A Message from Deacon Michael...

So how is your Lent going? As we enter the third week of Lent, it is a good time to take stock and review how well we are holding to our original resolutions to give more time to prayer, temper our wants through fasting and abstinence, and practice greater mindfulness of the needs of others through almsgiving. The forty days of Lent mean that our attempt to live more for God and for others, and



less for ourselves, is not a one-and-done affair, but a sustained effort that means a daily trying again to find concrete ways to be more generous and less selfish. Perseverance in our noble resolutions is a beautiful gift we can give to God this Lent only in a gradual, deliberate and recurring way.

Personally, this Lent for me has not unfolded as a steady progress of growth in holiness, rather my initial enthusiasm has slackened off and my efforts to pray, fast and give alms have been more hit-ormiss. One of my resolutions was to spend less time on my phone, and while I was pretty good about that during the first week of Lent, my phone told me that my screen time went back up last week. Giving up Wordle for Lent has not been smooth sailing. I have been inconsistent in the extra prayer time I set for myself, and I continue to shortchange the hardest of the spiritual practices, almsgiving.

To be frank, failing to live up to my Lenten resolutions is a normal feature of all my Lents. I could almost take as a personal motto what St. Paul wrote in Romans 7:19, "For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do - this I keep on doing." As a result, I used to get discouraged, and then often gave up putting in the extra effort to try and keep doing Lenten practices. I let my weakness be an excuse for not persevering. Has this ever happened to you: remember that it's a Friday in Lent only after you've taken two bites into the hamburger you ordered for lunch? Did you let that mistake excuse yourself from the obligation to abstain from meat later that day? Did you say to yourself, "since I've already blown it, I may as well have steak for dinner?" Do you let the experience of weakness, the lack of success in becoming a more noble version of yourself, become a justification to give up trying? God is much more pleased with perseverance than with perfection.

Lent is not meant to be about filling a book with gold stars for each day of perfect performance. Lent is not really about what we do for God. Lent is about learning how deeply we need Jesus Christ. Trying to be a more prayerful, less selfish, and more generous version of yourself is not easy. It takes sustained effort, and in our weakness we discover we can't really do this on our own. When you find you are failing to live Lent well, don't let your weakness be an excuse to give up. In your weakness, turn to Jesus. His grace is there for the asking. Indeed, our faith teaches us that the grace every Christian needs for Lent was merited by Jesus by his forty days of prayer and fasting in the desert. Jesus made himself weak with hunger so that we would have the grace we need in our struggles. So keep going this holy season, even if it's more a matter of stumbling than walking. When you find yourself failing to pray, fast and give as God is calling us to do; do not give up on Lent. Let your weakness be the reason to rely even more upon Jesus and his grace. With his grace, you can try again, and by moving past your disappointments, you can keep journeying to Easter. It's all about perseverance, not perfection!

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

There are times when we feel like we are in the right place at the right time, and times we feel like we are in the wrong place at the wrong time. During the season of Lent, I try to make the Stations of the Cross everyday. Lately when I come to the Fifth Station where Simon of Cyrene is taken out of the crowd to help Jesus carry the cross, I think of how he must of felt that he was in the wrong place at the wrong time. ultimately, he was in the right place at the right time. He had the unique privilege that none of the apostles or any followers of Jesus had - he literally helped Jesus to carry his cross. In one of the booklets I use to pray the Stations by St. Pope John Paul II, he has these thoughts about the Fifth Station: "Simon of Cyrene, called upon the carry the cross, doubtless had no wish to do so.... They called on him, Simon of Cyrene, father of Alexander and Rufus. They summoned him, they compelled him. How long did he go on resenting being forced into this? We do not know. St. Mark simply records the names of the Cyrenian's sons, and tradition has it that they were members of the Christian community close to St. Peter." That his sons became part of the first generation of the Church must have made him look back on that fateful day and be grateful for the opportunity to help the Son of God carry His cross.

Last Sunday's Gospel (Mark 9:2-10) recounted how Peter, James, and John were absolutely in the right place at the right time, as Jesus took them up a high mountain and was transfigured before them. They saw Him in his heavenly glory with Moses and Elijah and heard the voice of God the Father: "This is my beloved Son, listen to him." Whenever we are physically and mentally in "right spiritual place" we too are uplifted, encouraged, and filled with gratitude. But where is that "right spiritual place"? It is not a place but a mind and heart that comes to see the goodness of those we are with and how we are enriched and blessed to be with each other, which in turn is a blessing from God. God's presence in our personal lives enriches us as we spend quality time and attention in prayer and spiritual reading. Lent is a gift to us to rise above all the gadgets and reports we have at our fingertips and quietly spend time in prayer, that is, in God's presence. Any time we spend quality time with a loved one we come away energized, grateful, and joyful. Spending quality time in prayer does not make us naive fools but people grounded in the very essence of our being, people thriving in the very image and likeness in which God created us, His Image and Likeness.

Last weekend we listened to a woman involved in

the Forty Days for Life in front of Planned Parenthood in Patchogue. The goal of our physical presence is not to condemn but to offer concern and truth about the



wonder, beauty, and awe of a child conceived in the womb of his or her mother. The right place and time is not easy for everyone in that situation. When I have prayed in front of Planned Parenthood in Smithtown I would hold a sign saying - We Will Help you have your baby. The goal is not to condemn but to offer the right words at the right time in the right place.

As we continue our journey through Lent I encourage and invite you to take some quiet time to pray, say the Rosary and reflect on the Mysteries, pray the Stations of the Cross, read the Scriptures for Mass everyday (go to the USCCB website and sign up for it - I did), come to weekday Mass, and/or make a visit to the Chapel in the Convent where the Blessed Sacrament is on the altar from 3:00 PM to 7:00 PM Monday through Friday. These are ways to help make wherever we are the right place at the right time with the right attitude.

I offer this Psalm (63) and prayer from the breviary:

O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting.

My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water.

So I gaze on you in the sanctuary to see your strength and your glory.

For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise. So I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands. My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy.

On my bed I remember you.
On you I muse through the night
for you have been my help;
in the shadow of your wings I rejoice.
My soul clings to you;
your right hand holds me fast. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Father, creator of unfailing light, give that same light to those who call to you. May our lips praise you; our lives proclaim your goodness; our work give you honor, and our voices celebrate you for ever.



When he had worldly thoughts, although he felt good while thinking them, he noticed that afterward the feelings left him empty. He continued reading spiritual books, growing in wisdom. God was leading him, fulfilling His Plan for him to be a great saint & to teach us. God's plan for us is the same, the process is slow.

As women who love Jesus, we need & want to learn to recognize Jesus' voice & grow closer to Him. At times we feel inadequate, wondering is this Jesus speaking, me or the enemy? In our group we begin to see we're all equal, with the problems, emotions, weaknesses. confusion, strengths, desires, fears, doing the best we can, we don't have to be perfect. Jesus consoles us through our love for each other. If you feel desire to come but are fearful, we understand because we've been there & at times still are, so just come as you are, no rules or requirements, you don't have to read or share. We respect the privacy of others, sharing is anonymous!


