've heard that someone, walking in this way, has seen a burning bush.

This week, what can you and I turn aside from? I bet if we can we create the space God will call out and call us nearer and nearer to him.

Please, if you can, say a prayer for me.







LET'S HAVE A GOOD LENT!

Vespers-Evening Prayer*

SATURDAYS & SUNDAYS AFTER THE EVENING MASSES

"Vespers is celebrated in the evening when the day is drawing to a close, so that 'we may give thanks for what has been given us during the day, or for the things we have done well during it".

-Introduction to the Liturgy of the Hours

Beginning this weekend, we will pray Evening Prayer after the 5 p.m. Saturday evening Mass and after the 6 p.m. Sunday Mass. We will gather in the seats by Our Lady's Chapel. You don't need to bring anything but you! The leader or presider of the prayer will guide through this prayer. Generally, Evening Prayer is about ten minutes in length.



ABSTINENCE and FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

Easter PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space.



Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals throughout the remainder of the year. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.

A nice tradition has developed over the years at SJE. Members of the parish who had lost family members in the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one to assist with the costs related to the candles. If you and/or your family would like to do that, we would be most grateful and appreciative. You can send a donation to the Parish Office. Please note clearly that it is for the new Paschal Candles and list the name of who you wish to remember.


Great things are happening during these Lenten days at Our Lady Queen of Apostles, the Catholic School in Center Moriches right here on the grounds of SJE.

Works of Mercy.

On Friday, March 11, fourth and fifth graders in Ms. Pirraglia's Theology classes put their learning into action by making wash up kits for our Street Ministry. This is one of the 40 ways for 40 days at SJE so our fourth and fifth graders are on their way.

Faith Beyond the Walls.

The advanced technological advancements at OLQA allowed students to learn about their faith beyond the walls of a classroom. Students in seventh grade Theology went through a tour of the Chartes Cathedral in France and then linked with Fr. Michael Holzmann of Holy Cross in Nesconset, NY to study the different styles of architecture in that church building.





Students in sixth grade Theology joined in a lecture and discussion with Fr. Jacob Onyumbe, professor of Scripture at Université Notre Dame de Tshumbe, Sankuru in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Fr. Jacob taught about the scripture story of the Sacrifice of Isaac and gave some unique perspectives about the early stories in the Book of Genesis....and, of course, what life is like in the Democratic Republic of the Congo! (Because of lim-

ited internet access in the DRC, we had to go sort of "old school" using Fr. John's cell phone and Google Voice—bottom picture— for a speaker phone call for part of the conversation!)

VIRTUS TRAINING



All volunteers interested in offering their gifts and talents at SJE must attend a VIRTUS training session. (If you are coming to SJE from another parish and have taken the training you do not need to take it again.) You do not need to take the class at SJE.

To sign up for a class, you must sign up for this class via <u>virtus.org</u>. All volunteers at SJE must attend a VIRTUS training, complete a background check (linked to the VIRTUS sign up) and complete regular safe environment updates

via email sent from VIRTUS.

ONGOING VIGILANCE

We are in the process of updating our volunteer lists for submission to the Office of Child Protection and Safety in the Diocese of Rockville Centre. Some good reminders if you are a volunteer at SJE:

- Complete monthly email updates received from VIRTUS.org (make sure you are receiving them!).
- Wear your ID badge at all parish events and activities at which you are working (employees) or volunteering. If you need a new badge, please contact Michael Walsh at 631.878.0009 or email to mwalsh@sjecm.org.

NEW BACKGROUND CHECKS

Are you an active volunteer in our Parish? Were you background screened prior to 2017? If you answered 'Yes' to both questions – it is time to be rescreened.

To facilitate this process the Diocese has made the background screening application available on-line. Within the next few weeks, you will receive an email from Virtus advising you to log into your Virtus account.

Please follow the prompts when you log into your Virtus account (www.Virtus.org). You will be directed to complete the Sterling Solutions background screening application. For security reasons-please complete the application in one session and be sure to hit the 'submit' button when completed. If you interrupt the process, you will be locked out of the system.
