


# St. John the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church

As per the directives of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is not to be celebrated in <u>any scheduled or communal way</u> out of concern for your health and safety. Those in need of the sacrament should contact the Parish Office. The priest on duty will set a time to meet you in the church building to hear your confession (face to face or behind the screen). There are not and will not be any scheduled times for confessions in the near future.

# PRAYING FOR ONE ANOTHER IN THESE DAYS

Each day we ring the church bells at certain hours. They are a call to prayer for different groups of people impacted by the pandemic. Whether you can hear the bells or not, please consider taking a minute to stop and pray each day.

## 9 a.m. - Prayer for those infected with the virus and all who are ill

Lord, place your healing hand on those who suffer illness. Bring them to full health and ease their anxious hearts. May our prayer and the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary encourage them that they are not alone. We ask this in Jesus' Name. AMEN

## 12 p.m. - Prayer for health care workers and those attending to the sick

Lord, we are ennobled by those who put their lives at risk in caring for the sick. Keep them safe and embolden them when they are weary. We ask this in Jesus' Name. AMEN

## 3 p.m. - Prayer for first responders and essential workers

Lord, we pray for those who run to danger to keep us safe and those who serve the common good. Embrace them with your mantle of protection and comfort the fears of their families. We ask this in Jesus' Name. AMEN

#### 6 p.m. - Prayer for people of every nation and their leaders

Lord, the pandemic opens our eyes to see each other as brothers and sisters in one human family. We pray for people of every nation and their leaders, asking that they be inspired to seek the good of all and quell the voices of division. We ask this in Jesus' Name. AMEN

## 9 p.m. - Prayer for those who have died today

Lord, we grieve the passing of our sisters and brothers who have died this day. We commend them to your tender mercy, confident that nothing, not even death, will separate us from your love. We ask this in Jesus' Name. AMEN.

# THE LITURGY OF THE HOURS

The Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God (*Opus Dei*), is the daily prayer of the Church, marking the hours of each day and sanctifying the day with prayer. The Hours are a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ, using scripture and prayer. At times the dialogue is between the Church or individual soul and God; at times it is a dialogue among the members of the Church; and at times it is even between the Church and the world...The dialogue is always held, however, in the presence of God and using the words and wisdom of God. Each of the five canonical Hours includes selections from the Psalms that culminate in a scriptural proclamation. The two most important or hinge Hours are Morning and Evening Prayer. These each include a Gospel canticle: the Canticle of Zechariah from Luke 1:68-79 for Morning Prayer (known as the *Benedictus*), and the Canticle of Mary from Luke 1:46-55 for Evening Prayer (known as the *Magnificat*). The Gospel canticle acts as a kind of meditative extension of the scriptural proclamation in light of the Christ event. Morning and Evening Prayer also include intercessions that flow from the scriptural proclamation just as the Psalms prepare for it.

Liturgy of the Hours
Pray the prayer for this day, this hour!



In the Hours, the royal priesthood of the baptized is exercised, and this sacrifice of praise is thus connected to the sacrifice of the Eucharist, both preparing for and flowing from the Mass.

# SJE EASTER HOUSE BLESSINGS

Dear SJE Parish Family:

Happy Easter! Thank you for the many wonderful ways you have made these days easier for me as the pastor here at SJE. Never in my life—not only as a priest—did I imagine we would be church in the ways we have discovered. I have come across this phrase, "The Church has not been closed. It has been unleashed." over the past few days. I cannot say I felt that in the early days of all of this. I am starting to see and to feel it a bit more now.

I hope we can become even more unleashed in the days ahead!

One of the "signs" of Easter is water! Traditionally, we baptize the Elect at the Vigil and we are blessed with holy water throughout the season of Easter. We want to come to bring that gift to you and your family in the days of Easter—the great 50 days! It will be a great way to connect in a more personal way—from six feet:)! We have tried hard to connect in other ways throughout these days.

So beginning in the second week of Easter, we are going to embark on blessing houses throughout the parish. Here is how I hope it will work! First, you need to sign up by **Sunday**, **April 19—the Second Sunday of East-er/Divine Mercy Sunday**.

- We will need your family's name, phone #, email and, obviously, your address.

Second, what about being an evangelizer? Tell your neighbors about it and encourage them to sign up too!

Then, we will gather all of the information over these weeks and let you know which date and time we'll be coming by. You'll receive a message that says, "On Monday, April 41st, one of the priests of SJE will be visiting your area between the times of 1 and 4." It's sort of like when the cable repair person comes! We won't be able to give an exact time.

On the day of blessing, you are asked to keep watch. If you would like your home and family blessed, wait in your doorway or on your porch. We will say a prayer with you and give a blessing while we stand in your walkway or driveway. For safety purposes, we will not enter any homes, maintaining proper social distance as required by the authorities.

Please be patient—it won't be an "exact science" and is definitely a "work in progress"! My last parish invited their parishioners to be part of this and it was a great moment for the parishioners and the priests too!

We look forward to praying with you in these days of Easter from our home here on Ocean Avenue and now near yours as well! Happy Easter!

- 1. Talk to your family or group of friends!
- 2. Decide where you would ideally like to have a piece of the land (Church, School, The Barn, Rectory, Convent). This year, we want to add spaces by the Thrift Shop and the Stations of the Cross (behind the school). Please understand we may not be able to meet everyone's request for a space!

With precautions in place for safety and security, we are uncertain of the exact date families will be able to come on the grounds. For now, we want to get as many set up as possible. Once we receive an all clear or permission for limited planting to happen, we will contact you via phone or email.

# **Chaplet of the Divine Mercy**

In her years in the convent, St. Faustina heard a call from God to make God's mercy known to the world so that the world may more fully receive God's healing grace. St. Faustina promoted the Chaplet of Divine Mercy which consists of the recitation of prayers to the Eternal Father with the use of the rosary for the sake of Christ's sorrowful passion. As we approach Divine Mercy Sunday, all are encouraged to pray the chaplet. The Chaplet is traditionally prayed at 3 p.m. each day, marking the hour of Jesus' death on the cross, but can be prayed at any time.

The Chaplet is prayed as follows:

- 1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed.
- 2. On the Our Father beads, recite the following:

"Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

3. On the ten Hail Mary beads, say the following:

"For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

- 4. Repeat step two and three for all five decades.
- 5. Conclude by reciting three times: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."
