FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

EASTER BREAK

Dear Parish Family:

As I write this letter, we are two days away from the Holy Week/Easter vacation. I am privileged to serve as the Principal at the Catholic School in Center Moriches, Our Lady Queen of Apostles, as well as the Pastor of St. John the Evangelist. (It's a long story but take some time to read more about OLQA on pages 2 and 7.)

Since the beginning of April, I have found myself saying more than a few times, "Everyone needs an Easter break." We have been in school for almost eight or nine weeks straight. Each member of our community—in their own



way—is a bit on edge. You can feel it. Some students have not made the best decisions on some days. Teachers and staff members are little tired. Even the Principal has probably not handled everything as well as he could handle things. Everyone needs an Easter break.

You know today we celebrate our Easter break. It's not a break or vacation, though some of us may get a few days off this week. It's a different kind of a break. It's a break from what was in the hope that something new might happen. Consider the gospels of today—either the one from the Easter Vigil or from the Easter Sunday Masses. These disciples are crushed by Jesus' death. They are doing the things we do when someone dies. Mourning. Feeling guilt. Crying. Weeping. Visiting. Caring for the body. The celebration of Easter sees a break from these things. They become a people of joy, of excitement, of hope, of mission, of commitment, of new things!

This is our hope too! With the celebrations of the Paschal Triduum and Easter, we pray that "through the renewal brought by your Spirit, (we...may) rise up in the light of life" (Collect, Easter, At Mass During the Day). So what do you need a break from and what will you turn to? I hope you find this a "breaking point" place. You might be returning to Mass today. Time to break that habit of not coming and begin to gather with us each Sunday? Do you fidn yourself not praying as much as you should and need to? Time to break that habit and begin to join us in times of devotion, adoration and quiet? Do you find yourself a little too self-centered? Time to break that habit and begin serving in one of our parish social ministries? Find yourself not being as generous as you can be? Perhaps time to break away and sacrifice more for the good of others? Are you caught up in a sinful habit or behavior? Time for an Easter transformative break to new beginnings?

So I think we're all probably in need of a break. A few days off is good for a school community. For a community a faith, Easter offers a different sort of break. It is not a break that lasts a few days but can last a lifetime—in this life and in the life to come.

Thank you for praying with our parish community today. Please, if you can, say a prayer for me.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA and PROCESSION SUNDAY, April 27, 2019

We are in the midst of the days of the Divine Mercy Novena, which began on Good Friday. Pope Saint John Paul the Great said, "There is nothing that man needs more than Divine Mercy ...which raises man above his weakness to the infinite heights of the holiness of God."



In her Diary, Jesus told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Pamphlets will be made available to those who are interested in praying the Divine Mercy Novena. Our special activity schedule for Divine Mercy Sunday – April 28th is as follows:

- -12PM Parish Mass with the Solemn Blessing of the Image of Divine Mercy
- -Eucharistic Procession to Seton Chapel immediately following 12PM Mass
- **-Solemn Exposition** of the Blessed Sacrament in Seton Chapel from 1-4PM with Confessions available. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited at 3PM, the Hour of Mercy.

Senior Ministry News

The big mystery: somewhere in outer space there is an article that I wrote last week. I thought that I had followed all the steps but obviously I didn't. Now I have a second chance to get it right!

I have been following a rather famous Catholic theologian and author for several years, a Franciscan Friar Richard Rohr, and I'd like to share a few notes of his that I've copied:

- 1. When people say, "Thy will be done, then we have to say, "my will be gone."
- 2. Each of us is a little word of the Word of God, a mini-incarnation of divine love . . . it means letting go of our control buttons.
- 3. The choices we make for the future will determine the future.
- 4. We must go through the pain of disorder to grow up and switch our loyalties from self to God . . . Life and death are not opposites. They do not cancel each other out; neither do goodness and badness. There is room for everything to belong.

Thank you to all who attended the **Stations for Seniors**. Those who came really seemed to appreciate the uniqueness of them. Perhaps the good news of their success will encourage more to come next year because as many expressed, "They really spoke to me; each week I seemed to understand more than the week before."

What else is new? We will begin another session for those who have experienced the loss of a loved one; we call it Bereavement Support. These sessions work best when there are at least 4 or more participants. After the initial loss, most people need several weeks before the "need" becomes apparent. We use a Journal book authored by a religious Sister who really understands personal loss and offers an excellent way to learn to live with this loss.

FROM THE DESK OF SEMINARIAN JOE

Over the past few weeks I have found myself in awe of the beauty that is the beginning of spring. The trees are beginning to bud with new leaves. Occasionally I'll notice a flower hidden – a bud just beginning to bloom – knowing the other flowers will begin to spring up in no time. Each year, I am amazed by these things but all it takes is one bad frost and all this work needs to start from scratch.

Back in September I had the opportunity to help organize a survey for those preparing to receive Confirmation in October. One of the questions on the anonymous questionnaire was about the teen's life of faith in relationship to his/her family. There were plenty of stereotypical answers, but one stood out the most. The teen said, "Nobody in my



family is religious and none of my friends are religious, so I'm not religious." Then he added, "I would like to be." In many ways, I saw the beauty of the spring buds in his response. Here is a teenager that hasn't been given the tools to grow in faith but has a deep desire to know Jesus Christ in his life. Just like the budding leaves and flowers that we see, this kid's faith could either be fostered by the tenderness of spring weather or frozen and destroyed.

I reflect daily if I am someone that helps others to grow in faith or if I fall short. My hope is that each of us can continue our Easter celebration by embracing the warmth of faith that will uphold individuals that are beginning to bloom in the Christian life and remember the promise of new life!

Americans throw away more than 70 pounds of textiles per person per year. The EPA estimates only 15% is donated or recycled. Since 2006 we've kept 51 million pounds of shoes and clothing out of landfills and instead created opportunities for people in need around the globe.


