

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Ash Wednesday to Easter

Of Lovers and Fools

Dear Parish Family:



You might remember that we began this Lenten journey—Ash Wednesday—on February 14th. We gather today for the culmination of the Lenten journey and the mysteries of the Triduum on April Fools Day, April 1st. There are connections to be made on both ends.

The Lenten journey is a journey of love—a journey of recognizing God's profound love for us that the sent us His only Son to save us (John 3:16). I hope and pray that Lenten days, perhaps with help and activities of the parish here, have helped you to better recognize the passionate -even foolish—love God has for you and me and our need to be ambassadors of that love to all meet.

Some might look at us and our celebrations of Easter and say we are fools. To believe that someone could rise from the dead? To believe that because of the dying and rising of Christ we can move through the many deaths of our lives? To believe that the empty tomb is a symbol of a new beginning?

Maybe they're right? St. Paul writes about it in his first Letter to the Corinthians. He says, "We are fools for Christ...when reviled, we bless; when persecuted we endure; when slandered we speak kindly" (4:10, 12). Why do we bless? Endure? Speak kindly? Because we know Christ!



You know, we act pretty foolish sometimes, even here at SJE! It's what disciples do! I'm not speaking about jokes or teasing around (we do a lot of that too!). Flip through the bulletin and see...

- We're fools to work incredibly hard to support a **vital Catholic school** on our campus and in our community. It's a place that maximizes students' academic potential while transmitting the faith and values so important to us. Others look and say "Why bother?"
- We're fools to desire to instill the **faith in the young people of our community**—even when others says religion is dying. Crazy to try things like Bible Camp, Youth Ministry, Faith Formation. Others might say, "It's too late. Kids are too distracted to serve and learn in Church."
- We're fools to create **many opportunities to pray** when maybe many may not participate. From the celebration of the Eucharist, to daily Confessions, to Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Men's Prayer Group, Divine Mercy Novena, East End Holy Hour and much more. Others might say, "We're too busy to pray at Church or even at all."
- We're fools to pour out our time, talent and resources to **serve the poor and vulnerable** among us through Parish Social Ministry, Ernie's Place, the Thrift Shop, Street Ministry, Community Meal and so much more. Others might say, "Save that money and time. Things will never change."

Yes, we are fools! In the eyes of the "world" and to many who do not understand, it just doesn't make sense. They're right. It takes a risk to believe. It takes a risk to teach. It takes a risk to serve. It takes a risk to respond. It's a risk well worth it!

So have people called you a fool or something like it? Good news! You have a place here. Even better news! We're looking for more fools to join our parish family by actively responding to all that the Resurrection calls us to do. We'll never do it without you.

So what are you waiting for, fellow fool? You might just fall in love again.

Dear Friends:

Truly the Lord is risen! He is risen indeed!

Today we speak these words which echo back to the first days of Christ's resurrection. After walking with Christ on the road to Calvary, we now joyfully go forth as the disciples did on the road to Emmaus with hearts burning within us. We celebrate the moment when Christ conquered death and gave us all hope of new life.

Even after nearly 2,000 years, that moment of the Resurrection has not lost any of its power. While myths and stories eventually fade, we celebrate a historical fact, a living Person who left behind lasting evidence of his wonders, evidence that the world still seeks to understand.

This is especially true today, as we find ourselves in an historic moment—archeologists have uncovered the site of Jesus' resurrection for the first time in nearly 500 years. Within the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, scholars have restored and conducted research on the tomb of Jesus, also known as the Aedicule. Preliminary findings confirm that the heart of the structure is the same tomb that Roman Christians discovered and venerated as early as 326AD....

PRAYER AND WORSHIP

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA

One of my favorite devotions that helps me enter more deeply into the celebration of Holy Week and Divine Mercy Sunday is the Divine Mercy Novena, which began on Good Friday. Pope Saint John Paul the Great said, *"There is nothing that man needs more than Divine Mercy ... which raises man above his weakness to the infinite heights of the holiness of God."*

In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, **"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death"** (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that **"By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls"** (Diary 796).



Pamphlets will be made available to those who are interested in praying the Divine Mercy Novena. Our special activity schedule for Divine Mercy Sunday – April 8th is as follows:

-12PM Parish Mass with the Solemn Blessing of the Image of Divine Mercy

-Eucharistic Procession to Seton Chapel immediately following 12PM Mass

-Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in Seton Chapel from 1-4PM with Confessions available. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited at 3PM, the Hour of Mercy.

REBUILD + REPAIR + RESTORE

Your people shall rebuild the ancient ruins; the foundations from ages past you shall raise up; "Repairer of the breach," they shall call you, "Restorer of ruined dwellings."
-Isaiah 58:11-12

The restoration of our Church building continues—even if we have hit a few bumps. We are pushing hard for a June completion date but cannot at this point commit to a certain date. Once the restoration is complete and we pass inspections, we will celebrate a liturgy to re-consecrate the Church building with Bishop Barres.

Here's what happening this week...

- All of the ceilings and walls are in place in the main body of the Church.
- Construction work is beginning on the new set of cabinets for the organ speakers. (Because of their size, the speakers will need to be in the back of the church.)
- This week, we started the process of finalizing colors for the main body of the Church.
- **Our new polished concrete floor is complete.** This new floor makes uses of the existing concrete (no more tiles!) and is beautiful. It will now be partially covered so the remainder of the work in the body of the church can be completed. It will be much easier to maintain than our previous flooring.


ADULT CONFIRMATION
