What have we "seniors" been up to? We have continued **praying the Rosary every day**—seven days a week—and we keep hoping that more people will join us. Some people choose to return because they still need support, and they are always welcome. We meet every Wednesday usually for 9-10 weeks at 10:30 until 11:45 in case someone would like to attend the noonday Mass. Because we are a support group, we should have at least 4 members otherwise is not a support group. We do use a journal book and if you can, we ask a \$10 donation.

Please, if you or someone you know can benefit from these meetings, encourage them to come. Often attendees have said that the second year is worse than the first. They manage to get through the first months but then realize that they need others who have suffered in much the same way as they have. Family and friends are fine, but strangers are often the best supporters.

Lent 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Lent is a journey from the desert of death to the springs of new life. We follow Jesus into the wilderness of the desert to renew our baptismal covenant with the Father. During this sacred time, we die to sin, and washed clean from our self-centeredness and attachment to the world, rise to divine grace and love. As we enter this privileged season, let us reflect once more on the three means we employ during this forty-day journey of penance and conversion: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Prayer. Prayer is most simply a conversation with God, and St. Paul reminds us that this conversation must be continual. The Apostle to the Gentiles enjoins us to "pray at all times" (Eph 6:18), "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess 5:17), and "be constant in prayer" (Rom 12:12). To pray this way requires effort. It demands silence, artful listening, and remaining in the presence of God. This Lent we remember two powerful ways we enter into this holy conversation: by sitting in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament and through *lectio divina*, a prayerful reading of Sacred Scripture.

Fasting. The Church Fathers speak extensively on the power of fasting to break sin and open our hearts to the grace of God. Saint Peter Chrysologus writes: "Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others, you open God's ear to yourself" (*Sermo* 43: PL 52, 320, 322). Let us remember, too, that bodily fasting is useless unless it is joined with spiritual fasting, that is, fasting from our passions.

Almsgiving. Scripture brings the three marks of our Lenten journey together and puts the emphasis on the last: "Prayer and fasting are good, but better than either is almsgiving accompanied by righteousness ... It is better to give alms than to store up gold; for almsgiving saves one from death and expiates every sin. Those who regularly give alms shall enjoy a full life" (Tob 12:8-9). Almsgiving is better because it points to charity. We remember we are not only to give materially to those in need but also give of ourselves as we love God and neighbor.

Last October, Pope Francis invited the Church into a synod on synodality. The Holy Father wants the Church to journey together in a multi-year process listening to each other, hearing the Word and celebrating the Eucharist. As we journey towards Easter, let us be united in mind and spirit. May the spiritual exercises of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving prepare us for Easter and an experience of the power of God, which "dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty" (*The Easter Proclamation - Exsultet*). Then, alive in Christ, we can go forward evangelizing, as Pope Francis would want, with *parrhesia*: "Boldness, enthusiasm, the freedom to speak out, [and] apostolic fervor" (*Gaudete et Exsultate* 129).

May the loving presence of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who remained faithful to her son at the foot of the cross, protect and sustain us in our Lenten journey.

enten LITURGICAL NOTES

How we pray changes a bit during Lent so we may better enter more deeply into this season of conversion and transformation.

- The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* reminds us, "In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only in order to support the singing. Exceptions, however, are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts." Therefore, you may hear a little less of the organ and piano and other instruments throughout this season. We will have silence during the time of the Preparation of the Altar and the Presentation of the Gifts, except on the 4th Sunday of Lent.
- The <u>Gloria (Glory to God) is not said or sung during Lent</u>, except on the Solemnity of St. Joseph (Saturday, March 19th) and the Solemnity of the Annunciation (Friday, March 25th). We will sing the Gloria again at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and then again at the Easter Vigil.
- The <u>Alleluia is omitted</u> from all hymns and as the Gospel Acclamation during Masses. We will chant a different verse during the season of Lent until the Easter Vigil.
- We will use the <u>Apostles' Creed</u> instead of the Nicene Creed. The Roman Missal (#19) clearly encourages the use of the Apostles' Creed during the seasons of Lent and Easter. The text of the Apostles' Creed will be available in the Sunday worship aid. The text can also be found on the inside cover of the red *Ritual Song* hymnal.
- We will be using a Missal Chant during the season of Lent. Make sure you follow along in the worship aids.

Vespers-Evening Prayer*

SATURDAYS & ND SUNDAYS AFTER THE EVENING MASSES

"Vespers is celebrated in the evening when the day is drawing to a close, so that 'we may give thanks for what has been given us during the day, or for the things we have done well during it".

-Introduction to the Liturgy of the Hours

Beginning this weekend we will pray Evening Prayer after the 5 p.m. Saturday evening Mass and after the 6 p.m. Sunday Mass. We will gather in the seats by Our Lady's Chapel. You don't need to bring anything but you! The leader or presider of the prayer will guide through this prayer. Generally, Evening Prayer is about ten minutes in length.





All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

Easter PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space.



Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals throughout the remainder of the year. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.

A nice tradition has developed over the years at SJE. Members of the parish who had lost family members in the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one to assist with the costs related to the candles. If you and/or your family would like to do that, we would be most grateful and appreciative. You can send a donation to the Parish Office. Please note clearly that it is for the new Paschal Candles and list the name of who you wish to remember.

Cuaresma 2022

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

La Cuaresma es un viaje del desierto de la muerte a las fuentes de la nueva vida. Seguimos a Jesús en el desierto para renovar nuestra alianza bautismal con el Padre. Durante este tiempo sagrado, morimos al pecado, y lavados de nuestro egocentrismo y apego al mundo, nos elevamos a la gracia y al amor divino. Al entrar en este tiempo privilegiado, reflexionemos una vez más sobre los tres medios que empleamos durante este viaje de cuarenta días de penitencia y conversión: la oración, el ayuno y la limosna.

Oración. La oración es simplemente una conversación con Dios, y San Pablo nos recuerda que esta conversación debe ser constante. El Apóstol de los Gentiles nos pide que "rezar en todo tiempo" (Efesios 6:18), "orar sin cesar" (1 Tesalonicenses 5:17), y "ser constantes en la oración" (Romanos 12:12). Orar de esta manera requiere un esfuerzo. Exige silencio, escuchar atentamente y permanecer en la presencia de Dios. En esta Cuaresma recordamos dos maneras poderosas de entrar en esta santa conversación: sentándonos en presencia del Santísimo Sacramento y a través de la Lectio Divina, una lectura orante de la Sagrada Escritura.

Ayuno. Los Padres de la Iglesia hablan ampliamente del poder del ayuno para romper el pecado y abrir nuestros corazones a la gracia de Dios. San Pedro Crisólogo escribe: "El ayuno es el alma de la oración, la misericordia es la savia del ayuno. Por tanto, si rezas, ayunas; si ayunas, muestra misericordia; si quieres que tu petición sea escuchada, escucha la petición de los demás. Si no cierras tu oído a los demás, abres el oído de Dios a ti mismo" (*Sermón* 43: PL 52, 320, 322). Recordemos también que el ayuno corporal es inútil si no va unido al ayuno espiritual, es decir, al ayuno de nuestras pasiones.

Limosna. La Escritura reúne las tres marcas de nuestro viaje cuaresmal y pone el énfasis en la última: "La oración y el ayuno son buenos, pero mejor que ambos es la limosna acompañada de la justicia... Es mejor dar limosna que acumular oro, porque la limosna salva de la muerte y expía todo pecado. Los que dan limosna regularmente gozarán de una vida plena" (Tobías 12,8-9). La limosna es mejor porque apunta a la caridad. Recordamos que no sólo debemos dar materialmente a los necesitados, sino también dar de nosotros mismos, pues amamos a Dios y al prójimo.

El pasado mes de octubre, el Papa Francisco invitó a la Iglesia a un sínodo sobre la sinodalidad. El Santo Padre quiere que la Iglesia camine unida en un proceso de varios años escuchándose unos a otros, escuchando la Palabra y celebrando la Eucaristía. Mientras caminamos hacia la Pascua, estemos unidos en mente y espíritu. Que los ejercicios espirituales de la oración, el ayuno y la limosna nos preparen para la Pascua y la experiencia del poder de Dios, que "disipa la maldad, lava las culpas, devuelve la inocencia a los caídos y la alegría a los dolientes, expulsa el odio, fomenta la concordia y derriba a los poderosos" (Pregón Pascual - Exsultet). Entonces, vivos en Cristo, podemos avanzar evangelizando, como querría el Papa Francisco, con parresía: "La audacia, el entusiasmo, la libertad de hablar, [y] el fervor apostólico" (*Gaudete et Exsultate* 129).

Que la presencia amorosa de la Santísima Virgen María, que permaneció fiel a su hijo al pie de la cruz, nos proteja y sostenga en nuestro camino cuaresmal.
