

Holy Week 2018

A Week for Losers

Dear Friends:

I was coming down the stairs in the Rectory this evening and Fr. Michael saw me and said, "Are you OK?" I guess I had a look. I said, "Yeah, I just had a lot of losing today." Honestly, it was just one of those days—especially on a Monday. I wouldn't say anything major just tons of smaller things. In the midst of a few hours, we had some challenges with the contractors on our restoration of the



church building, advocacy and restorative justice work for a young man in jail is taking a longer time than I hoped, a young person I work with cannot catch a break and the challenges of all of these changes in the Catholic schools on the East End are causing some understandable distress for faculty, families and students at OLQA. Not to mention a looming early bulletin deadline:). Just not a lot of wins today.

It's a good week to look at losing. For most of this Holy Week, we focus on what are apparently losses in the life of Jesus. Betrayal, denial, suffering, pain, abandonment, grief, loss. What a week to call "HOLY".

Yet if we approach this week as we are called, it might just be the week we need, particularly if we feel like we're in a bit of a losing streak. We come today—Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord— to enter the story of the Passion. A story of losing. Yet, we do so, knowing that "We hold the death of the Lord deep in our hearts. Living, now we remain with Jesus the Christ" (refrain from our Communion Hymn this week). Remaining with Him, we are not going to be defeated.

We have the privilege this Monday to admit the losses that are our faults—our sins. Throughout Long Island, Queens, Brooklyn and New York, churches will be open from 3 p.m. to 9 p.m. to hear your confession and mine. Here at St. John's we'll be hearing confessions in Seton Chapel (in the Convent building - the white house).

We enter the Triduum this Holy Thursday evening mindful of some of the ways we are called to serve and to be strengthened. Undoubtedly, there are some losses in this work (see the first paragraph). Jesus washes the feet of his betrayer and the one who denies him. Talk about taken advantage of? Yet we come to be mindful of our need to serve, to wash feet, to lay down our lives at all costs. We recell the strength and nourishment to do this, to enter the garden, to embrace the cross through our Celebration of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday night.

We come to celebrate the greatest sacrifice made for us on this Friday we call "Good". We listen again to a story of passion. It is a story we enter into ever aware of the "deaths" - the crosses, pains and struggles -of our own lives. We "behold the wood of the cross" uniting our prayers for Mary and John and its foot. In Jesus pain and suffering, we are redeemed. Perhaps not losers after all?

And we come to Holy Saturday and the celebration of the Easter Vigil. Darkness turns to light. Filled tomb to an empty one. Despair to hope. Death to new life. Sadness to joy. Wins to losses. We prepare and bless a new Paschal Candle, listen to the story of our salvation proclaimed, celebrate the new life in Baptism of the Elect and celebrate the Eucharist renewed in Easter joy! Alleluia is once again our song.

So now it's Tuesday morning –very early. It's a new day. I began today in prayer and am now finishing this letter. Hopefully, there will be a few more wins today. If not, it's a great week ahead for transformation from losing to winning. I hope you can be a part of it. It might just be the week you need.

On this holy and solemn morning, we come together to hear God's Word, chant the psalms and unite as we wait at the empty tomb. The Blessing of Easter Foods will take place at the end of Morning Prayer.

The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night + 7:30 p.m. —Auditorium + Presider: Fr. Michael

We will gather together at 7:30 p.m. outside the doors of the Auditorium and bless the new fire and Paschal Candle. We will be led by the light of the Paschal candle (the symbol of the Risen Christ) into the darkened Church spreading among us the Light of Christ. (If you do not wish to be part of the procession, we ask that you remain in the Church.) The Easter Vigil is one of the most beautiful services of the entire liturgical year. During the Vigil, we celebrate the Paschal Mystery – Jesus Christ has gone through death to new life – in a most prayerful and spirit-filled way! The Easter Vigil is much more than just "Easter Mass" – it is the heart of who we are as the people of God. We are renewed because we hear God's Word, renew our Baptismal vows, celebrate the Easter sacraments with the Elect of our parish and share in the gift of the Eucharist.

SPECIAL NOTE CONCERNING GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION

On Good Friday, our parish will take up the annual Good Friday Collection for the Holy Land. Please help support our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land by giving to the Good Friday Collection. This Pontifical Collection allows the Franciscans and others to continue caring for Christianity's holiest sites and for God's people in the Holy Land. Your Good Friday Holy Land Offering envelope should be placed in one of the baskets as you enter or leave the church on Good Friday. No formal collection will take place. Baskets will be left at the doors of the Church to receive your offering. Thank you for your attention to this, and for your generosity in supporting the churches in the Holy Land.

ABSTINENCE AND FASTING ON GOOD FRIDAY

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Good Friday. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse, but keep in mind that a serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Good Friday fast and abstinence. This Paschal Fast is to be considered sacred and, if at all possible, consideration should be given to prolonging it through Holy Saturday as a way of coming, with spirit uplifted, to the joys of the Easter season.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA

One of my favorite devotions that helps me enter more deeply into the celebration of Holy Week and Divine Mercy Sunday is the Divine Mercy Novena, which begins on Good Friday. Pope Saint John Paul the Great said, "There is nothing that man needs more than Divine Mercy ... which raises man above his weakness to the infinite heights of the holiness of God."



In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Pamphlets will be made available to those who are interested in praying the Divine Mercy Novena. Our special activity schedule for Divine Mercy Sunday – April 8th is as follows:

- **-12PM Parish Mass** with the Solemn Blessing of the Image of Divine Mercy
- -Eucharistic Procession to Seton Chapel immediately following 12PM Mass
- **-Solemn Exposition** of the Blessed Sacrament in Seton Chapel from 1-4PM with Confessions available. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited at 3PM, the Hour of Mercy. *For more information please email me at mplona@sjecm.org or call the rectory at 631-878-0009 ext. 111.*

REBUILD + REPAIR + RESTORE

Your people shall rebuild the ancient ruins; the foundations from ages past you shall raise up; "Repairer of the breach," they shall call you, "Restorer of ruined dwellings." -Isaiah 58:11-12

The restoration of our Church building continues—even if we have hit a few bumps. We are pushing

hard for a June completion date but cannot at this point commit to a certain date. Once the restoration is complete and we pass inspections, we will celebrate a liturgy to re-consecrate the Church building with Bishop Barres.

Here's what we are up to:

- Our sprinkler systems is fully installed and the ceilings are now closed up and ready for paint (after a few other pieces).
- The new floor is about to be stained and should be completed by the time you read this.
- New steel supports are arriving for the organ speakers. The speakers because of their size will now be in the back of the church building.
- HVAC crews are working "down under" in the basement to complete the installation of the HVAC system.
- Our Stations of the Cross are being refurbished and are almost complete.


