FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK **Getting It**

Dear Parish Family:

As we listen to the Scripture of the early days of Easter, we can see a common struggle for the early disciples. For many of them, they don't get it. Whether it be the first visitors to the tomb who think Jesus' body was stolen, Thomas in today's Gospel, or those on the road to Emmaus and others, they just don't get it at the start.









We use this phrase a lot. Parents and children often to speak to each other (or over one another) and say the other just doesn't "get it". "They're not understanding it." "They're not making any

sense." Last Sunday marked the end of our Holy Week celebrations at St. John's. One of the things it showed clearly is that many of us "get it"! There was a certain excitement and energy, a determination and commitment in celebrating the most important week of the liturgical year, the most

Want to know who "gets it"? How about our neophytes -those women and men (and baby) baptized at the Easter Vigil? They spoke with great pride and enthusiasm as they celebrated full initiation in the Roman Catholic Church.

How about those who worked with the RCIA and RCIC - especially Suzan Fitzpatrick and Michelle Pirraglia? They helped our Elect "get it" and inspired them on their journey of faith.



Are you struck by our Paschal Candle which burns brightly in the Sanctuary? This was donated by members of the Bereavement Group who wanted to remember their loved ones. This symbol of light in the midst of darkness burns brightly for all of Easter and for our baptisms and funerals. They get it! Even in the midst of death, new life shines!

How about our amazing liturgical (ushers, servers, sacristans, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and readers) and music ministers? I cannot tell you the number of practices, rehearsals, meetings and the like were required for all of the liturgies. Their passion was a clear sign they get it!

How about our Family Life Ministry? They prepared special liturgies for our parish's children so they could "get it". What a commitment!

How about those who worked so quietly behind the scenes? Whether it be our Art and Environment Ministry that worked so hard to

make our Church come to life for each of the days or our Service Corps who worked pretty hard before and after Easter or our Knights of Columbus who worked so hard to clean the Church before the Easter Vigil or the Scouts who prepared our Vigil fire or those who took pictures or set up sound systems or moved chairs and so on and so on. Their commitment to

serve is a sign they get it!

How about each of you who prayed with us during this most solemn days? So many came to give praise and honor to God, to offer their time and gifts to the Church and to renew their baptismal promises and professed that yes, as we prayed in our Easter sequence, "Christ the Lord is Risen Today"!

It took the disciples some time to "get it", to fully understand the power of the Paschal Mystery. Maybe the same for me and you at times? May the remaining days of Easter help us to continue to "get it" and bring "what we got" to each and every moment of our lives.



Prison Families Anonymous welcomes anyone who now has, or ever had, a loved one involved in the juvenile or criminal justice system. At meetings, we share our experience, strength and hope. Here we offer information and assistance in navigating the criminal justice system. We encourage members to exchange phone numbers and when possible to carpool to upstate prisons.

Prison Families Anonymous (PFA)

Life becomes more difficult and stressful for family and friends when a loved one becomes incarcerated. Relationships and responsibilities can become strained and the dynamics within the family often change dramatically. The PFA Support Group provides a safe, non-judgmental place where those in similar situations can connect with each other. It provides compassion, support and information to family members during their very difficult times.
