#### LENTEN MISSION

#### 33 Days to Greater Glory

This week, we are going to read Week Three (pp. 85-111). While there is no official rule, try not to go too far ahead and don't panic if you fall behind. Trust that God has you where you need to be. Use your Bible and pray with the Gospel of John as you read each day's reflection in the book.

We are providing a reflection question for each day this week. If it is helpful, please use it. If not, skip it.

Sunday, March 7, 2021 – Ascending the Steps (pg. 85-89)

How do you imagine the Last Supper? Can you imagine being with Jesus and the apostles in the Upper Room? How does this chapter help you to enter more deeply into the rhythm of Holy Mass? How is the Upper Room linked to Calvary?

Monday, March 8, 2021 – Love to the End (pg. 89-92)

How can we place Jesus's "new law" of love into practice? How does this new law of love impact our life of prayer, contemplation, and desire for God?

**Tuesday, March 9, 2021** – The Father's House (pg. 93-96)

How does this chapter provide insight into the life of God, that is, the communion of the Trinity? Do we recognize more deeply that we are on a journey into the divine life of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Wednesday, March 10, 2021 – Abide in My Love (pg. 96–99)

Why is "pruning" necessary to abide in Jesus's love? What needs "pruning" in your life?

Thursday, March 11, 2021 - The Spirit of Truth (pg. 100-103)

What are the gifts of the Holy Spirit that we received at confirmation? Do we desire to grow in these gifts? Pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit in your life.

Friday, March 12, 2021 – Consecrated in the Truth (pg. 103-107)

What does it mean to be "consecrated in the truth?" How can we persevere in truth in an age that denies it?

Saturday, March 13, 2021 – A Most Beautiful Truth (pg. 107-111)

What is the significance of God's name? How did God reveal his name to Moses in the Old Testament? How can the revelation of God as Father aid our life of prayer?

# FROM THE SEMINARIAN'S DESK LENTEN "CHECK POINT"

Can you believe that we have already reached the midway point of our Lenten journey? This time can serve as a helpful "check point" in assessing our Lenten goals and practices. How are we doing with our desire to fast more this Lent? How about those goals to pray more in silence or visit the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle at church? What about that desire to be of greater service this Lent or to grow in charity and patience?

If you are like me, this Lenten "check point" can provoke some discouragement. The first few days were off to a great start and then suddenly we found ourselves back to where we started. Sometimes it seems as if we take one step forward and three steps back! Or perhaps we have fulfilled all of our "external" goals of fasting on certain days and making visits to church, but we haven't noticed any internal spiritual progress. Are we on the right track?



These questions and self-examinations are quite natural and healthy for the spiritual life. Lent is a long journey for a reason. It takes time to overcome habits and strengthen our resolve to follow Jesus to Calvary. The "metanoia" that Jesus desires, the total interior transformation and new way of seeing reality, takes time and perseverance. This transformation requires a self-emptying of our ego so that we can be filled instead with the grace of God. Think about how long it takes you to empty and fill a pool during the summer months. How much more, then, must it take for us to empty ourselves in order to be filled with the things of heaven.

A helpful tool in the spiritual life is to turn moments of discouragement into opportunities for prayer, gratitude, and self-reflection. Like the great Japanese martial artists who use the momentum of their opponents against them, we too in the spiritual life can turn the "momentum" of discouragement "against itself" by seeing grace at work. For example, if we suddenly reach for that cookie or food item that we gave up for Lent, instead of growing discouraged for failing in one of our Lenten goals, we can instead use that moment as an opportunity to grow in greater self-awareness. Why did I reach for the cookie? Was I on "autopilot"? If so, why? Where was my awareness of God? Why am I giving up cookies in the first place? These questions allow us to grow in greater freedom and provide the opportunity to turn a moment of discouragement into conversation with God through our self-reflection. Instead of soaking in self-pity we can lift our minds to God and strengthen our resolve with our newly discovered knowledge of our limitations and need for God's grace. After all, our Lenten goals have as their end and goal growth in freedom, desire for God, and awareness of our creatureliness. In this way, even moments of failure can turn into springboards of grace.

Finally, if we are tempted to fall into discouragement, we can recall that if God created the entire cosmos in a matter of days by the simple voice of his command, he can certainty work miracles in our lives with the remaining time left in our Lenten journey. At our Lenten "check point" let us take courage, be patient, and have faith in the good Lord who can bring forth great fruit in our heats if only we grant him permission and stay the course. As St. Thomas Aquinas once wrote: "we are to abide in patience until the harvest-time."

#### ABSTINENCE AND **FASTING**

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and

#### PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space. Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.



A nice tradition has developed over the years at SJE. Members of the parish who had lost family members in the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one to assist with the costs related to the candles. #### **Rental Help Support**

The Town of Brookhaven is participating in the COVID-19 Rental and Mortgage Arrears Program.



The program was established to assist low-to-moderate income residents with mortgage or rental arrears incurred on or after April 1, 2020, due to a COVID-19 related loss of income. A maximum of 6 consecutive months of arrears may be paid, subject to the cap. Funds are limited and will be available on a first-come first-served basis until they are exhausted. The funding is made

available through the Department of Housing and Urban Development CDBG-CV Program under the CARES ACT with \$2,008,854 available to assist Brookhaven residents. To apply, residents must submit an Intake Form to LIHP online or by mail. **Applications will be available**

We are one week into March and quickly approaching the third week in Lent. It is time to have an examination of conscience. How am I doing? Have my Lenten resolutions still stayed intact? Have I been reading 33 Days to Greater Glory as we have been encouraged to do? Do I take time to call 631-878-0009 X 185 for that Spiritual Thought? Have I thought of attending the Stations of the Cross at 1:00 p.m. or at 7:00 p.m. on Friday? If I can't make either of those times, did I consider making the Stations on my own? You can walk

the stations in either the Church or in Seton Chapel. Just look at the station and consider how you would fit into that situation today.

Have you considered praying the Rosary with Sister Ann and the others in the morning at 10:00? You can have your coffee or tea break. Yes, you can have a cup of your choice. Several of us do on occasion because the pause will refresh us at that time. Remember that Lent is not so much "giving up something" but rather, of doing something. I know that so many of you are doing MUCH! The bags of groceries keep coming in for the needy. It is marvelous to see! But I'm encouraging you to pray with members of the community because Jesus said, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in your midst." Yes, it is encouraging to see how many are returning to Mass both on the weekends and for daily Mass. Many are watching on Zoom or call in to pray with us or watch Mass "video streamed" from another Church.

If you have tried to reach us for the Rosary but can't get in, we have gone back to the original numbers for the Rosary: the ID is 817-2947-1841 and the PW is 560995.

Daylight Saving Time starts next weekend so it will be darker in the morning but more daylight in the evening (the clocks "Spring Ahead") which means that it will be three weeks until Easter! So, look back to see how I have prepared myself and my family to prepare Spiritually for this miraculous feast of the Resurrection!

God bless you for all you have done and are doing for others. Are you doing the same for yourself?



- 3. Instead of the marketplace, for what does Pope Francis say our souls, the ecclesial community and civil communities, should be in constant search of?

These words help us to reject the danger of making our soul, which is God's abode, a marketplace, A living in constant search for our benefit instead of in generous and solidary love. This teaching of Jesus is always timely, not only for the ecclesial communities but also for individuals, for civil communities and for society.


