The Scorp from the Corp...

"God created the great sea monsters and all kinds of crawling living creatures with which the water teems, and all kinds of winged birds. God saw that it was good."

In the spring of 2019, SJE's community garden, *Heaven's Harvest,* was beautifully constructed by an Eagle Scout. A garden committee was formed, and visions of raised beds teeming with juicy beefsteak tomatoes, pungent broccoli, ginger-hued carrots, and all manner of vegetables danced in our heads, all to be distributed through Ernie's Place or used by the Street Ministry. It was to be an innovative way of using our time, talents, and treasures to serve our neighbors in need.

At one early planning meeting, Alex, our former social worker, casually inquired if we'd be having chickens. The question had been posed to him by a mentor to the group, and Alex was merely relaying it to us. While most members in attendance were incredulous at best, the notion caught the attention of Mike and I, ardent animal lovers who naively thought that raising chickens at Church had to be easier than having full-time responsibility of chicken-keeping at home. We also loved the concept of donating the eggs to Ernie's Place. How innocent we were!

We soon realized that the neophyte Chicken Ministry would have to be a distinct entity, apart from the Garden Ministry. Word of the idea had spread to Fr. Michael, whose enthusiasm knew no bounds. We, of course, needed to get Fr. John on board. We left that task to Fr. Michael, while we read and researched, explored coops, and even attended a chicken care class at Agway.

By November 2019 Fr. Michael had enlisted parishioner Rene' and his team to erect a coop, and the four "Golden Girls"- Rose, Blanche, Sophia, and Dorothy, became the inaugural pets of SJE. Pets yes, but they had a job to do -laying eggs for Ernie's Place consumers.

Did I mention that Fr. Michael's enthusiasm knew no bounds? With a couple of months, Fr. Michael's passion for poultry led him to order ten more chicks as well as furtively adding a rooster, Stanley, to the flock.

Mike and I eventually mastered the art of the google doc to ensure daily coverage and learned how to soak a rooster's foot to treat *Bumblefoot*. We learned that chickens do indeed have a pecking order, and despite their more endearing qualities, they can be mean to one another to the point of drawing blood, and worse.

Although Mike and I were "ministry leaders", there was comfort in knowing that Fr. Michael was supervising the operation and that the big decisions would ultimately fall to him. That comfort dissolved in the summer of 2020 when we discovered Fr. Michael was being transferred to a new assignment. Fr. John had neither the time nor the inclination to immerse himself in the daily trappings of chicken keeping. That meant that we needed to rely solely on our small but dedicated group of volunteers, led by Sr. Ann, who kept her finger on the pulse of all things chicken related.

One of the first major decisions that had to be made after Fr. Michael's departure concerned Stanley, the Rooster. Adorned in magnificent plumage, he was just too large and exuberant, and had inadvertently hurt Rose to the point of her needing Veterinary care and a period of convalescence away from the flock. We needed to find Stanley a safe home (no soup pot), -not an easy task on Long Island, where roosters are illegal in certain townships. We eventually secured a new location for him; further crises of that nature thus averted.

It has been over three years since the inception of the SJE Chicken Ministry. We lost the eyes and ears of the operation when Sr. Ann retired last June, and we've seen volunteers come and go. We've driven to the Vet in Southold too many times to count, as well as losing chickens to illnesses that seemingly sprung up overnight and others that persisted despite our best efforts. Still, we carry on with our purpose. Beyond producing eggs, our goal has always been to instill a sense of teamwork and camaraderie in our always small, but always mighty, ministry. We had sweatshirts made with Psalm 91:4 emblazoned on the back: *"He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge."*

These animals belong to us, the parish family of St. John the Evangelist. and whether they are just pets or are pulling their weight by laying eggs, we will care for them, and pray to the patron Saint of chicken farmers, St. Brigid of Ireland, for her intercession in their protection. What these feathered



We ponder and contemplate why our five remaining hens (Rosie, Brigid, Bernadette, Louise, and PioPio) are not prolific layers and why two members of the flock suddenly died in one weekend a few months ago. The fear of bird flu looms large. For now. though, we must patience practice



and acceptance of the way things are rather than the way we'd have them be. Loredana, a member of our ministry, encouraged me to offer up to God the sufferings these chickens sometimes cause. "*Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if*



That our parish was served for over thirty years by 'Sister Ann'. Not one, but two.

Our first 'Sister Ann', was Sister Ann Kathleen Bolton.



Sister Ann Kathleen, devoted 72 years of her life faithfully as member of the Dominican Sisters of Amityville. She received her Dominican habit on August 7, 1948. It was not until 1984 that Sr. Ann Kathleen arrived here at St. John's, and began teaching at our parochial school. Her stay was interrupted for an

assignment in North Carolina at a medical facility. She returned to our parish intending to go into hos-

pital work but there were no open positions. Our Pastor at the time, Fr. McDonald. had another idea: she could start an Outreach Program in the parish. Sr Kathleen started Ann the program in 1992 and loved the ministry, especially as it related to the seniors; in turn people loved her. An offshoot of her efforts was the Thrift Shop, that



still thrives today. In 2009 Sister realized it was time to retire and moved to the convent at St. John the Baptist in West Islip. Failing health necessitated another move in 2011. Sr. Ann Kathleen Bolton passed in February of 2019. Her legacy to us is very much alive and well today.

Our second 'Sister Ann', was Sister Ann Berendes. Sister Ann is member of the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Around 1985 Sister Ann was living and working in Palm Coast, Florida as a Bereavement Facilitator. She had been there for seven years at that point. One day, with little notice she was advised that her contract would not be renewed; the parish could no longer afford her services. Like any good networker, Sr. Ann got wind that there might





be an opportunity becoming available in Center Moriches, because a Sister there would be retiring. St. John's Pastor at the time, Fr. Joe Coschignano was made aware of Sister Ann's availability, invited her in for an interview, and subsequently hired her on the spot. Fr. Joe asked that she start as soon as practical so that Sr. Ann Kathleen would provide the required familiarity with the growing Outreach Program. Sr. Ann Berendes served the pastorships of Fr. Joe, Fr. Walter Kedjierski and Fr. John Sureau, for a total of 13 years. Like Sr. Ann Kathleen, Sr. Ann worked closely with the Seniors in the parish. However, in Sr. Ann's opinion, she felt her most successful endeavor was with the Bereavement Group. Additionally, Sr. Ann was very active in the Extraordinary Ministry For The Homebound. Like Sr. Ann Kathleen, Sr. Ann also spoke of her time spent in the Thrift Shop where, in her words "We prayed, laughed, planned celebrations, and just enjoyed being together." Sr. Ann retired from parish ministry in

June of 2022, and began a new ministry at the motherhouse of the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Scranton, Pa. We've been a very fortunate parish to be served by the Sister Ann's!
