A Message from Msgr. Walden...

There are certain points in our lives where we make decisions that affect who we are and how we are going to live: college, jobs, marriage, friends, to name a few crucial areas. Underlying all decisions is understanding who we are and who we will allow to become part of who we are. In contemplating the readings for today's Mass, we have a very clear picture of what it means to be a person of faith. In the second reading (First Letter of St. John 3:1-2), we have this wonderful statement: "See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are." St. John has a very clear vision and understanding of what happens when we make the leap of faith and accept and trust we are exactly that: "Children of God." In the course of our natural lives, we grow from childhood into adulthood and, in that process, we make commitments and embrace responsibilities that put meaning and direction in our lives and in the lives of others. But is it refreshing, humbling, and inspiring to see who we are and where we are as the children of God.

We did not get to who we are and where we are all by ourselves. From childhood we have the of loving, nurturing, supportive, gift and encouraging parents. In many ways we walk in their footsteps as they walked in the footsteps of their parents. It is very clear that as one generation grows and matures. another follows. We live in a very advanced society technologically. We work wonders medically and have produced countless conveniences and physical tools and devices. Yet unless we realize, accept, and understand we are on a journey to eternal life in God's presence, we lose our perspective, understanding, and direction. As much as technology has improved our lives, it also puts us in peril as we have devices and procedures when used for evil means can literally destroy our planet and ourselves.

How good, encouraging and humbling to hear the words of Jesus in today's Gospel (John 10:11-18): "I am the Good Shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for he sheep.... I know mine and mine know me." How deeply we take Jesus' words to heart is seen in our thoughts, words, and actions everyday of our lives. To the depth we let Jesus into our minds and hearts, we are humbled, joyful, and grateful for His love for us. We do not allow just anyone in the depths of our minds and hearts, to the point where they are an integral and crucial part of who we are. As the Good Shepherd, Jesus has let us into the depths of His heart as He gave His life



on the cross for us, listens to our prayers everyday, and personally enters into our very being in the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Truly that is a holy union for us. The second reading for today's Mass concludes with these powerful words: "Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as He is."

I offer Psalm 23 for your prayerful reflection.

The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit.

He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name.

If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil would I fear.

You are there with your crook and your staff; with these you give me comfort.

> You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes. My head you have anointed with oil; my cup is overflowing.

Surely goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life. In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, Shepherd of your Church, you give us new birth in the waters of Baptism; you anoint us with oil, and call us to salvation at your table. Dispel the terrors of death and the darkness of error. Lead your people along safe paths, that they may rest securely in you and live for ever in your Father's house.

Acts 4:8-12 | 1 Jn 3:1-2 | Jn 10:11-18

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Several years ago I went to a shopping mall with my six-yearold son, and I could tell he was overwhelmed by the fast-moving crowds; he stuck close to my side. Not long into our trip. he turned a corner and, suddenly, his face lit up. He pointed at a young boy ahead. "That's James! I know him! He's in my class!" he exclaimed, and ran up to talk to him. Out of the sea of strangers was someone he knew, and who knew him. That changed the whole experience for him. Today's readings are all about that kind of knowing. In the Gospel Jesus tells us that, like a good shepherd, he knows his flock and they know him. How comforting it is to know that Jesus not only knows each one of us, but he willingly chose to lay down his life for each one of us as the ultimate sacrifice of love. But how do we get to know our Good Shepherd better? By immersing ourselves in Scripture and prayer and seeking a personal relationship with him. If we stay close to the Lord, we'll know his voice when we hear it - in the quiet of our prayer, in the everyday promptings of the Spirit in our decision-making, and even, in the midst of all the noise, as the calming and guiding voice leading us along the right path.

GO EVANGELIZE PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Being known is one of the most fundamental human and spiritual needs. When my son recognized his friend, he also instinctively recognized – without being able to articulate it – this need, in the midst of the anonymity of the mall. And his reaction was so pure: "I know him, and he knows me!" But he didn't leave it at that; he went to engage with his friend. He *encountered* his friend. This is what Christ desires for, and with us – not just to know us, to simply recognize us from afar, but for us to want to encounter him! We are meant to be in community; Jesus is always here for us: in the Church, in the sacraments, in Scriptures and in our hearts.

PRAY Spending time in prayer and reading the Scriptures are essential in order to get to know the voice of Jesus. Read the Gospels this week, even a chapter a day, and contemplate what passages stand out for you. Pray about it at Mass. The Scriptures and the sacraments are how Jesus speaks to us, like a good shepherd speaks to his flock so the sheep will know his voice and follow it.

When he had worldly thoughts, although he felt good while thinking them, he noticed that afterward the feelings left him empty. He continued reading spiritual books, growing in wisdom. God was leading him, fulfilling His Plan for him to be a great saint & to teach us. God's plan for us is the same, the process is slow.

As women who love Jesus, we need & want to learn to recognize Jesus' voice & grow closer to Him. At times we feel inadequate, wondering is this Jesus speaking, me or the enemy? In our group we begin to see we're all equal, with the problems, emotions, weaknesses. same confusion, strengths, desires, fears, doing the best we can, we don't have to be perfect. Jesus consoles us through our love for each other.
