The Stations of the Light is a spiritual journey with Christ that takes one through fourteen of the most inspiriting events of His post-



Resurrection life on earth. In the early Church this practice was known as the Via Lucis, or Way of the Resurrection. It invites participants to walk along a path of transforming joy by following in the footsteps of the Risen Christ and his friends. Although known and cherished since the first century, the Stations of the Light were never gathered into a precise devotion until recent years.

The Via Lucis was first blessed on Easter Sunday, 1994, in Turin, Italy, the birthplace of St. John Bosco, founder of the Society of St. Francis de Sales (Salesians). It formally became a Roman Catholic devotion, however, at the end of the twentieth century when the Vatican was preparing the Jubilee Year and searching for new devotions appropriate to the millennial transition and yet faithful to Christian tradition.

All God's Children

LOST SHEPHERDS...AND SHEEP, TOO

Dear Parish Family:

It is Good Shepherd Sunday. It is one of the days—though it cannot be the only day—when we focus on life and ministry in the church as an ordained priest. Lord knows we need priests! Please pray for us and please continue to invite others to consider this great life.

There's no doubt that it is not the easiest life. Some days can be tough days. Yet, I cannot think of a time—even in the midst of some of the darkest—that I did not discern the hand of God somewhere in it all.

And there's no doubt that it can be hard both to live this vocation and in trying to encouraging others to consider it. There have been poor shepherds and evil ones who have done more of their share of damage and carried out or allowed evil to happen. The actions of a few cause great damage on so many levels. And so we pray for those who seek to shepherd to have will in the midst of their humanity and weakness and, yes, even for those who have inflicted grave damage.

My prayer and reflection has been driven to some other shepherds in these days. I have been thinking a lot about police officers, particularly this past week. What an incredible job with massive responsibilities, particularly in these days and times. Good shepherds indeed who are called to look after flocks, those they have chosen and those they have not chosen. It is an overwhelming work for sure!

Yet, this is also a vocation where the actions of a few can cause great damage. The actions of a few can cause us to change our perception and understanding of the police or any authority for that matter. The actions of a few cause damage on so many levels. And so we pray for those who literally lay down their lives for the safety of others and, yes, even for those whose actions may cause damage and even death to others.

It is a little less than a year since the death of George Floyd in Minnesota and all it brought about for a nation in lockdown and a segment of our country that feels, frankly, their lives don't matter. There are numerous political, social, and system issues that are being debated. That is not our focus here. Our focus must be one that leads us to a deeper internal reflection centered on the Gospel that, with God's help, aids us in bringing about a world that respects, values, and makes sure all life—from beginning to end—matters.

Where must that internal reflection lead us? Hopefully, it does not lead us to a place where we retreat to our corners of politics, ideologies, biases, and blindnesses. This brings about no transformation.

The hope for people of faith is that deep reflection moves us to a place closer to Christ and to the call of the Gospel. We still have a lot to learn in the life of the Church about the need for the protection and safety of children and the formation and maturation of those who serve in the Church as well as the need for accountability. Yes, we have some work to do make sure those who protect us in any way are well screened, trained, supported, and responsible. And so we pray.

Further, we must look in our own hearts. This look, if we do it authentically, can be scary. We may find some of those emotions that are dirty, destructive, and dark. We may see those efforts at self-preservation, particularly by making sure others are pushed down so we can stand taller. We need to look into our hearts and ask ourselves if we really believe that all lives matter and are important—from the priest to the police office to the prisoner to the person of color. When that look within reveals something that is not Christ like (like violence or racism or failure) then we must seek healing and reconciliation. And so we pray.

This past week, the Catholic bishops of Minnesota wrote, "We hold up once again the image of the Crucified Christ, whose resurrection gives witness to the healing power of forgiveness, compassion, reconciliation, and peace. It is our shared brotherhood with Jesus that calls us to a deeper respect for all human life." The second reading proclaims to us that "we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." If we continue to avoid some of the deep gospel based reflections, and avoid our shared brotherhood with Jesus, we may never see him as he is. And so we pray.

The priest will call the children up to the altar after the opening prayer and our volunteers will walk them over to the auditorium. THE THREE DAYS—The journey continues!

This week, we share the Good Friday Morning Prayer reflection offered by Eve O'Brien. Eve is a coordinator of the Ministry of Consolation and serves as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion at SJE.

On Wednesday we had the funeral of a dear friend, a woman who filled many roles at St John's. People have told me it was a beautiful funeral. But I disagree. Funerals are sad. The suffering and sorrow in the church was palpable. The congregation was in tears when Father John spoke of her.

Members of the Ministry of Consolation witness many funerals. Our Ministry assists bereaved families plan the funerals for a lost loved one. We see their sorrow and anguish at their loss.

Consider-

The suffering of the **parents** who just lost an **adult child** tragically, **senselessly**, often after years of heartache and struggle;

Consider-

The sorrow of the **woman** completely lost by the death of her husband, her rock after many **decades of married life**, the man who was always there to love and support her.

Consider-

The sorrow of the parents who lost their young child after years of suffering with a terminal illness, praying for a cure;

Consider-

The sorrow of the adult children who lost their **elderly mother**, the woman who taught them their prayers, **wiped** their tears, **bandaged** their injuries, helped with **homework**, planned their **weddings**;

Consider-

The sorrow of the man whose **wife** has **succumbed to dementia** after years of caring for her; Consider-

The inconsolable family at the **shock** of a **sudden accidental death**.

And Consider-

The suffering of **health care workers** who were unable to cure and rescue suffering patients.

Today we contemplate the **suffering and sorrow** of our Blessed Mother. She watched her son being **brutally murdered**. AND unlike us, she did **NOT know about the Resurrection**, the knowledge that mitigates our suffering.

Good Friday is a day of great sorrow for Christians. It is the day of Christ's "funeral". It is the day we lost our best friend, the only friend who ever died for us.

Today I should be sorrowful and repent of my sins, It was my sins that caused Christ to be:

- -Abandoned by his friends in his hour of need;
- -Brutally tortured for hours, and
- -Ignominiously hung on a cross to suffer until death.

All to secure my personal, particular resurrection.

And yours too.



- 2. God is always present, hovering like a mother hen. Why does God not just jump right in and save us from all the messes we get into?
- 3. Jesus said, "I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep." Jesus is applying the unconditional love between himself and his Father to the relation between himself and his own. What does this tell you about how well you are known and how much you are loved? And: for whom would you lay down your life?


