# A message from Fr. Felix...

People never forget the last words of their loved ones before they died. It is very important to remember those last moments of life and reflect on them as we journey through life. Christians have long pondered Christ's "seven last words", which refers to the

seven brief sayings Jesus uttered from the cross before he died. Just to be aware, for centuries, these words have been the subject of many sermons, books, devotions, as well as musical pieces. The fact that there are seven such sayings recorded in scripture is very significant.

We should not forget that in the Bible, seven is the number of perfections, the number of the covenant. It brings to mind the seven days of creation, when God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. Here God teaches us the significance of rest which we don't take seriously. Jesus gave seven last words while still on the cross. On one hand, Jesus was about to enter into his rest. After completing the work of his ministry, he entered his sabbath, the sleep of On the other hand, it points to how Christ's death was the beginning of a new creation that was about to be born. He rose from the dead and all creation was renewed. Jesus is risen, the victory is won! We are all renewed in him.

As St. Augustine states, "The tree upon which were fixed the members of him dying was even the chair of the Master teaching".



Think of these seven last words not merely as words, spoken to you. Before Jesus died, he was thinking

of us and what we would be going through this year, this month, this day. He wants to give us a certain message to encourage or challenge us.

The seven last words are:

"Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" Luke (23:34).

"Today you will be with me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43).

"Behold, your son.... Behold, your Mother" (John 19:26-27).

"My God, My God, why have you forsaken me" (Matthew 27:46).

"I thirst" (John 19:28).

"It is finished" (John 19:30).

"Father, into your hands I commit my spirit" (Luke 23:46).

The reflections that follow the seven last words can be used simply to continue our biblical journey through Christ's passion and learn more about Jesus' words from the cross.

Let us consider the biblical background for each of these words and how Jesus continues to speak to us today through them. We do not need to be afraid because Jesus Christ is Lord.

"They still did not understand from scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead". I will praise God because Jesus is alive.

The Divine Mercy Novena began on Good Friday, April 7, 2023 and concludes Sunday, April 16, 2023 – the Second Sunday of Easter – the Sunday of Divine Mercy. This novena is another way for us to reach out – or better yet – allow Jesus to reach out to us with the hand of mercy and compassion.

In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Pamphlets will be available—in Spanish and English—as you leave the Church for those who are interested in praying the Divine Mercy Novena.

Let us ask Christ for the gift of mercy. Let it engulf us and penetrate us. Let us have the courage to come back to Jesus to meet His love and mercy in the sacraments....let us feel His closeness and tenderness, and then we will also be more capable of mercy, patience, forgiveness, and love."





#### Votive Candles/Altar Candles







# Bereavement... Grieving is a natural process

Grieving is a natural process each of us goes through after

the death of a loved one. While no one can take away the sadness, others can help by listening and caring. Sharing feelings with others who have experienced the death of a loved one helps many people to heal.

St. John's Bereavement Group will begin meeting on Wednesday, April 12, 2023. Facilitated by Loretta Gallagher and Maureen Harney, our group will meet weekly on Wednesdays, for 8-10 weeks from 10am to 11:30 in the Convent. Our beloved Sister Ann started this group about 10 years ago and it has been a great support to many in our parish community who have suffered the death of a loved one. If you, or someone you know might benefit from this support community we hope that you will join us. Many of our current and former participants have shared that the second year can often be more difficult than the first, sometimes managing through the first few months with support from family and friends but realizing that others sharing the same feelings are often the best supporters. Most people also find that a group is most beneficial if started not sooner than three months after the death, however this is an individual decision, and all are welcome at any time. We do ask for a \$10 donation for the cost of the program materials. If an evening group works better with your schedule, please reach out, we are open to facilitating an additional program if there is interest.

# Sunday of Divine Mercy

Acts 2:42-47 | 1 Pt 1:3-9 | Jn 20:19-31

### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"I'll believe it when I see it." We've all said this at some point, usually in response to hearing about someone unreliable doing something out of character. St. Thomas had the same reaction in today's Gospel when he wasn't there when the other disciples saw Christ for the first time since he rose from his tomb - "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Although Jesus helped Thomas with his unbelief, he blesses those who have not seen, but believe. Have any of us seen the nail marks in Christ's hands and feet, or the wound in his side? Do we see Christ's body and blood on the altar, or do we see only the gifts of bread and wine? Christ comes to us in ways we can understand initially - parables, bread and wine, the face of people we meet throughout our daily lives - but our faith in what we have not seen, in the great mystery of our salvation, is what makes us Christian.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In today's first reading, we hear reports of the lives of the first disciples soon after Pentecost: communal living, breaking bread together, prayer, selling of their property and possessions and redistributing among themselves according to individual needs. To our ears today, this idyllic community living seems almost incredible. Yet these first disciples were infused with the Holy Spirit, who enabled them to proclaim the Gospel and think of others before themselves. As Christ's disciples today, how are we behaving toward one another? If we truly are among those who have not seen and yet believe, let's act in full confidence. As we heard in the second reading, our faith is "more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire." We certainly aren't perfect, and our faith at times can be sorely tested, and yet this is our call: to share this faith by doing good works in Christ's name to make disciples and build the kingdom of God.

**INVITATION** People often see Christ through the words and actions of others. This week, actively seek out opportunities to be the hands of Christ. What opportunities does your community have to practice corporal works of mercy?
