A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Patrick ...

THE JOY OF EASTER

Happy Easter! The Tomb is empty! He is Risen! Alleluia! We now have eternity, eternity without end! We now have the fullness of salvation because of Easter! The Easter Mysteries remind us that Jesus is alive and truly risen! There is no turning back on this historical event. It cannot be undone! Whether or not we choose to believe in the power of our Lord's Resurrection, this event is permanent and everlasting. Jesus has been glorified before the world. He stands before us in all of His glory and wonder. He has saved us from our sins and opened for us the way to paradise. He has risen from the dead and sits at the right hand of the Father.

God's promise has been fulfilled and we are redeemed. We can now live in freedom and hope of new and everlasting life. Our faith in Jesus is complete because He has been lifted up from the earth. Death and sorrow and misery are at our backs. We can now look beyond this world and the grave itself as a sign of hope that promises resurrection. Now that death and darkness have been conquered, we can walk in the newness of life with Jesus Christ, our Risen Lord, close by our side. How exciting is this, this new Easter celebration, knowing all that God has done for us through Jesus!

The joy of Easter and the meaning behind Easter really puts things into perspective. It really makes us think again about the importance of God in our lives. Without Easter, we have no hope and no freedom. St. Paul says, "that if Christ had not been raised from the dead, we are the most pitiable people of all time because our faith would be in vain". Our faith would be incomplete. No Easter, no life in Christ! What separates us as Christians from other religious beliefs is that we believe that Jesus is alive and risen. We believe that He is the way, the truth and the life. It is only through Jesus that we now have eternal life, life without end! It is that simple and that important. Easter is everything! It is what gives our lives purpose and meaning, knowing that we have a future in store with God for all of eternity.

The joy of Easter is all about living again and believing again. It is about turning our

lives around. Easter invites us to live in full communion with God. It invites us to approach life more joyfully in the Lord knowing of the great love and sacrifice that



He has made for us and our loved ones. Moreover, Easter invites us into a new relationship with the Lord, knowing the profound joy He can bring us if we stay close to His side. The joy of Easter enables us to see the world differently, knowing how faithful God was to His promise. It changes us. It motivates us. Easter renews and refreshes our souls, knowing how essential this event was for us all. Easter brings us new life. It is our pathway to eternity and the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings.

This new Easter celebration is a time of joy and renewal. It is a celebration of renewed hope and faith in the Risen Lord. Even though we celebrate this great feast for fifty days, in reality Easter is every day because it never ends. It cannot be reversed. All we have to do is believe again and remain close to the Risen Lord knowing the joy He brings into our lives. The Resurrection of Christ is the very foundation of our faith. It is central to our belief and the cornerstone of our Church.

We now have victory over death because of Easter. This is why Sunday is the day of the Lord, because it was on that first Easter Sunday that everything changed. Easter threw death aside and changed our outlook on life itself. By God's power, the Tomb is now vacant! Like those first disciples who witnessed the Lord's Resurrection, we too must join them in telling the world that the Tomb is empty, and the Lord is risen. Risen forever!

Easter 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Easter to you and your families in this Jubilee Year of Hope!

Our celebration of Easter rekindles our hope each year.

The Tomb is empty! Jesus is Risen!

A wealthy man and a member of the Sanhedrin, St. Joseph of Arimathea is one of those Gospel characters with a very brief but very important role.

In John 19:38-42, we see that after Jesus' Crucifixion, Joseph of Arimathea asks Pilate for permission to take away Our Lord's Body. This was a bold and courageous act of faith from a man "seeking the Kingdom of God." (Mark 15:43)

Joseph and Nicodemus together place our Lord's Body reverently in linen cloths prepared with myrrh, aloes and spices: "Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden a new tomb where no one had ever been laid. So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, as the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there."

In his commentary on the Gospel of Matthew, Fr. Simeon Leiva-Merikakis gives tribute to Joseph of Arimathea. He writes: "And how can we fail to do homage to Joseph of Arimathea? In performing a very humane corporal work of mercy by seeking out and burying the corpse of his beloved Teacher, Joseph becomes for all time a living icon of the eternal Father himself, stooping with compassion to enfold within his throbbing breast the mangled body of his beloved, Son, whom he himself handed over to sinners out of love for mankind. At long last, the Son of God on earth has fallen into the hands, not of a sinner, but of a just and compassionate man! Joseph of Arimathea enacts the justice and love of God himself."

As we celebrate Easter Sunday, the Easter Octave, Divine Mercy Sunday and the Easter Season, let us remember and ask the intercession of the great Joseph of Arimathea who prepared the Tomb of Christ and the Body of Christ with such sensitive care and compassion, such faith, courage and reverence. The Tomb is Empty! He is Risen!

Dear Parishioners and friends of St. John The Evangelist Parish,


What a wonderful time I had with you during the Lenten mission. You have a wonderful group of priest and deacons, and a very dedicated staff.

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, April 18, 2025 and concludes Sunday, April 27, 2025 – the Second Sunday of Easter – the Sunday of Divine Mercy. This novena is another way for us to reach out – or better yet – allow Jesus to reach out to us with the hand of mercy and compassion.

In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Let us ask Christ for the gift of mercy. Let it engulf us and penetrate us. Let us have the courage to come back to Jesus to meet His love and mercy in the sacrament's let us feel His closeness and tenderness, and then we will also be more capable of mercy, patience, forgiveness, and love." - Pope Francis

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Happy Easter! Jesus has risen from the dead is a historical fact that we celebrate and contemplate today. What difference does it really make in our lives? The penitential acts and prayers of Lent lead us to this day of celebration and will continue the next 50 days until the celebration of Pentecost, June 8, 2025. What are we actually celebrating? The Resurrection of Jesus is far more than a historical fact to acknowledge. All during His earthly ministry Jesus rose above doubts, fears, skepticism and opposition. As negative and burdensome as these experiences had to be, He never gave up and never lost hope. An abyss is an immeasurable cavity or chasm. That certainly applies to what we are celebrating today - God's love and mercy in Jesus that can never be exhausted or dried up. The resurrection appearances of Jesus will be offered to us in the readings at Mass and open our minds and hearts once again to what is almost too good to be true -God's desire to embrace us with HIs mercy and love and bring us into His full presence when we die. Death is not just end of life in this world but the entrance into eternity with our God who is so beyond our comprehension and wonder with His love and mercy.

The human price Jesus paid to be faithful to redeem and save us from our sins is certainly well known - His suffering and death on the cross. The key is to not only know what He Has done for us but to open our minds and hearts in gratitude, joy, and contemplation. The thought of those we love always lifts our minds and hearts in joy and gratitude just as we lift their minds and hearts in joy and gratitude. Jesus has risen and has opened His mind and heart to us and seeks to enter our minds and hearts with the abyss of His love and mercy. Jesus never asked, "What more do I have to do?", but always, "What more can I do?" At the Last Supper, the night before Jesus gave His life on the cross for us He said, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves,

because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father." (John 15:13-15)



There are many demands made on us from many people. We have far more access to one another with all the technological devices at our fingertips than Jesus did when He walked the face of the earth 2000 years ago. He did not always get the response He was seeking but He never stopped rising above rejection, opposition, and doubt on the part of those who encountered Him. Now is our time to encounter the Risen Christ, an invitation that is constantly open to us from Him. "The tomb of Christ, who is living, The glory of Jesus' resurrection; bright angels attesting, The shroud and napkin resting. Yes, Christ my hope is arisen; to Galilee he goes before you." Christ indeed from death is risen, our new life obtaining. Have mercy, victor King, ever reigning! Amen. Alleluia.




OFFICE WORKERS

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

We meet every other Monday from 10:00-11:30 AM in the white house between the school and rectory, ending in time for 12:00 Mass if you'd like.


