## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## **DOWN THE MOUNTAIN**

Dear Parish Family:

On the Second Sunday of Lent, we read the story of the Transfiguration from one of the Gospels. The mountain is an image used so often in Scripture. It is here that so many encounter God. It is above the "everyday", it is removed from the "in and out" of everyday life, it is a place that appears to be moved from so many distractions.

As I write this second column about our prayer at the liturgy, I think there are some great comparisons to be made between how we pray at Mass and in the various liturgies we celebrate and the story of Jesus, Peter, James and John (and Moses and Elijah!) in today's Gospel. They are intensely focused in this moment. They do not, if you will, take their eyes off of what is happening.

Isn't that the posture we should have at Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (and even our times of quiet and individual prayer)? We should be so focused, so intensely focused on what is happening that we do not miss a thing. This is especially true of our participation at the Celebration of the Eucharist. Do you and I pay attention to what is happening?

When the Church speaks of full and active participation in the liturgy it has much less to do with "doing something" and much more about being "present" to the moment. What can help you to be less distracted? What about trying to come a few minutes earlier and getting yourself into a "place of peace"? This is why we have a few minutes of silence before Mass most Sundays. What about removing what might distract you during Mass (for example if you're reading this right now during Mass this is a good distraction to think about getting rid of!)? Maybe consider turning your phone off or not bringing anything that might distract you into the church?

I have been trying to leave my cell phone in my office in the rectory on weekends. I realize how easily it can be a distraction. Not only when I am using it but when I have to process what I read or who I spoke to, etc. Leaving it back home frees my mind. It is a help.

It is also good to pray not to be distracted by Mass. Let me explain. Sometimes we may not like a hymn or the way a certain presider speaks or how a reader reads and so on. We can get caught on that or distracted by it. Let God speak to you even in those moments to bring you calm and maybe even see His presence in that moment.

Now what happens with Jesus, Peter, James, and John? They have to come down the mountain! They cannot remain at the mountain. They must go back into the "real world" and face the everyday life of discipleship. So do we.

What's the difference? If we were paying attention, if we really entered into the moment, then we had better be different! If we really have encountered the risen and glorified Christ in the Word and the Eucharist (at the mountaintop, if you will), how can we come down the mountain the same? We must be changed. How can we pray the prayers of the Church and remain the same when we pray Evening Prayer or Morning Prayer? How can our encounter with the Lord in our devotions (Exposition, Rosary, Chaplet, etc.) not transform us? Even moments like the Novena of Grace should draw us in so we can go out. Here are some things to consider. Are we kinder? Are we more open to the presence of God? Are we filled with more desire to care for the poor? Are we offering forgiveness or more actively seeking to become more humble? If we're not, we're probably not paying attention. We might be distracted. We might be too caught up in ourselves! We're missing it!

On Day Four of the Novena of Grace, we prayed, "Lord, before I ever came into being you knew me and loved me. You have knit me together the way I am, and given me life and laughter, friends and the faces of kind strangers, and a world of wonder and new discovery. Grant me the freedom and the courage to discover you anew each day in the people I meet, in the places I go, in the sounds I hear and the things I see." May this be true most especially in our liturgical and communal prayer. Feetherframe rage 3

#### **VIRUS PRECAUTIONS**

Dear Parish Family:

We are all a little on edge with the recent reports of the coronavirus, flu, etc. The news of it all is at times confusing and overwhelming. As the bulletin was going to press, we received a notification from Sister Maryann Fitzgerald, S.C., the Chancellor of the Diocese of Rockville Centre about precautions all parishes are required to take effective immediately—March 4, 2020.

The good news—if you have been reading the bulletin each week you have seen the health precautions included by Msgr. DeGrocco from my last parish. If we keep following those we are in good shape!

The two changes that are temporarily in place—and different for us—are as follows:

A. We will temporarily suspend the distribution of the Precious Blood ("the chalice") at daily Mass, at the Saturday evening Spanish Mass and at funerals. We will resume this practice when we are given permission to do so. There are some parishioners who can only receive from the chalice. If that is the case, please see the priest or the sacristan before Mass. This practice may continue.

B. We will not exchange the sign of peace by shaking hands for the time being. This might be a little jarring at first but we'll get used to it. So this part of the liturgy will sound like this:

**Priest:** Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you; look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever. **People:** Amen

**Priest:** The peace of the Lord be with you always. **People:** And with your spirit.

Sing or say: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, etc....

So the priest (or deacon) will not say "Let us offer each other the sign of peace." As with the chalice, once we are given permission to resume this practice we will do so.

Thank you for your understanding with all of these things. (You can read the rest of the practices below.)

#### **LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!**

My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin that runs during the winter months. With his permission, I have reprinted it here. As we are in the midst of the winter season, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist. As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Holy Communion:</u> Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are especially encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins. If Communion ministers need to clean their hands during Mass, it must be done discreetly. The best way for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to clean their hands during Mass is to use a sanitizing liquid in the pew before coming into the sanctuary (sanitizing liquids have no place on the altar or among the Communion vessels and other sacred items on the credence table).
- Receiving on the Tongue: Faithful who normally receive Holy Communion on the tongue should refrain from receiving on the tongue and instead receive in the hand when one has a cold or is otherwise contagious. Do not spread your saliva to the hand of the Communion minister if you are sick; receive Communion in the hand instead.
- <u>Greeting of Peace:</u> Use your own discretion and best judgment when invited to exchange the greeting of peace during the liturgy; limit physical contact with others if necessary. If a handshake is not advisable, a simple bow of the head is acceptable. Do not be insulted if someone prefers to avoid shaking your hand.
- Mass Attendance: MOST IMPORTANTLY, IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE DO NOT COME TO MASS! There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are sick; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.) Personal prayer and reflection on the Sunday Scripture readings is encouraged; many people also enjoy viewing the Mass on television.

Fr. James T. Donovan, S.J., Pastor, was appointed Pastor of St. Anthony's in June, 2018. He was born in Brooklyn, New York, and grew up Malverne, Long Island. Fr. Donovan's Catholic education dates back to grammar school at Our Lady of Lourdes School in Malverne. He is an alumnus of Maria Regina Diocesan High School in Uniondale. After a career in teaching, Fr. Donovan entered the Society of Jesus. Following the novitiate, Fr. Donovan was missioned for philosophy and theology studies at Fordham University, where he also worked part-time in hospital ministry at Calvary Hospital in the Bronx and tutored at Cristo Rey High School in Harlem. For regency, Fr. Donovan taught chemistry and theology at Regis High School in Manhattan. During his years of formation, Fr. Donovan also directed retreats at the Jesuit Retreat Center in Los Altos, California, and completed intensive training in spiritual direction.

Ordained a deacon in 2012, he has served at St. Leo's Church in Oakland, California, and San Quentin State Prison while earning his Master of Divinity degree at the Jesuit School of Theology of Santa Clara University in Berkeley, California. Fr. Donovan was ordained in 2013 and his first assignment after ordination was at St. Anthony's Parish in Oceanside, N.Y. After a year at St. Anthony's he taught science at Xavier High School for two years and then spent a year at the Loyola Jesuit Center in Morristown, N.J. directing retreats.

#### **ABSTINENCE AND FASTING**

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Good Friday fast and abstinence.


